**Summary of purpose and/or changes:**

LB 466 permits a buyer of a motor vehicle from a private party to post In Transit stickers for 30 days.

The bill amends § 60-376 to permit an owner of a motor vehicle or trailer purchased from a private party to post a visible notice on the motor vehicle or trailer that indicates the date of purchase and the owner's name.

The notices are to be displayed on the front and rear windows, and shall allow the owner to operate the vehicle or tow the trailer for a period of thirty days before effecting proper registration.

Upon demand by proper authorities, the owner shall present a duly executed bill of sale, a duly assigned certificate of title, or other satisfactory evidence as proof of ownership.
