Summary of purpose and/or change:

Overview

Legislative Bill 1089 would call for the restoration of all Class I and Class VI school districts reorganized pursuant to Laws 2005, LB 126.

Section by Section Summary

Section 1 would put into statute, language that would define the “voters’ intention” upon repealing Laws 2005, LB 126.

Section 2 would put into statute, that the legislature finds it has the plenary authority to create, reorganize, and dissolve school districts; the plenary authority to create, dissolve or amend the legal authority of the State Committee for the Reorganization of School Districts, and the authority to overrule the committee’s decisions and orders.

Section 3 would declare that all orders issued by the State Committee for the Reorganization of School district pursuant to LB 126 would be rescinded, revoked, and annulled. Section 3 would also declare that all such orders would be deemed to have never been issued.
