## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 200 repeals the motorcycle helmet requirement for riders at least twenty-one years old.

The bill requires eye protection for a motorcycle rider, which shall be glasses, a protective face shield, goggles, or a windshield on the motorcycle.

A person who is at least 21 years of age is exempt from the helmet requirement. In addition, a 15-21 year old is exempt if he or she completes a motorcycle safety course and carries proof of completion.

The bill makes enforcement of this section a secondary action.  A person exempt from the helmet requirement shall have "helmet not required" printed on the face of his or her license.
