Summary of purpose and/or changes: LB 339 was introduced on behalf of the Department of Administrative Services. The bill makes numerous changes to the process for filing claims under the State Tort Claims Act, the State Miscellaneous Claims Act, and the State Contract Claims Act.

Explanation of amendments, if any: The committee amendment rewrites the entire bill and makes the following changes. The amendment would place a two year statute of limitations on claims brought under the State Miscellaneous Claims Act. The statute of limitations would not apply to claims tolled under section 25-213, state agency write-offs, expired state warrants, and claims brought under the Petroleum Release Remedial Action Act.
