Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 1000 amends sections 53-125 and 53-103 of the Liquor Control Act. LB 1000 requires that any officer or director of the LLC or any member with an ownership interest of more than 25% would have to meet the qualifications for a liquor license, which is the current requirement for corporations.

LB 1000 also requires that a manager for an LLC would need to be a citizen and a resident of Nebraska. This is consistent with LB 788 (2010), which would also require that a manager for a corporation be a citizen and resident of Nebraska. It is the current interpretation of the Liquor Control Commission that managers be citizens and residents of Nebraska.
