Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Legislative Bill 226 would amend various statute sections to lower the age of majority from nineteen to eighteen.

Explanation of amendments:

Committee Amendment 1590 would replace the bill. Under AM1590, an eighteen year old minor may consent to his or her own medical treatment if his or her parent or guardian delegates the power to consent to the minor with a properly executed power of attorney.

The amendment would allow minors who have reached the age of eighteen to enter into binding contracts or leases and provides that they are legally responsible for the contracts.
