Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Legislative Bill 139 would amend § 79-1142 to allow the Department of Education to establish a hardship fund from money appropriated for special education. The purpose of the hardship fund would be to provide current year reimbursements for the special education and related services for school-age children who are not wards of the state and who reside in a residential setting located in Nebraska. The department would determine the pro rata amount to be reimbursed. Costs reimbursed from the fund would not be eligible for further reimbursement. The fund could

only be accessed once for each student. Unused money in the hardship fund would be distributed as regular special education reimbursements.

School districts would be required to demonstrate to the department that:

- 1. The school district could not reasonable have anticipated being responsible for the costs prior to September 20th;
- 2. The costs will have an extreme financial impact on the budget of the school district;
- 3. The financial impact is greater than either (A) 3 times the average per pupil cost for the state; or (B) 5% of the district's general fund expenditures; and
- 4. The eligibility criteria established by the department, which take into account the number and percentage of such students served by the district, have been met.
