## **Summary of purpose and/or changes:**

LB 645 would have created an occupation tax exemption for bed and breakfast establishments under the Nebraska Liquor Control Act.

## **Details**

**Section 1** amends §53-132, relating to issuing liquor licenses, by adding new language exempting bed and breakfast establishments from an occupation tax that the city, village or county may impose. Further defines a bed and breakfast as:

- Any place of lodging that provides rented rooms to 10 or fewer people;
- That is the personal residence of the owner;
- That is occupied by the owner at the time of check-in; and
- The only meal served is breakfast.

Section 2 repeals the original section.
