## **Summary of purpose and/or changes:**

Legislative Bill 101 would amend section 79-1601 by allowing only one parent or guardian to be responsible for a student in a school which elects not to meet state accreditation or approval requirements. Currently both parents or guardians must sign the statement of election for a child to attend a school which elects not to meet state accreditation or approval requirements and both are responsible for assuring that the requirements of the section are met. The signature requirement for an immunization waiver for such students would also be changed in the same manner.
