## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Beginning January 1, 2010 each member of a pension board, council or committee that supervises a retirement plan for a metropolitan, primary, first, and second class city, and village would be required to obtain at least 3 hours of ethics training every 4 years, and at least 6 hours each year of educational training in the management of public employee retirement pension systems, actuarial analysis, or employee benefits. Members would be reimbursed for their expenses.

## **Explanation of amendments:**

The committee amendment makes several changes to the bill:

- 1. Limits the training and education requirements to metropolitan and primary class cities;
- 2. Changes annual 6 hour training requirement on retirement issues to every even-numbered year; and
- 3. Requires three-fifths majority vote of the board for reimbursement of expenses.
