A BILL

1 FOR AN ACT relating to charitable gaming; to amend sections
2 9-239, 9-266, 9-356, and 9-424, Reissue Revised Statutes
3 of Nebraska, and sections 9-1,101, 9-232.01, 9-232.02,
4 9-233, 9-241.03, 9-255.06, 9-328, 9-329, 9-329.02, 9-425,
5 and 77-366, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006;
6 to change and eliminate provisions relating to bingo,
7 lotteries, and raffles; to provide for enforcement
8 relating to possession of gambling devices; to harmonize
9 provisions; to repeal the original sections; and to
10 outright repeal sections 9-236 and 9-322.03, Reissue
11 Revised Statutes of Nebraska.

12 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 9-1,101, Revised Statutes Cumulative
2 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

3 9-1,101 (1) The Nebraska Bingo Act, the Nebraska County
4 and City Lottery Act, the Nebraska Lottery and Raffle Act, the
5 Nebraska Pickle Card Lottery Act, the Nebraska Small Lottery
6 and Raffle Act, and section 9-701 shall be administered and
7 enforced by the Charitable Gaming Division of the Department
8 of Revenue, which division is hereby created. The Department of
9 Revenue shall make annual reports to the Governor, Legislature,
10 Auditor of Public Accounts, and Attorney General on all tax revenue
11 received, expenses incurred, and other activities relating to the
12 administration and enforcement of such acts.

13 (2) The Charitable Gaming Operations Fund is hereby
14 created. Any money in the fund available for investment shall be
15 invested by the state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska
16 Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.

17 (3) (a) Forty percent of the taxes collected pursuant to
18 sections 9-239, 9-344, 9-429, and 9-648 shall be available to the
19 Charitable Gaming Division for administering and enforcing the acts
20 listed in subsection (1) of this section and section 81-8,128. The
21 remaining sixty percent shall be transferred to the General Fund.
22 Any portion of the forty percent not used by the division in the
23 administration and enforcement of such acts and section shall be
24 distributed as provided in this subsection.

25 (b) On or before November 1 each year, the State

1 Treasurer shall transfer fifty thousand dollars from the Charitable
2 Gaming Operations Fund to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund,
3 except that no transfer shall occur if the Charitable Gaming
4 Operations Fund contains less than fifty thousand dollars.

5 (c) Any money remaining in the Charitable Gaming
6 Operations Fund after the transfer pursuant to subdivision (b)
7 of this subsection not used by the Charitable Gaming Division in
8 its administration and enforcement duties pursuant to this section
9 may be transferred to the General Fund at the direction of the
10 Legislature.

11 (4) The Tax Commissioner shall employ investigators who
12 shall be vested with the authority and power of a law enforcement
13 officer to carry out the laws of this state administered by the Tax
14 Commissioner or the Department of Revenue and to enforce sections
15 28-1101 to 28-1117 relating to possession of a gambling device.

16 (5) The Charitable Gaming Division may charge a fee for
17 publications and listings it produces. The fee shall not exceed the
18 cost of publication and distribution of such items. The division
19 may also charge a fee for making a copy of any record in its
20 possession equal to the actual cost per page. The division shall
21 remit the fees to the State Treasurer for credit to the Charitable
22 Gaming Operations Fund.

23 ~~(6) The State Treasurer shall transfer two hundred~~
24 ~~ninety-two thousand dollars from the Charitable Gaming Operations~~
25 ~~Fund to the General Fund on or before November 1, 2002.~~

1 Sec. 2. Section 9-232.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative
2 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

3 9-232.01 (1) Each organization applying for a license to
4 conduct bingo shall file with the department an application on a
5 form prescribed by the department. Each application shall include:

6 (a) The name and address of the applicant organization;

7 (b) Sufficient facts relating to the incorporation or
8 organization of the applicant organization to enable the department
9 to determine if the organization is eligible for a license pursuant
10 to section 9-231;

11 (c) The name and address of each officer of the applicant
12 organization;

13 (d) The name, address, social security number, years of
14 membership, and date of birth of one bona fide and active member
15 of the organization who will serve as the organization's bingo
16 chairperson; and

17 (e) The name, address, social security number, years of
18 membership, and date of birth of no more than three bona fide
19 and active members of the organization who will serve as alternate
20 bingo chairpersons.

21 (2) In addition, each applicant organization shall
22 include with the application:

23 (a) The name, address, social security number, date
24 of birth, and years of membership of an active and bona fide
25 member of the applicant organization to be licensed as the

1 utilization-of-funds member. Such person shall have been an active
2 and bona fide member of the applicant organization for at least
3 one year preceding the date the application is filed with the
4 department unless the applicant organization can provide evidence
5 that the one-year requirement would impose an undue hardship on the
6 organization. All utilization-of-funds members shall sign a sworn
7 statement indicating that they agree to comply with all provisions
8 of the Nebraska Bingo Act and all rules and regulations adopted
9 pursuant to the act, that they will insure that no commission, fee,
10 rent, salary, profits, compensation, or recompense will be paid
11 to any person or organization, except payments authorized by the
12 act, and that all profits will be spent only for lawful purposes.
13 A fee of ~~twenty~~ forty dollars shall be charged for a license for
14 each utilization-of-funds member, and the department may prescribe
15 a separate application form for such license;

16 (b) For a Class II license only, the name, address,
17 social security number, and date of birth of the individual to be
18 licensed as the gaming manager. Such person shall ~~be required to~~
19 sign a sworn statement indicating that he or she agrees to comply
20 with all provisions of the Nebraska Bingo Act, the Nebraska Lottery
21 and Raffle Act, the Nebraska Pickle Card Lottery Act, the Nebraska
22 Small Lottery and Raffle Act, and all rules and regulations adopted
23 pursuant to such acts. A fee of ~~fifty~~ one hundred dollars shall be
24 charged for a license for each gaming manager, and the department
25 may prescribe a separate application form for such license;

1 (c) The name and address of the owner or lessor of the
2 premises in which bingo will be conducted; and

3 (d) Any other information which the department deems
4 necessary, including, but not limited to, copies of any and all
5 lease or rental agreements and contracts entered into by the
6 organization relative to its bingo activities.

7 (3) The information required by this section shall be
8 kept current. A licensed organization shall notify the department
9 within thirty days if any information in the application is no
10 longer correct and shall supply the correct information.

11 (4) Except for a limited period bingo, a licensed
12 organization shall not conduct any bingo game or occasion at
13 any time, on any day, at any location, or in any manner different
14 from that described in its most recent filing with the department
15 unless prior approval has been obtained from the department. A
16 request for approval to change the day, time, or location of a
17 bingo occasion shall be made by the bingo chairperson, in writing,
18 at least thirty days in advance of the date the proposed change is
19 to become effective.

20 (5) No bingo chairperson, alternate bingo chairperson,
21 utilization-of-funds member, or gaming manager for an organization
22 shall be connected with, interested in, or otherwise concerned
23 directly or indirectly with any party licensed as a manufacturer,
24 distributor, or commercial lessor pursuant to the Nebraska Bingo
25 Act or with any party licensed as a manufacturer or distributor

1 pursuant to the Nebraska Pickle Card Lottery Act.

2 (6) No person shall act as a gaming manager until he or
3 she has received a license from the department. A gaming manager
4 may apply for a license to act as a gaming manager for more than
5 one licensed organization by completing a separate application and
6 paying the ~~fifty-dollar~~ license fee for each organization for which
7 he or she intends to act as a gaming manager. No gaming manager
8 shall be a bingo chairperson or alternate bingo chairperson, and no
9 gaming manager shall hold any other type of license issued under
10 the Nebraska Bingo Act, the Nebraska Lottery and Raffle Act, ~~and or~~
11 the Nebraska Pickle Card Lottery Act.

12 (7) No person shall act as a utilization-of-funds member
13 until he or she has received a license from the department.
14 A utilization-of-funds member shall not hold any other type of
15 license issued under the Nebraska Bingo Act, the Nebraska Lottery
16 and Raffle Act, and the Nebraska Pickle Card Lottery Act, except
17 that a utilization-of-funds member may also be designated as the
18 bingo chairperson or alternate bingo chairperson for the same
19 organization.

22 9-232.02 (1) ~~Except as otherwise provided in this~~
23 ~~section,~~ all All licenses to conduct bingo and licenses issued
24 to utilization-of-funds members, gaming managers, or commercial
25 lessors shall expire ~~on September 30 of each year or such other~~

1 date as the department may prescribe by rule and regulation and
2 may be renewed annually. as provided in this section and may be
3 renewed biennially. An application for license renewal shall be
4 submitted at least forty-five days prior to the expiration date of
5 the license. The department may prescribe a separate application
6 form for renewal purposes for any license application required
7 by the Nebraska Bingo Act. The renewal application may require
8 such information as the department deems necessary for the proper
9 administration of the act.

16 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

17 9-233 (1) The department may issue an applicant
18 organization one of the following classes of bingo licenses:

19 (a) A Class I license which shall include organizations
20 with gross receipts from the conduct of bingo which are less than
21 one hundred thousand dollars per twelve-month period commencing
22 October 1 of each year or such other date as the department may
23 prescribe by rule and regulation; or

24 (b) A Class II license which shall include organizations
25 with gross receipts from the conduct of bingo equal to or

1 greater than one hundred thousand dollars per twelve-month period
2 commencing October 1 of each year or such other date as the
3 department may prescribe by rule and regulation.

4 (2) For purposes of this section, when bingo occasions
5 are conducted on a joint basis by two or more licensed
6 organizations, the class of license required shall be determined
7 based upon the combined gross receipts of all licensed
8 organizations involved in the conduct of the bingo occasion.

11 charged for a Class I license, and a biennial fee of fifty one

10 Sec. 5. Section 9-239, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 11 Nebraska, is amended to read:

12 9-239 (1) The department shall collect a state tax of
 13 three percent on the gross receipts received from the conducting
 14 of bingo within the state. The tax shall be remitted to the
 15 department. The department shall remit the tax to the State
 16 Treasurer for credit to the Charitable Gaming Operations Fund. The
 17 tax shall be remitted quarterly, not later than thirty days after
 18 the close of the preceding quarter, together with any other reports
 19 as may be required by the department.

20 ~~(2) Until January 1, 1999, any city or village is hereby~~
 21 ~~directed to impose a tax of one percent on the gross receipts~~
 22 ~~received from the conducting of bingo within such city or village.~~
 23 ~~Until January 1, 1999, where bingo is conducted on an excursion~~
 24 ~~or dinner train or outside the limits of any incorporated city~~
 25 ~~or village, the county in which such bingo is conducted shall~~

1 impose a tax of one percent on the gross receipts from the

15 Bingo Act, no occupation tax on any receipts derived from the
16 conduct of bingo shall be levied, assessed, or collected from any
17 licensee under the act by any county, township, district, city,
18 village, or other governmental subdivision or body having power to
19 levy, assess, or collect such tax.

20 Sec. 6. Section 9-241.03, Revised Statutes Cumulative
21 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

22 9-241.03 (1) Irrespective of the number of organizations
23 authorized to hold bingo occasions within a premises:

24 (a) No more than two bingo occasions per calendar week
25 shall be held within a premises except as otherwise provided in

1 subsection (3) of this section; and

2 (b) No more than four limited period bingos with an
3 aggregate of no more than twelve days per twelve-month period
4 commencing October 1 of each year or such other date as the
5 department may prescribe by rule and regulation and no more than
6 two special event bingos with an aggregate of no more than fourteen
7 days per calendar year shall be held within a premises.

8 (2) Bingo occasions held as part of a limited period
9 bingo or special event bingo, or a bingo occasion that was canceled
10 due to an act of God and rescheduled pursuant to section 9-241.02,
11 shall not be counted in determining whether the use of a premises
12 is in compliance with subdivision (1)(a) of this section.

13 (3) Notwithstanding the restriction contained in
14 subdivision (1)(a) of this section, the department may authorize
15 more than two bingo occasions per calendar week to be held
16 within a premises if a licensed organization or commercial lessor
17 can demonstrate in writing to the department that utilizing
18 the premises for the conduct of bingo more than two times per
19 calendar week will result in a cost savings for each of the
20 licensed organizations who would be utilizing the premises. If the
21 department authorizes a premises to be used more than two times
22 per calendar week, the department shall not permit more than one
23 bingo occasion per calendar day to be held in a premises except
24 when one of the occasions is a limited period bingo or a special
25 event bingo.

1 Sec. 7. Section 9-255.06, Revised Statutes Cumulative
2 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

3 9-255.06 (1) An individual, partnership, limited
4 liability company, corporation, or organization which will be
5 leasing a premises to one or more organizations for the conduct of
6 bingo and which will receive more than two hundred fifty dollars
7 per month as aggregate total rent from leasing such premises for
8 the conduct of bingo shall first obtain a commercial lessor's
9 license from the department. The license shall be applied for on a
10 form prescribed by the department and shall contain:

11 (a) The name and home address of the applicant;

12 (b) If the applicant is an individual, the applicant's
13 social security number;

14 (c) If the applicant is not a resident of this state or
15 is not a corporation, the full name, business address, and home
16 address of a natural person, at least nineteen years of age, who is
17 a resident of and living in this state designated by the applicant
18 as a resident agent for the purpose of receipt and acceptance
19 of service of process and other communications on behalf of the
20 applicant;

21 (d) A designated mailing address and legal description of
22 the premises intended to be covered by the license sought;

23 (e) The lawful capacity of the premises for public
24 assembly purposes;

25 (f) The amount of rent to be paid or other consideration

1 to be given directly or indirectly for each bingo occasion to be
2 conducted; and

3 (g) Any other information which the department deems
4 necessary.

5 ~~(2)(a) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection,~~
6 ~~an~~ (2) An application for a commercial lessor's license shall be
7 accompanied by a biennial fee of ~~one~~ two hundred dollars for each
8 premises the applicant is seeking to lease pursuant to subsection
9 (1) of this section. A commercial lessor who desires to lease more
10 than one premises for the conduct of bingo shall file a separate
11 application and pay a separate fee for each such premises.

12 ~~(b) Commencing October 1, 2001, the biennial license fee~~
13 ~~for a commercial lessor shall be two hundred dollars for each~~
14 ~~premises the applicant is seeking to lease pursuant to subsection~~
15 ~~(1) of this section.~~

16 (3) The information required by this section shall be
17 kept current. The commercial lessor shall notify the department
18 within thirty days of any changes to the information contained on
19 or with the application.

20 (4) A commercial lessor who will be leasing or renting
21 bingo equipment in conjunction with his or her premises shall
22 obtain such equipment only from a licensed distributor, except
23 that a commercial lessor shall not purchase or otherwise obtain
24 disposable paper bingo cards from any source.

25 (5) A commercial lessor, the owner of a premises, and

1 all parties who lease or sublease a premises which ultimately is
2 leased to an organization for the conduct of bingo shall not be
3 involved directly with the conduct of any bingo occasion regulated
4 by the Nebraska Bingo Act which may include, but not be limited to,
5 the managing, operating, promoting, advertising, or administering
6 of bingo. Such persons shall not derive any financial gain from
7 any gaming activities regulated by Chapter 9 except as provided
8 in subsection (4) of section 9-347 if the individual is licensed
9 as a pickle card operator, if the individual is licensed as a
10 lottery operator or authorized sales outlet location pursuant to
11 the Nebraska County and City Lottery Act, or if the individual is
12 contracted with as a lottery game retailer pursuant to the State
13 Lottery Act.

14 (6) A nonprofit organization owning its own premises
15 which in turn rents or leases its premises solely to its own
16 auxiliary shall be exempt from the licensing requirements contained
17 in this section.

18 Sec. 8. Section 9-266, Reissue Revised Statutes of
19 Nebraska, is amended to read:

20 9-266 (1) Except in accordance with a proper judicial
21 order or as otherwise provided by this section or other law, it
22 shall be a Class I misdemeanor for the Tax Commissioner or any
23 employee or agent of the Tax Commissioner to make known, in any
24 manner whatsoever, the contents of any reports or records submitted
25 by a licensed distributor or manufacturer or the contents of any

1 personal history reports submitted by any licensee or license
2 applicant to the department pursuant to the Nebraska Bingo Act and
3 any rules and regulations adopted and promulgated pursuant to such
4 act.

5 (2) Nothing in this section shall be construed to
6 prohibit (a) the delivery to a licensee, his or her duly authorized
7 representative, or his or her successors, receivers, trustees,
8 personal representatives, administrators, assignees, or guarantors,
9 if directly interested, a certified copy of any report or record,
10 (b) the publication of statistics so classified as to prevent
11 the identification of particular reports or records, (c) the
12 inspection by the Attorney General, a county attorney, or other
13 legal representative of the state of reports or records submitted
14 by a licensed distributor or manufacturer when information on
15 the reports or records is considered by the Attorney General,
16 county attorney, or other legal representative to be relevant to
17 any action or proceeding instituted by the licensee or against
18 whom an action or proceeding is being considered or has been
19 commenced by any state agency or county, (d) the furnishing of any
20 information to the United States Government or to states allowing
21 similar privileges to the Tax Commissioner, (e) the disclosure of
22 information and records to a collection agency contracting with
23 the Tax Commissioner for the collection of delinquent taxes under
24 the Nebraska Bingo Act, (f) the publication or disclosure of final
25 administrative opinions and orders made by the Tax Commissioner

1 in the adjudication of license or permit denials, suspensions,
2 cancellations, or revocations, (g) the release of any application,
3 without the contents of any submitted personal history report
4 or social security number, filed with the department to obtain
5 a license or permit to conduct activities under the act, which
6 shall be deemed a public record, (h) the release of any report
7 filed pursuant to section 9-255.05 or any other report filed by
8 a licensee pursuant to the act, which shall be deemed a public
9 record, or (i) the notification of an applicant, a licensee, or
10 a licensee's duly authorized representative of the existence of
11 and the grounds for an administrative action to deny the license
12 application of, to revoke, cancel, or suspend the license of,
13 or to levy an administrative fine upon any agent or employee of
14 the applicant, the licensee, or any other person upon whom the
15 applicant or licensee relies to conduct activities authorized by

17 (3) Nothing in this section shall prohibit the Tax
18 Commissioner or any employee or agent of the Tax Commissioner
19 from making known the names of persons, firms, or corporations
20 licensed or issued a permit to conduct activities under the act,
21 the locations at which such activities are conducted by licensees
22 or permittees, or the dates on which such licenses or permits were
23 issued.

24 (4) Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section, the
25 Tax Commissioner may permit the Postal Inspector of the United

1 States Postal Service or his or her delegates to inspect reports
2 or records submitted by a licensed distributor or manufacturer
3 pursuant to the act when information on the reports or records is
4 relevant to any action or proceeding instituted or being considered
5 by the United States Postal Service against such person for
6 the fraudulent use of the mails to carry and deliver false and
7 fraudulent tax returns to the Tax Commissioner with the intent to
8 defraud the State of Nebraska or to evade the payment of Nebraska
9 state taxes.

10 (5) Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section, the
11 Tax Commissioner may permit other tax officials of this state to
12 inspect reports or records submitted pursuant to the act, but such
13 inspection shall be permitted only for purposes of enforcing a tax
14 law and only to the extent and under the conditions prescribed by
15 the rules and regulations of the Tax Commissioner.

19 ~~subsection, all~~ (1) All licenses to conduct a lottery by the sale
