Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 613 would change the current employee and employer retirement contribution rates under the School Employees Retirement Act.

The current employee contribution rate is 7.83% of compensation and is scheduled to return to 7.25% on September 1, 2007. LB 613 would set the employee contribution rate at 7.3%.

Currently, the employer matches the employee contribution rate with a 101% matching rate. Employers are, therefore, currently contributing 7.908% of employee compensation. LB 613

would set the employer match at 108%. Under LB 613, therefore, employers would contribute 7.884% of employee compensation.

Background

The Legislature enacted LB 503 in 2005, which contained provisions to temporarily increase the employee and employer retirement contribution rates under the School Employees Retirement Act. The purpose for the increased contribution rate was because the State Actuary indicated that there was a need for an additional contribution of approximately \$15.4 million.
