Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006; to increase

the salaries of Supreme Court judges as prescribed;

to provide an operative date; to repeal the original

section; and to declare an emergency.

1 Section 1. Section 24-201.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 3 24-201.01 On July 1, 2002, the salary of the Chief
- 4 Justice and judges of the Supreme Court shall be one hundred
- 5 nineteen thousand two hundred seventy-six dollars. On July 1, 2005,
- 6 the salary of the Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court
- 7 shall be one hundred twenty-two thousand eight hundred fifty-four
- 8 dollars. On July 1, 2006, the salary of the Chief Justice and
- 9 the judges of the Supreme Court shall be one hundred twenty-six
- 10 thousand eight hundred forty-six dollars. On July 1, 2007, the
- 11 salary of the Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court
- 12 shall be one hundred thirty-three thousand five hundred five
- 13 dollars and forty-one cents. On July 1, 2008, the salary of the
- 14 Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall be one
- 15 hundred forty thousand five hundred fourteen dollars and one cent.
- 16 The Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court
- 17 shall hold no other public office of profit or trust during their
- 18 terms of office nor accept any public appointment or employment
- 19 under the authority of the government of the United States for
- 20 which they receive compensation for their services. Such salaries
- 21 shall be payable in equal monthly installments.
- 22 Sec. 2. This act becomes operative on July 1, 2007.
- 23 Sec. 3. Original section 24-201.01, Revised Statutes
- 24 Cumulative Supplement, 2006, is repealed.
- 25 Sec. 4. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
