Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Legislative Bill 393 would amend the Nebraska Scholarship Act.

Section 85-1903 would be amended by increasing the maximum award from 25% to 50% of the tuition and mandatory fees for a full-time, resident, undergraduate student for the last completed award year at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. For award years prior to 2007-08, the maximum award was at the 50% level. For award years beginning with 2007-08, the current provisions reduce the maximum award to the 25% level.
