

AMENDMENTS TO LB 320

Introduced by Appropriations

1 1. Strike the original sections and insert the following
2 new sections:

3 Section 1. DEFINITION OF APPROPRIATION PERIOD.

4 For purposes of this act and any other legislative bill
5 passed by the One Hundredth Legislature, First or Second Session,
6 which appropriates funds, FY2006-07 means the period July 1, 2006,
7 through June 30, 2007, FY2007-08 means the period July 1, 2007,
8 through June 30, 2008, FY2008-09 means the period July 1, 2008,
9 through June 30, 2009, FY2009-10 means the period July 1, 2009,
10 through June 30, 2010, and FY2010-11 means the period July 1, 2010,
11 through June 30, 2011.

12 Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION LANGUAGE.

13 There are hereby appropriated, for FY2007-08 and
14 FY2008-09, the sums set forth in this act to each agency for
15 each program from the respective funds for capital construction
16 projects, land acquisition, lease-purchase arrangements, and major
17 equipment acquisition, except as otherwise appropriated.

18 Sec. 3. REAPPROPRIATION OF BALANCE, FY2007-08 to
19 FY2008-09.

20 In addition to the appropriations set forth in this
21 act, there are hereby reappropriated all unexpended appropriation
22 balances existing on June 30, 2008, for FY2008-09 to the respective
23 agencies, programs, and funds listed in this act, except as

1 otherwise provided in this act.

2 Sec. 4. NEBRASKA ACCOUNTING SYSTEM MANUAL DEFINITIONS.

3 The definitions contained in the Nebraska Accounting
4 System Manual, and any amendments thereto, on file with the Clerk
5 of the Legislature are hereby adopted by the Legislature as the
6 definitions for this act.

7 Sec. 5. DRAWING AND PAYING WARRANTS.

8 The Director of Administrative Services shall draw
9 warrants upon the proper fund in the state treasury for an amount
10 not to exceed the appropriations set forth in this act upon
11 presentation of proper documentation. The State Treasurer shall pay
12 the warrants out of the appropriate funds.

13 Sec. 6. It is the intent of the Legislature that
14 the appropriations for capital facilities follow an orderly and
15 reasonable process based upon defined and documented need and an
16 analysis of the utilization of existing facilities.

17 The biennial appropriations contained in this act
18 covering FY2007-08 and FY2008-09, which have been designated for
19 planning, require from the agency a complete program statement
20 prepared in accordance with the Procedural Manual for Capital
21 Construction as approved by the state building division of
22 the Department of Administrative Services. Projects directly
23 related to program continuation such as fire and life safety,
24 maintenance, utility improvements, handicapped access, and master
25 planning require a statement of needs prepared in accordance with
26 the manual. An appropriation for drawings and construction may
27 be recommended only after submission of an acceptable program

1 statement or statement of needs on or before September 15 to the
2 state building division, the budget division of the Department of
3 Administrative Services, and the Legislative Fiscal Analyst.

4 Program statements that have been submitted prior to
5 FY2007-08 shall be updated if necessary and resubmitted during
6 the period July 1, 2007, to September 1, 2007. Program statements
7 that have been submitted prior to FY2008-09 shall be updated
8 if necessary and resubmitted during the period July 1, 2008, to
9 September 1, 2008, by agency priority. Such priority shall be
10 subject to final modification by the governing authority of each
11 agency on or before September 15, 2008.

12 Sec. 7. It is the intent of the Legislature that agencies
13 should construct or renovate facilities in such a manner as
14 to provide the greatest cost-effective energy savings possible.
15 Design criteria emphasizing efficiency, functionality, and energy
16 conservation shall be reflected in program statements, schematic
17 design documents, design development documents, and construction
18 documents. The state building division of the Department of
19 Administrative Services and the State Energy Office shall provide
20 technical assistance to the state agencies, upon request, to assist
21 them in providing for energy-efficient new or renovated facilities.

22 Sec. 8. LEGISLATIVE APPROVAL FOR HIGHER EDUCATION
23 FACILITIES EXPENDITURES.

24 Pursuant to the provisions of section 85-408 and a
25 recommendation for approval by the Coordinating Commission for
26 Postsecondary Education, the Legislature hereby approves the
27 request by the University of Nebraska for the expenditure of

1 \$2,241,300 from bond surplus funds for window replacement for
2 the Abel-Sandoz Residence Hall Complex at the University of
3 Nebraska—Lincoln campus.

4 Sec. 9. LEGISLATIVE APPROVAL FOR HIGHER EDUCATION
5 FACILITIES EXPENDITURES.

6 Pursuant to the provisions of section 85-404 and a
7 recommendation for approval by the Coordinating Commission for
8 Postsecondary Education, the Legislature hereby approves the
9 request by the University of Nebraska for a \$32,000,000 revenue
10 bond issuance to finance a three hundred eighty-four-bed student
11 housing complex and a nine hundred-stall parking structure on the
12 University of Nebraska at Omaha Dodge Campus.

2 directive made in Laws 2006, LB 996, section 1 and LB 996A, section
3 1, which authorizes the Department of Veterans Affairs to carry out
4 the provisions of Legislative Bill 996, Ninety-ninth Legislature,
5 Second Session, 2006. The total cost of this project from the State
6 Building Fund shall not exceed \$75,000.

7 There is included in this appropriation to this program
8 for FY2007-08 an estimated \$4,400,000 from federal funds to
9 complete this project.

22 The Nebraska Emergency Management Agency and the
23 Department of Correctional Services are hereby authorized to
24 participate through an interlocal agreement with the city of
25 Lincoln, Nebraska, and the Lower Platte South Natural Resources
26 District in making drainage improvements to Beal Slough for the
27 purpose of flood-proofing the Nebraska State Penitentiary's Central
28 Utility Plant and removing the Nebraska State Penitentiary complex

1 from the one-hundred-year flood plain. The total project cost paid
2 by the state shall not exceed \$835,000 from the Nebraska Capital
3 Construction Fund or \$6,165,000 from federal hazard mitigation
4 funds.

5 There is included in the appropriation to this program
6 for FY2007-08 \$225,000 from the Nebraska Capital Construction

17 Natural Resources District to provide quarterly reimbursement of
18 eligible costs actually paid on the project by the city of
19 Lincoln and the Lower Platte South Natural Resources District

21 quarter by the city of Lincoln and the Lower Platte South Natural

6 of the project to complete the remainder of the Beal Slough flood
7 improvement work which shall only be expended by the Nebraska

24 on or after October 1, 2008, for eligible costs actually paid on

27 as certified in writing each quarter by the city of Lincoln

1 and the Lower Platte South Natural Resources District, to the
2 Adjutant General as director of the Nebraska Emergency Management

28 the directive made by Laws 1999, LB 878, section 30, which

1 authorizes the Nebraska Educational Telecommunications Commission
2 (NETC) to digitize the NETC transmission signal and to replace
3 satellite transponder capacity. This project should be completed
4 in FY2009-10.

5 (1) The commission shall not pledge the credit of the
6 State of Nebraska for the payment of any sum owing on account
7 of such contract or contracts in subsections (1) and (2) of this
8 section, except that there may be pledged for payment of any such
9 contract or contracts any appropriations made by the Legislature
10 for such purpose. No contract or contracts shall be entered into
11 pursuant to subsections (1) and (2) of this section without prior
12 approval by resolution of the commission. The principal amount
13 of the contract or contracts financing the digitization equipment
14 project estimated to be retired by appropriations made to this
15 program is \$23,500,000 and may include an estimated \$2,000,000
16 of digital upgrades or repairs to translators and an estimated
17 \$2,200,000 of heating, ventilating, and air conditioning upgrades,
18 and repairs associated with the installation of digital equipment
19 upgrades at the Terry M. Carpenter Educational Telecommunications
20 Building in Lincoln. The digitization equipment project may include
21 the cost for collocation of transmission towers. The Legislature
22 acknowledges that the total amount of the digitization production
23 equipment project has not been provided for and encourages the
24 commission to aggressively pursue alternative sources of funding
25 for the remainder of the digitization production equipment project.
26 The amount of the digitization equipment project not funded through
27 this program is estimated at \$12,936,905. The principal amount

1 of the contract or contracts financing the satellite transponder
2 capacity replacement project is estimated at \$18,944,000.

3 (2) On or before August 31, 2010, any funds appropriated
4 from the State Building Fund and the Nebraska Capital Construction
5 Fund for the digitization equipment project and the satellite
6 transponder capacity replacement project held in the state treasury
7 and held by the trustee which are not necessary to meet the terms
8 of any long-term financing agreements entered into pursuant to this
9 section shall be transferred to the General Fund.

11 directive made by section 77-2602, which is to place amounts from
12 the special privilege tax on cigarettes in the Building Renewal
13 Allocation Fund for FY1997-98 and continuing each fiscal year until
14 all the purposes of the Deferred Building Renewal Act have been
15 fulfilled.

16 The appropriation to this program is for the purpose of
17 carrying out the provisions of the Deferred Building Renewal Act
