Summary of purpose and/or changes:

This bill deals with handicapped parking proposing to increase the penalties for handicapped parking infractions.

It would be applicable to cities of all classes and villages, any place subject to a state statute, a municipal ordinance, or a federal regulation governing handicapped parking, and any parking place designated by the state as a handicapped parking place at a state facility.

This bill proposes to amend Section 18-1741.02 dealing with the penalties for handicapped parking infractions. It would increase the various penalties for such infractions, moving the penalty for an initial infraction from one hundred dollars to one hundred and fifty dollars, for a second infraction (within a one year period) from two hundred to three hundred dollars, and for a third (or subsequent infraction during the same one year period) from three hundred to five hundred dollars.

The current penalties have not been revised since 1993 (sixteen years ago).

Handicapped parking infractions extend beyond simply parking without a permit in a designated parking place to a range of other offenses relating to the use or misuse of such permits under a range of circumstances.
