## A BILL

- 1 FOR AN ACT relating to relating to state administrative
  2 departments; to amend section 81-1316, Revised Statutes
  3 Supplement, 2007; to change provisions relating to
  4 personnel exempt from the State Personnel System; and to
  5 repeal the original section.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 81-1316, Revised Statutes Supplement,

- 2 2007, is amended to read:
- 3 81-1316 (1) All agencies and personnel of state
- 4 government shall be covered by sections 81-1301 to 81-1319 and
- 5 shall be considered subject to the State Personnel System, except
- 6 the following:
- 7 (a) All personnel of the office of the Governor;
- 8 (b) All personnel of the office of the Lieutenant
- 9 Governor;
- 10 (c) All personnel of the office of the Secretary of
- 11 State:
- 12 (d) All personnel of the office of the State Treasurer;
- (e) All personnel of the office of the Attorney General;
- 14 (f) All personnel of the office of the Auditor of Public
- 15 Accounts;
- 16 (g) All personnel of the Legislature;
- 17 (h) All personnel of the court systems;
- 18 (i) All personnel of the Board of Educational Lands and
- 19 Funds;
- 20 (j) All personnel of the Public Service Commission;
- 21 (k) All personnel of the Nebraska Brand Committee;
- 22 (1) All personnel of the Commission of Industrial
- 23 Relations;
- 24 (m) All personnel of the State Department of Education;
- 25 (n) All personnel of the Nebraska state colleges and the

- 1 Board of Trustees of the Nebraska State Colleges;
- 2 (o) All personnel of the University of Nebraska;
- 3 (p) All personnel of the Coordinating Commission for
- 4 Postsecondary Education;
- 5 (q) All personnel of the Governor's Policy Research
- 6 Office, but not to include personnel within the State Energy
- 7 Office;
- 8 (r) All personnel of the Commission on Public Advocacy;
- 9 (s) All agency heads;
- 10 (t)(i) The Director of Behavioral Health of the Division
- 11 of Behavioral Health; (ii) the Director of Children and Family
- 12 Services of the Division of Children and Family Services; (iii)
- 13 the Director of Developmental Disabilities of the Division of
- 14 Developmental Disabilities; (iv) the Director of Medicaid and
- 15 Long-Term Care of the Division of Medicaid and Long-Term Care; (v)
- 16 the Director of Public Health of the Division of Public Health; and
- 17 (vi) the Director of Veterans' Homes of the Division of Veterans'
- 18 Homes;
- 19 (u) The chief medical officer established under section
- 20 81-3115, the Administrator of the Office of Juvenile Services, and
- 21 the chief executive officers of the Beatrice State Developmental
- 22 Center, Lincoln Regional Center, Norfolk Regional Center, Hastings
- 23 Regional Center, Grand Island Veterans' Home, Norfolk Veterans'
- 24 Home, Eastern Nebraska Veterans' Home, Western Nebraska Veterans'
- 25 Home, Youth Rehabilitation and Treatment Center-Kearney, and Youth

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- 2 (v) The chief executive officers of all facilities
- 3 operated by the Department of Correctional Services and the medical
- 4 director for the department appointed pursuant to section 83-4,156;
- 5 (w) All personnel employed as pharmacists, physicians,
- 6 psychiatrists, or psychologists by the Department of Correctional
- 7 Services;
- 8 (v) (x) All personnel employed as pharmacists,
- 9 physicians, psychiatrists, psychologists, service area
- 10 administrators, or facility operating officers of the Department of
- 11 Health and Human Services; and
- 12 (w) (y) Deputies and examiners of the Department of
- 13 Banking and Finance and the Department of Insurance as set forth in
- 14 sections 8-105 and 44-119, except for those deputies and examiners
- 15 who remain in the State Personnel System.
- 16 (2) At each agency head's discretion, up to the following
- 17 number of additional positions may be exempted from the State
- 18 Personnel System, based on the following agency size categories:

- 6 The purpose of having such noncovered positions shall
- 7 be to allow agency heads the opportunity to recruit, hire,
- 8 and supervise critical, confidential, or policymaking personnel
- 9 without restrictions from selection procedures, compensation rules,
- 10 career protections, and grievance privileges. Persons holding the
- 11 noncovered positions shall serve at the pleasure of the agency head
- 12 and shall be paid salaries set by the agency head.
- 13 (3) No changes to this section or to the number of
- 14 noncovered positions within an agency shall affect the status
- 15 of personnel employed on the date the changes become operative
- 16 without their prior written agreement. A state employee's career
- 17 protections or coverage by personnel rules and regulations shall
- 18 not be revoked by redesignation of the employee's position as a
- 19 noncovered position without the prior written agreement of such
- 20 employee.
