Section 1. Section 81-8,244 Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

81-8,244. The Public Counsel may select, appoint, 3 and 4 compensate as he or she sees fit, within the amount available by 5 appropriation, such assistants and employees as he or she deems 6 necessary to discharge the responsibilities under sections 81-8,240 to 7 81-8,254. He or she shall appoint and designate one assistant to be a 8 deputy public counsel, one assistant to be a deputy public counsel for corrections, one assistant to be a deputy public counsel for 9 10 institutions, and one assistant to be a deputy public counsel for 11 welfare services.

Such deputy public counsels shall be subject to the control and supervision of the Public Counsel.

14 The authority of the deputy public counsel for corrections 15 shall extend to all facilities and parts of facilities, offices, 16 houses of confinement, and institutions which are operated by the 17 Department of Correctional Services.

The authority of the deputy public counsel for institutions shall extend to all mental health and veterans institutions and facilities operated by the Department of Health and Human Services and to all complaints pertaining to administrative acts of the department when those acts are concerned with the rights and interests of individuals placed within those institutions and facilities.

The authority of the deputy public counsel for welfare services shall extend to all complaints pertaining to administrative acts of administrative agencies when those acts are concerned with the

rights and interests of individuals involved in the welfare services
system of the State of Nebraska.

The Public Counsel may delegate to members of the staff any authority or duty under sections 81-8,240 to 81-8,254 except the power of delegation and the duty of formally making recommendations to administrative agencies or reports to the Governor or the Legislature. Sec. 2. Original section 81-8,244, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is repealed.
