- FOR AN ACT relating to the Tax Equity and Educational Opportunities

 Support Act; to amend section 79-1028, Revised Statutes

 Cumulative Supplement, 2006, as affected by Referendum

 2006, No. 422; to permit school districts to exceed the applicable allowable growth rate as prescribed; and to repeal the original section.
- Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 79-1028, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2006, as affected by Referendum 2006, No. 422, is
- 3 amended to read:
- 4 79-1028 (1) A Class II, III, IV, V, or VI school
- 5 district may exceed its applicable allowable growth rate for (a)
- 6 expenditures in support of a service which is the subject of
- 7 an agreement or a modification of an existing agreement whether
- 8 operated by one of the parties to the agreement or an independent
- 9 joint entity or joint public agency, (b) expenditures to pay for
- 10 repairs to infrastructure damaged by a natural disaster which is
- 11 declared a disaster emergency pursuant to the Emergency Management
- 12 Act, (c) expenditures to pay for judgments, except judgments
- 13 or orders from the Commission of Industrial Relations, obtained
- 14 against a school district which require or obligate a school
- 15 district to pay such judgment, to the extent such judgment is not
- 16 paid by liability insurance coverage of a school district, (d)
- 17 expenditures to pay for sums agreed to be paid by a school district
- 18 to certificated employees in exchange for a voluntary termination
- 19 of employment, or (e) expenditures to pay for lease-purchase
- 20 contracts approved on or after July 1, 1997, and before July
- 21 1, 1998, to the extent the lease payments were not budgeted
- 22 expenditures for fiscal year 1997-98.
- 23 (2) A Class II, III, IV, V, or VI district may exceed its
- 24 applicable allowable growth rate by a specific dollar amount if the
- 25 district projects an increase in formula students in the district

1 over the current school year greater than twenty-five students

- 2 or greater than those listed in the schedule provided in this
- 3 subsection, whichever is less. Districts shall project increases
- 4 in formula students on forms prescribed by the department. The
- 5 department shall approve, deny, or modify the projected increases.

13 The department shall compute the district's estimated 14 allowable budget per pupil using the budgeted general fund 15 expenditures found on the budget statement for the current school 16 year divided by the number of formula students in the current 17 school year and multiplied by the district's applicable allowable 18 growth rate. The resulting allowable budget per pupil shall be 19 multiplied by the projected formula students to arrive at the 20 estimated budget needs for the ensuing year. The department 21 shall allow the district to increase its general fund budget 22 of expenditures for the ensuing school year by the amount 23 necessary to fund the estimated budget needs of the district 24 as computed pursuant to this subsection. On or before July 25 1, the department shall make available to districts which have

1 been allowed additional growth pursuant to this subsection the

- 2 necessary document to recalculate the actual formula students of
- 3 such district. Such document shall be filed with the department
- 4 under subsection (1) of section 79-1024.
- 5 (3) A Class II, III, IV, V, or VI district may exceed
- 6 its applicable allowable growth rate by a specific dollar amount
- 7 if construction, expansion, or alteration of district buildings
- 8 will cause an increase in building operation and maintenance
- 9 costs of at least five percent. The department shall document
- 10 the projected increase in building operation and maintenance costs
- 11 and may allow a Class II, III, IV, V, or VI district to exceed
- 12 its applicable allowable growth rate by the amount necessary to
- 13 fund such increased costs. The department shall compute the actual
- 14 increased costs for the school year and shall notify the district
- 15 on or before July 1 of the recovery of the additional growth
- 16 pursuant to this subsection.
- 17 (4) A Class II, III, IV, V, or VI district may exceed its
- 18 applicable allowable growth rate by a specific dollar amount if the
- 19 district demonstrates to the satisfaction of the department that
- 20 it will exceed its applicable allowable growth rate as a result
- 21 of costs pursuant to the Retirement Incentive Plan authorized
- 22 in section 79-855 or the Staff Development Assistance authorized
- 23 in section 79-856. The department shall compute the amount by
- 24 which the increased cost of such program or programs exceeds the
- 25 district's applicable allowable growth rate and shall allow the

1 district to increase its general fund expenditures by such amount

2 for that fiscal year.

- 3 (5) A Class II, III, IV, or V district may exceed its
- 4 applicable allowable growth rate by the specific dollar amount of
- 5 incentive payments or base fiscal year incentive payments to be
- 6 received in such school fiscal year pursuant to section 79-1011.
- 7 (6) A Class II, III, IV, V, or VI district may exceed 8 its applicable allowable growth rate by a specific dollar amount 9 in any year for which the state aid calculation for the local 10 system includes students in the qualified early childhood education 11 fall membership of the district for the first time or for a year 12 in which an early childhood education program of the district is 13 receiving an expansion grant. The department shall compute the 14 amount by which the district may exceed the district's applicable 15 allowable growth rate by multiplying the cost grouping cost
- 18 programs if students are included in the district's qualified
- 19 early childhood education fall membership for the first time or by

per student for the applicable cost grouping by the district's

adjusted formula students attributed to early childhood education

- 20 the district's adjusted formula students attributed to such early
- 21 childhood education programs minus the district's adjusted formula
- 22 students attributed to such early childhood education programs for
- 23 the prior school fiscal year if a program is receiving an expansion
- 24 grant in the school fiscal year for which the fall membership is
- 25 measured. The department shall allow the district to increase its

1 general fund expenditures by such amount for such school fiscal

- 2 year.
- 3 (7) For school fiscal year 2005-06, a Class II, III, IV,
- 4 V, or VI district may exceed its applicable allowable growth rate
- 5 by a specific dollar amount not to exceed seventy-four hundredths
- 6 percent of the amount budgeted for employee salaries for such
- 7 school fiscal year. For school fiscal year 2006-07, a Class II,
- 8 III, IV, V, or VI district may exceed its applicable allowable
- 9 growth rate by a specific dollar amount not to exceed fifty-nine
- 10 hundredths percent of the amount budgeted for employee salaries for
- 11 such school fiscal year.
- 12 (8) A Class II, III, IV, or V district that is a
- 13 member of a learning community may exceed its applicable allowable
- 14 growth rate for the first school fiscal year in which the school
- 15 district will be a member of a learning community for the full
- 16 school fiscal year by an amount equal to anticipated increases in
- 17 transportation expenditures necessary to meet the requirements of
- 18 subsection (2) of section 79-611 as approved by the department. The
- 19 department shall approve, deny, or modify the amount allowed
- 20 for anticipated increases in transportation expenditures. The
- 21 department shall compute the actual increase in transportation
- 22 expenditures necessary to meet the requirements of subsection (2)
- 23 of section 79-611 for such school fiscal year and shall, if needed,
- 24 modify the district's applicable allowable growth rate for the
- 25 ensuing school fiscal year.

(9) For school fiscal year 2008-09, a Class II, III, 1 2 IV, or V district may exceed its applicable allowable growth 3 rate by a specific dollar amount if the sum of the poverty allowance, elementary class size allowance, focus school and 4 program allowance, and limited English proficiency allowance for 5 6 the school district for school fiscal year 2008-09 exceeds the 7 poverty weightings plus limited English proficiency weightings 8 multiplied by the cost grouping cost per student for the school 9 district for school fiscal year 2007-08. The department shall 10 compute the amount by which the district may exceed the applicable 11 allowable growth rate by subtracting the product of the sum of 12 the poverty weightings and limited English proficiency weightings 13 for school fiscal year 2007-08 multiplied by the average formula 14 cost per student in the school district's cost grouping for school 15 fiscal year 2007-08 from the sum of the school fiscal year 2008-09 16 poverty allowance, elementary class size allowance, focus school and program allowance, and limited English proficiency allowance 17 18 for the school district. The department shall allow the district to 19 increase its general fund expenditures by such amount for school 20 fiscal year 2008-09. 21 (10) For school fiscal year 2009-10 and each school fiscal year thereafter, a Class II, III, IV, or V district may 22 23 exceed its applicable allowable growth rate by a specific dollar amount if the sum of the poverty allowance, elementary class size 24 25 allowance, focus school and program allowance, and limited English

1 proficiency allowance for the school district has grown at a rate

- 2 higher than the applicable allowable growth rate of the district.
- 3 The department shall compute the amount by which the district
- 4 may exceed the applicable allowable growth rate by subtracting
- 5 the product of the sum of the poverty allowance, elementary class
- 6 size allowance, focus school and program allowance, and limited
- 7 English proficiency allowance for the immediately preceding school
- 8 fiscal year multiplied by the sum of one plus the applicable
- 9 allowable growth rate to be exceeded from the sum of the poverty
- 10 allowance, elementary class size allowance, focus school and
- 11 program allowance, and limited English proficiency allowance for
- 12 the district for the school fiscal year for which the applicable
- 13 allowable growth rate would be exceeded. The department shall allow
- 14 the district to increase its general fund expenditures by such
- 15 amount for the applicable school fiscal year.
- 16 (11) A Class II, III, IV, or V school district may
- 17 exceed its applicable allowable growth rate by a specific dollar
- 18 amount not to exceed the amount received during such school fiscal
- 19 year from educational entities as defined in section 79-1332 for
- 20 providing distance education courses through the Distance Education
- 21 Council to such educational entities.
- 22 (12) A Class II, III, IV, or V school district may exceed
- 23 its applicable allowable growth rate for school fiscal year 2007-08
- 24 by a specific dollar amount equal to the amount paid in school
- 25 fiscal year 2006-07 to any distance education consortium in which

1 the school district was participating pursuant to an interlocal

- 2 agreement.
- 3 (13) A Class II, III, IV, V, or VI district may exceed
- 4 its applicable allowable growth rate for any year in which the
- 5 increase in its energy costs over the preceding year exceeds the
- 6 percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban
- 7 Consumers published by the Federal Bureau of Labor Statistics.
- 8 The department shall document the increases based on information
- 9 supplied by the district and may allow the district to exceed its
- 10 applicable allowable growth rate by the amount necessary to fund
- 11 such costs.
- 12 For purposes of this subsection, energy costs includes
- 13 costs to purchase gasoline, oil, diesel fuel, electricity, propane,
- 14 heating oil, natural gas, and any other similar substances
- 15 necessary for district transportation vehicles and for heating
- 16 and cooling district facilities.
- 17 (14) A Class II, III, IV, V, or VI district may exceed
- 18 its applicable allowable growth rate for any year in which the
- 19 increase in its health insurance costs over the preceding year
- 20 exceed the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index for
- 21 All Urban Consumers published by the Federal Bureau of Labor
- 22 Statistics. The department shall compute the actual increased costs
- 23 for the school year and shall allow the district to increase its
- 24 general fund expenditures by such amount for that fiscal year.
