Summary of purpose and/or change:

LB 713 amends section 38-2037 relating to the practice of medicine and surgery and osteopathic medicine and surgery. The bill provides that a license to practice medicine and surgery or osteopathic medicine and surgery may be disciplined if an applicant or licensee administers or authorizes the administration of certain prescribed substances for the purpose of eliminating or reducing localized fat accumulation.

Disciplinary action will not apply to an applicant or licensee that administers or authorizes the administration of such substances with the approval of the federal Food and Drug Administration in accordance with an application filed pursuant to applicable federal law.

The bill has an operative date of December 1, 2008
