Kent Rogert Introducer Mark Collins Attorney General - Medicaid Fraud and Patient Abuse Unit Opponents: Representing: Neutral: Representing: Summary of purpose and/or changes: LB 809 amends 29-110 by adding a new subsection (6) to provide that a person being charged with a violation under 68-1017 (Medical Assistance/Social Services) must have illegally obtained or attempted to obtain state assistance valued at \$500 or more unless an indictment for such offense is found by a grand jury within five years after the offense has been done or unless a complaint for such offense is filed before the magistrate within five years after the offense has been committed and a warrant for the arrest of the defendant has been issued.
