Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Legislative Bill 700 proposed to adopt the Human Cloning Prohibition Act (Act). Under the Act, it is unlawful to knowingly perform human cloning, or to deliver or receive any embryo or fetus, produced by or from human cloning, for research purposes. Human cloning is defined in the act as human asexual reproduction accomplished by introducing nuclear material from one or more human somatic cells into a fertilized or unfertilized oocyte from which the nuclear material has been removed or inactivated so as to produce a living organism genetically identical to an existing or previously existing human being. A violation of the Act is classified as a Class IV felony. Nothing in the Act is to be construed as restricting areas of scientific research not specifically prohibited by the Act.
