## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 528 (Fulton) would amen sections 21-2014, 21-2015, and 21-2060 of the Business Corporation Act to allow a corporation to communicate written notice to a shareholder by electronic transmission and to allow a shareholder to appoint a proxy by electronic transmission.

## **Explanation of amendments:**

The committee would make the following changes in the bill:

- 1. The committee amendments would insert and amend section 21-2003 of the Business Corporation Act to provide that the bill would not authorize delivery "by electronic transmission" of documents to the Secretary of State for filing.
- 2. The committee amendments would insert and amend section 21-20,186 of the Business Corporation Act to provide that a corporation shall "deliver" instead of "mail" the annual statement to shareholders. This would permit delivery of the annual statement by electronic transmission. (See proposed definition of "deliver" in section 1 of the bill.)
- 3. The committee amendments would amend section 2 of the bill to delete provisions which would allow notice to be communicated by "voice mail."
