## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 127 had two aspects. First, the bill would have exempted certain books from sales tax. Books exempted would have been any book ever recommended for reading for a course at an institution of higher education.

Second, the bill would have created an annual sales tax holiday for certain items. The exempted items would have been clothing with a value of less than \$100 per item, school supplies with a per item price of less than \$100, and computers selling for less than \$1,500.
