Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LR 11CA would allocate 3% of lottery proceeds, after payouts and other transfers, to the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice.

Details

Section 1 proposes an amendment to the Nebraska Constitution to be submitted to the state at the November, 2008, general election.

The proposal would amend Article III, section 24, which defines the allowable parameters of gambling in the state, by reducing the percentage amount that the Nebraska Environmental Trust receives from the State Lottery. The trust currently receives $44 \frac{1}{2} \%$ of net lottery proceeds after transfers. This resolution would take the amount down to $41 \frac{1}{2} \%$.

New language proposes that 3% of net lottery proceeds after transfers be transferred to fund the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice to be used for funding grants which, along with local matching funds, assists local law enforcement to enforce laws dealing with drug offenses, violent crime, and serious offenders.

Section 2 states the ballot language that is to be used for the proposed amendment.
