Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 108 would exempt a dealer applying for a certificate of title for an all-terrain vehicle (ATV) from an identification inspection.

The bill amends Sec.60-146 to add an exemption for ATVs to the identification inspection requirement. If the applicant is a licensed dealer, he or she may present an affidavit from the seller that the vehicle is not stolen, the seller has the authority to sell the vehicle, and the name and address of the seller.

In addition, the dealer must provide a statement from a county sheriff that the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) has been checked for entry into certain crime databases and there is no reason to suspect the vehicle has been stolen. The sheriff may respond by email, fax or other electronic means.
