Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LR 268CA creates the Highway Trust Fund in the Nebraska Constitution and reserves the three current main highway revenue sources for highway maintenance, preservation, and expansion.

The resolution adds a new Section 14 to Article VIII (Revenue) that creates the Highway Trust Fund. The revenue from fuel taxes, sales tax on motor vehicles, and motor vehicle registrations shall be placed in the Trust Fund if already authorized by law on January 1, 2011. The Legislature can also provide other sources of revenue for the Fund.

The Highway Trust Fund is to be used exclusively for:

1. maintenance, preservation, and expansion of highways, roads, and streets and related expenses (including bond payments);

2. administrative expenses for the collection of motor fuel taxes, motor vehicle sales taxes, or motor vehicle registration fees; and

3. any other use authorized by law as of January 1, 2011.

The Legislature can allocate the money in the Highway Trust Fund through statutory law.
