- FOR AN ACT relating to unemployment compensation; to amend section

 48-624, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2007; to change

 the weekly benefit amount; and to repeal the original

 section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 48-624, Revised Statutes Supplement,

- 2 2007, is amended to read:
- 3 48-624 (1) For any benefit year beginning on or after
- 4 January 1, 2001, through December 31, 2005, an individual's weekly
- 5 benefit amount shall be one-half his or her average weekly wage
- 6 rounded down to the nearest even whole dollar amount, but shall
- 7 not exceed one-half of the state average weekly wage as annually
- 8 determined under section 48-121.02.
- 9 (2) For any benefit year beginning on or after January
- 10 1, 2006, through December 31, 2007, an individual's weekly benefit
- 11 amount shall be one-half of his or her average weekly wage rounded
- 12 down to the nearest even whole dollar amount, but shall not exceed
- 13 two hundred eighty-eight dollars per week.
- 14 (3) For any benefit year beginning on or after January
- 15 1, 2008, through December 31, 2010, 2008, an individual's weekly
- 16 benefit amount shall be one-half of his or her average weekly wage
- 17 rounded down to the nearest even whole dollar amount, but shall not
- 18 exceed the lesser of one-half of the state average weekly wage as
- 19 annually determined under section 48-121.02 or the previous year's
- 20 maximum weekly benefit amount plus ten dollars per week.
- 21 (4) For any benefit year beginning on or after January
- 22 1, 2009, through December 31, 2009, an individual's weekly benefit
- 23 amount shall be fifty-five percent of his or her average weekly
- 24 wage rounded down to the nearest even whole dollar amount, but
- 25 shall not exceed sixty percent of the state average weekly wage as

- 1 annually determined under section 48-121.02.
- 2 (5) For any benefit year beginning on or after January
- 3 1, 2010, through December 31, 2010, an individual's weekly benefit
- 4 amount shall be sixty percent of his or her average weekly wage
- 5 rounded down to the nearest even whole dollar amount, but shall not
- 6 exceed seventy percent of the state average weekly wage as annually
- 7 determined under section 48-121.02.
- 8 (6) For any benefit year beginning on or after January
- 9 1, 2011, through December 31, 2011, an individual's weekly benefit
- 10 amount shall be sixty-five percent of his or her average weekly
- 11 wage rounded down to the nearest even whole dollar amount, but
- 12 shall not exceed eighty percent of the state average weekly wage as
- annually determined under section 48-121.02.
- 14 (7) For any benefit year beginning on or after January
- 15 1, 2012, through December 31, 2012, an individual's weekly benefit
- 16 amount shall be seventy percent of his or her average weekly wage
- 17 rounded down to the nearest even whole dollar amount, but shall not
- 18 exceed ninety percent of the state average weekly wage as annually
- 19 determined under section 48-121.02.
- 20 (4) (8) For any benefit year beginning on or after
- 21 January 1, 2011, 2013, an individual's weekly benefit amount shall
- 22 be one-half seventy-five percent of his or her average weekly wage
- 23 rounded down to the nearest even whole dollar amount, but shall
- 24 not exceed one-half of the state average weekly wage as annually
- 25 determined under section 48-121.02.

1 (5) (9) For purposes of this section, an individual's

- 2 average weekly wage shall equal the wages paid for insured work in
- 3 the highest quarter of the base period divided by thirteen.
