Summary of purpose and/or change:

LB 708 would establish what would be called the Sales Tax Holiday Act. It would allow retailers to not collect sales tax from consumers from the first Friday in August through the following Sunday. Instead, the sales tax may be included in the sales price and the retailer may advertise that the sales tax will be absorbed by the retailer. The retailer may choose which items will be subject to the holiday and advertise as such. Finally, the retailer may advertise such sales as tax-free.

Section 4 would amend section 77-2703 to allow the absorption and non-itemization of the sales tax allowed in the Sales Tax Holiday Act. The bill carries the emergency clause.
