## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 105 was introduced at the request of the Game and Parks Commission.

The bill does the following: (1) establishes or revises penalties and minimum fines for violation of various Game and Parks statutes [sections 1, 3, 6, 7, 13, 16, 18, 19, 20, 31, 41, 42, 44, 45, 46, 47, and 49]; (2) revises fee structures for permits [sections 5, 8, 10, 14 to 28, 30, 31, 33 to 40, and 50 to 53]; (3) clarifies that fishing using a bow and arrow from a vessel and aided by artificial light for an unprotected species is not prohibited; (4) adds identification requirements for motorboat leasing and renting; (5) exempts zoos accredited by the Association of Zoos and Aquariums or Zoological Association from obtaining certain captive animal permits; (6) requires twenty-five percent of the fees received for lifetime game permits to be invested and not spent by the commission; (7) allows the commission to use the Nebraska Habitat Fund for access and enhancement improvements; (8) clarifies how permits are to be issued to family members and nonresident property owners; (9) requires written permission to administer certain drugs to wildlife under the commission's jurisdiction; and (10) revises damages payable to the state for illegally selling, purchasing, taking or possessing wildlife.

## **Explanation of amendments:**

The Committee amendment amends section 21, subsection (5), by reinstating the word "leases" and revising the new language to ensure a combination of land is owned and leased by a Nebraska resident to qualify for a limited permit to hunt elk.
