**Introducer's Statement of Intent**  
**LB 720**

The following constitutes the reasons for this bill and the purposes which are sought to be accomplished thereby:

LB 720 limits the time of day that any prerecorded telecommunication message may be made to a household, requires that the identity of the person on whose behalf the message is being transmitted be stated at the beginning of the message, and requires the person using the device and the person on whose behalf the device is being used to include his or her contact information within the message.

LB 720 also states that the person contracting with a third party to operate an automatic dialing-announcing device for solicitations shall be jointly and severally liable with the third party for violations under the Automatic Dialing-Announcing Device (ADAD) Act. The person contracting with the third party shall file a script to be used to comply with NRS 86-247 with the Public Service Commission.

Furthermore, a person contracting with a third party to operate an automatic dialing-announcing device for purposes other than solicitations shall be jointly and severally liable with said third party for violating the ADAD Act. The person contracting with the third party shall file a script to be used to comply with NRS 86-247 with the Public Service Commission.
