## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 780 extends workers' compensation coverage to first responders who suffer mental injuries without a corresponding physical injury.

Section 1: Creates a new section adding mental injuries unaccompanied by physical injury when suffered by a first responder to the definition of personal injury. To be covered by the Workers' Compensation Act, the first responder must show by a preponderance of the evidence that the mental injury was a result of extraordinary and unusual conditions as compared to the normal conditions of the employment. The first responder must additionally establish that the conditions caused the resulting mental injury. Clarifies that mental injuries suffered as a result of events which are incidental to employee/employer relations including specified personnel actions are not compensable. Defines first responder as a firefighter, law enforcement officer, crime scene investigator, or an out-of-hospital emergency care provider.

Section 2: amends section 48-151 to comport with section 1.

Section 3: amends section 48-1,110 to comport with section 1.

Section 4: clarifies that the additional coverage provided in section 1 only applies to injuries sustained after the effective date.

Section 5: repealer.

## **Explanation of amendments:**

The committee amendment redefines first responder as a sheriff, a deputy sheriff, a police officer, an officer of the Nebraska State Patrol, a volunteer or paid firefighter, or a volunteer or paid individual licensed under a licensure classification in subdivision (1) of section 38-1217 who provides immediate medical care in order to prevent loss of life or aggravation of physiological or psychological illness or injury.
