## **Summary of purpose and/or changes:**

LB 667 authorizes a municipality to permit pedestrians on roadways to solicit contributions for charity.

The bill allows a municipality to adopt an ordinance that allows pedestrians over eighteen to enter a roadway (except for the state highway system), at specified locations and times, and

approach stopped vehicles to solicit contributions for a charitable or community betterment purpose.

The ordinance must be a general ordinance and may not exclude or give preference to any individual or group.

The bill has an emergency clause.
