A BILL

1 FOR AN ACT relating to motor vehicle registration; to amend section
2 60-3,125, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006;
3 to permit the issuance of multiple Purple Heart license
4 plates owned by an applicant; and to repeal the original
5 section.
6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 60-3,125, Revised Statutes Cumulative
2 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

3 60-3,125 (1) Any resident of this state may, in addition
4 to the application required by section 60-385, make application
5 to the department for a set of license plates designed by the
6 department to indicate that the applicant for the license plates
7 has received from the federal government an award of a Purple
8 Heart. The inscription of the plates shall be designed so as
9 to include a facsimile of the award and beneath any numerical
10 designation upon the plates pursuant to section 60-370 the words
11 Purple Heart separately on one line and the words Combat Wounded on
12 the line below.

13 (2) The license plates shall be issued upon payment of
14 the regular license fee and an additional fee of five dollars and
15 furnishing proof satisfactory to the department that the applicant
16 was awarded the Purple Heart. The additional fee shall be remitted
17 to the State Treasurer for credit to the Highway Trust Fund. ~~Only~~
18 ~~one motor vehicle or trailer owned by the applicant shall be so~~
19 ~~licensed at any one time.~~ Any number of motor vehicles or trailers
20 owned by the applicant may be so licensed at any one time.

21 (3) If license plates issued pursuant to this section are
22 lost, stolen, or mutilated, the recipient of the plates shall be
23 issued replacement license plates upon request and without charge.
