

Hundredth Legislature - First Session - 2007 Introducer's Statement of Intent LB 481

The following constitutes the reasons for this bill and the purposes which are sought to be accomplished thereby:

The purpose of LB 481 is to provide a ninety day grace period for applicants for temporary education permits to comply with the criminal background check provisions of the licensure act.

This ninety day grace period will allow sufficient time for medical residents coming from outside of the state to comply with the background check requirements. The process for application requires the application and finger prints be submitted to the Nebraska State Patrol. This process can delay the resident from assuming their duties as a resident.

The applicant shall have his or her permit suspended after the ninety day period if the background check is not complete or revoked if the background check shows the applicant was not qualified.
