A BILL

1 FOR AN ACT relating to limited liability companies; to amend
2 sections 9-614, 67-248.02, 70-1903, 77-2704.57, 77-2716,
3 and 77-2734.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,
4 and sections 21-2601 and 21-2654, Revised Statutes
5 Supplement, 2009; to adopt the Nebraska Uniform Limited
6 Liability Company Act; to terminate the Limited Liability
7 Company Act; to provide applicability; to change
8 provisions relating to charging orders involving limited
9 liability companies; to harmonize provisions; to provide
10 an operative date; to provide severability; and to repeal
11 the original sections.

12 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. (ULLCA 101) Sections 1 to 97 of this act shall
2 be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability
3 Company Act.

4 Sec. 2. (ULLCA 102) In the Nebraska Uniform Limited
5 Liability Company Act:

6 (1) Certificate of organization means the certificate
7 required by section 17 of this act. The term includes the
8 certificate as amended or restated.

9 (2) Certificate of registration means either a document
10 prepared and issued by a regulatory body or the electronic
11 accessing of the regulatory body's licensing records by the
12 Secretary of State.

13 (3) Contribution means any benefit provided by a person
14 to a limited liability company:

15 (A) in order to become a member upon formation of the
16 company and in accordance with an agreement between or among the
17 persons that have agreed to become the initial members of the
18 company;

19 (B) in order to become a member after formation of the
20 company and in accordance with an agreement between the person and
21 the company; or

22 (C) in the person's capacity as a member and in
23 accordance with the operating agreement or an agreement between
24 the member and the company.

25 (4) Debtor in bankruptcy means a person that is the

1 subject of:

2 (A) an order for relief under Title 11 of the United
3 States Code or a successor statute of general application; or

4 (B) a comparable order under federal, state, or foreign
5 law governing insolvency.

6 (5) Designated office means:

7 (A) the office that a limited liability company is
8 required to designate and maintain under section 13 of this act; or

9 (B) the principal office of a foreign limited liability
10 company.

11 (6) Distribution, except as otherwise provided in
12 subsection (g) of section 34 of this act, means a transfer of
13 money or other property from a limited liability company to another
14 person on account of a transferable interest.

15 (7) Effective, with respect to a record required or
16 permitted to be delivered to the Secretary of State for filing
17 under the Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability Company Act, means
18 effective under subsection (c) of section 21 of this act.

19 (8) Foreign limited liability company means an
20 unincorporated entity formed under the law of a jurisdiction other
21 than this state and denominated by that law as a limited liability
22 company.

23 (9) Limited liability company, except in the phrase
24 foreign limited liability company, means an entity formed under the
25 Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability Company Act.

1 (10) Manager means a person that under the operating
2 agreement of a manager-managed limited liability company is
3 responsible, alone or in concert with others, for performing the
4 management functions stated in subsection (c) of section 36 of this
5 act.

6 (11) Manager-managed limited liability company means a
7 limited liability company that qualifies under subsection (a) of
8 section 36 of this act.

9 (12) Member means a person that has become a member of a
10 limited liability company under section 30 of this act and has not
11 dissociated under section 45 of this act.

12 (13) Member-managed limited liability company means a
13 limited liability company that is not a manager-managed limited
14 liability company.

15 (14) Operating agreement means the agreement, whether or
16 not referred to as an operating agreement and whether oral, in a
17 record, implied, or in any combination thereof, of all the members
18 of a limited liability company, including a sole member. The term
19 includes the agreement as amended or restated.

20 (15) Organizer means a person that acts under section 17
21 of this act to form a limited liability company.

22 (16) Person means an individual, corporation, business
23 trust, estate, trust, partnership, limited liability company,
24 association, joint venture, public corporation, government or
25 governmental subdivision, agency, or instrumentality, or any other

1 legal or commercial entity.

2 (17) Principal office means the principal executive
3 office of a limited liability company or foreign limited liability
4 company, whether or not the office is located in this state.

5 (18) Professional service means any type of personal
6 service to the public which requires as a condition precedent
7 to the rendering of such service the obtaining of a license
8 or other legal authorization and which includes, but is not
9 limited to, personal services rendered by a certified public
10 accountant, dentist, osteopathic physician, physician and surgeon,
11 veterinarian, real estate broker, associate real estate broker,
12 real estate salesperson, or attorney at law. For purposes of
13 the act, those professions pertaining to the diagnosis, care,
14 and treatment of humans shall be considered to be of the same
15 profession.

16 (19) Record means information that is inscribed on a
17 tangible medium or that is stored in an electronic or other medium
18 and is retrievable in perceivable form.

19 (20) Regulatory body means a board, commission, court,
20 or governmental authority which is charged with licensing or
21 regulating the rendering of a professional service in this state.

22 (21) Sign means, with the present intent to authenticate
23 or adopt a record:

24 (A) to execute or adopt a tangible symbol; or

25 (B) to attach to or logically associate with the record

1 an electronic symbol, sound, or process.

2 (22) State means a state of the United States, the
3 District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the United States Virgin
4 Islands, or any territory or insular possession subject to the
5 jurisdiction of the United States.

6 (23) Transfer includes an assignment, conveyance, deed,
7 bill of sale, lease, mortgage, trust deed, security interest,
8 encumbrance, gift, and transfer by operation of law.

9 (24) Transferable interest means the right, as originally
10 associated with a person's capacity as a member, to receive
11 distributions from a limited liability company in accordance with
12 the operating agreement, whether or not the person remains a member
13 or continues to own any part of the right.

14 (25) Transferee means a person to which all or part of
15 a transferable interest has been transferred, whether or not the
16 transferor is a member.

17 Sec. 3. (ULLCA 103) (a) A person knows a fact when the
18 person:

19 (1) has actual knowledge of it; or

20 (2) is deemed to know it under subdivision (d) (1) of this
21 section or law other than the Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability
22 Company Act.

23 (b) A person has notice of a fact when the person:

24 (1) has reason to know the fact from all of the facts
25 known to the person at the time in question; or

1 (2) is deemed to have notice of the fact under
2 subdivision (d)(2) of this section.

3 (c) A person notifies another of a fact by taking steps
4 reasonably required to inform the other person in ordinary course,
5 whether or not the other person knows the fact.

6 (d) A person that is not a member is deemed:

7 (1) to know of a limitation on authority to transfer real
8 property as provided in subsection (g) of section 27 of this act;

9 and

10 (2) to have notice of a limited liability company's:

11 (A) dissolution, ninety days after a statement of
12 dissolution under subdivision (b)(1)(B) of section 48 of this act
13 becomes effective;

14 (B) termination, ninety days after a statement of
15 termination under subdivision (b)(2)(E) of section 48 of this act
16 becomes effective; and

17 (C) merger, conversion, or domestication, ninety days
18 after articles of merger, conversion, or domestication under
19 sections 70 to 84 of this act become effective.

20 Sec. 4. (ULLCA 104) (a) A limited liability company is an
21 entity distinct from its members.

22 (b) A limited liability company may have any lawful
23 purpose.

24 (c) A limited liability company has perpetual duration.

25 (d) A limited liability company shall be classified for

1 state income tax purposes in the same manner as it is classified
2 for federal income tax purposes.

3 Sec. 5. (ULLCA 105) A limited liability company has the
4 capacity to sue and be sued in its own name and the power to
5 do all things necessary or convenient to carry on its activities,
6 including the power to render a professional service within or
7 without this state.

8 Sec. 6. (ULLCA 106) The law of this state governs:

9 (1) the internal affairs of a limited liability company;
10 and

11 (2) the liability of a member as member and a manager
12 as manager for the debts, obligations, or other liabilities of a
13 limited liability company.

14 Sec. 7. (ULLCA 107) Unless displaced by particular
15 provisions of the Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability Company Act,
16 the principles of law and equity supplement the act.

17 Sec. 8. (ULLCA 108) (a) The name of a limited liability
18 company must contain the words limited liability company or limited
19 company or the abbreviation L.L.C., LLC, L.C., or LC. Limited may
20 be abbreviated as Ltd., and company may be abbreviated as Co.

21 (b) Unless authorized by subsection (c) of this section,
22 the name of a limited liability company must not be the same as or
23 deceptively similar to, in the records of the Secretary of State:

24 (1) the name of each person that is not an individual and
25 that is incorporated, organized, or authorized to transact business

1 in this state; and

2 (2) each name reserved under section 9 of this act
3 or other state laws allowing the reservation or registration of
4 business names, including fictitious or assumed name statutes.

5 (c) A limited liability company may apply to the
6 Secretary of State for authorization to use a name that is
7 deceptively similar to, upon the records of the Secretary of State,
8 one or more of the names described in subsection (b) of this
9 section. The Secretary of State shall authorize use of the name
10 applied for if, as to each noncomplying name:

11 (1) the present user, registrant, or owner of the
12 noncomplying name consents in a signed record to the use; or

13 (2) the applicant delivers to the Secretary of State a
14 certified copy of the final judgment of a court establishing the
15 applicant's right to use in this state the name applied for.

16 (d) Subject to section 59 of this act, this section
17 applies to a foreign limited liability company transacting business
18 in this state which has a certificate of authority to transact
19 business in this state or which has applied for a certificate of
20 authority.

21 Sec. 9. (ULLCA 109) (a) A person may reserve the
22 exclusive use of the name of a limited liability company, including
23 a fictitious or assumed name for a foreign limited liability
24 company whose name is not available, by delivering an application
25 to the Secretary of State for filing. The application must state

1 the name and address of the applicant and the name proposed to be
2 reserved. If the Secretary of State finds that the name applied for
3 is available, it must be reserved for the applicant's exclusive use
4 for a one-hundred-twenty-day period.

5 (b) The owner of a name reserved for a limited liability
6 company may transfer the reservation to another person by
7 delivering to the Secretary of State for filing a signed notice of
8 the transfer which states the name and address of the transferee.

9 Sec. 10. (ULLCA 110) (a) To the extent the operating
10 agreement does not otherwise provide for a matter, the Nebraska
11 Uniform Limited Liability Company Act governs the matter.

12 (b) An operating agreement may not:

13 (1) vary a limited liability company's capacity under
14 section 5 of this act to sue and be sued in its own name;

15 (2) vary the law applicable under section 6 of this act;

16 (3) vary the power of the court under section 20 of this
17 act;

18 (4) subject to subsections (c) through (f) of this
19 section, eliminate the duty of loyalty or the duty of care;

20 (5) subject to subsections (c) through (f) of this
21 section, eliminate the contractual obligation of good faith and
22 fair dealing under subsection (d) of section 38 of this act;

23 (6) unreasonably restrict the duties and rights stated in
24 section 39 of this act;

25 (7) vary the power of a court to decree dissolution

1 in the circumstances specified in subdivisions (a) (4) and (5) of
2 section 47 of this act;

3 (8) vary the requirement to wind up a limited liability
4 company's business as specified in subsection (a) and subdivision
5 (b) (1) (A) of section 48 of this act;

6 (9) unreasonably restrict the right of a member to
7 maintain an action under sections 64 to 69 of this act;

8 (10) except as otherwise provided in section 83 of
9 this act, restrict the right to approve a merger, conversion, or
10 domestication of a member that will have personal liability with
11 respect to a surviving, converted, or domesticated organization; or

12 (11) except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of
13 section 12 of this act, restrict the rights under the act of a
14 person other than a member or manager.

15 (c) If not manifestly unreasonable, the operating
16 agreement may:

17 (1) restrict or eliminate the duty:

18 (A) as required in subdivision (b) (1) and subsection (g)
19 of section 38 of this act, to account to the limited liability
20 company and to hold as trustee for it any property, profit, or
21 benefit derived by the member in the conduct or winding up of
22 the company's business, from a use by the member of the company's
23 property, or from the appropriation of a limited liability company
24 opportunity;

25 (B) as required in subdivision (b) (2) and subsection (g)

1 of section 38 of this act, to refrain from dealing with the company
2 in the conduct or winding up of the company's business as or on
3 behalf of a party having an interest adverse to the company; and

4 (C) as required by subdivision (b)(3) and subsection
5 (g) of section 38 of this act, to refrain from competing with
6 the company in the conduct of the company's business before the
7 dissolution of the company;

8 (2) identify specific types or categories of activities
9 that do not violate the duty of loyalty;

10 (3) alter the duty of care, except to authorize
11 intentional misconduct or knowing violation of law;

12 (4) alter any other fiduciary duty, including eliminating
13 particular aspects of that duty; and

14 (5) prescribe the standards by which to measure the
15 performance of the contractual obligation of good faith and fair
16 dealing under subsection (d) of section 38 of this act.

17 (d) The operating agreement may specify the method by
18 which a specific act or transaction that would otherwise violate
19 the duty of loyalty may be authorized or ratified by one or more
20 disinterested and independent persons after full disclosure of all
21 material facts.

22 (e) To the extent the operating agreement of a
23 member-managed limited liability company expressly relieves a
24 member of a responsibility that the member would otherwise have
25 under the Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability Company Act and

1 imposes the responsibility on one or more other members, the
2 operating agreement may, to the benefit of the member that the
3 operating agreement relieves of the responsibility, also eliminate
4 or limit any fiduciary duty that would have pertained to the
5 responsibility.

6 (f) The operating agreement may alter or eliminate the
7 indemnification for a member or manager provided by subsection (a)
8 of section 37 of this act and may eliminate or limit a member's
9 or manager's liability to the limited liability company and members
10 for money damages, except for:

11 (1) breach of the duty of loyalty;

12 (2) a financial benefit received by the member or manager
13 to which the member or manager is not entitled;

14 (3) a breach of a duty under section 35 of this act;

15 (4) intentional infliction of harm on the company or a
16 member; or

17 (5) an intentional violation of criminal law.

18 (g) The court shall decide any claim under subsection (c)
19 of this section that a term of an operating agreement is manifestly
20 unreasonable. The court:

21 (1) shall make its determination as of the time the
22 challenged term became part of the operating agreement and by
23 considering only circumstances existing at that time; and

24 (2) may invalidate the term only if, in light of the
25 purposes and activities of the limited liability company, it is

1 readily apparent that:

2 (A) the objective of the term is unreasonable; or

3 (B) the term is an unreasonable means to achieve the
4 provision's objective.

5 Sec. 11. (ULLCA 111) (a) A limited liability company
6 is bound by and may enforce the operating agreement, whether or
7 not the company has itself manifested assent to the operating
8 agreement.

9 (b) A person that becomes a member of a limited liability
10 company is deemed to assent to the operating agreement.

11 (c) Two or more persons intending to become the initial
12 members of a limited liability company may make an agreement
13 providing that upon the formation of the company the agreement will
14 become the operating agreement. One person intending to become the
15 initial member of a limited liability company may assent to terms
16 providing that upon the formation of the company the terms will
17 become the operating agreement.

18 Sec. 12. (ULLCA 112) (a) An operating agreement may
19 specify that its amendment requires the approval of a person that
20 is not a party to the operating agreement or the satisfaction of
21 a condition. An amendment is ineffective if its adoption does not
22 include the required approval or satisfy the specified condition.

23 (b) The obligations of a limited liability company and
24 its members to a person in the person's capacity as a transferee
25 or dissociated member are governed by the operating agreement.

1 Subject only to any court order issued under subdivision (b) (2)
2 of section 42 of this act to effectuate a charging order, an
3 amendment to the operating agreement made after a person becomes
4 a transferee or dissociated member is effective with regard to
5 any debt, obligation, or other liability of the limited liability
6 company or its members to the person in the person's capacity as a
7 transferee or dissociated member.

8 (c) If a record that has been delivered by a limited
9 liability company to the Secretary of State for filing and has
10 become effective under the Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability
11 Company Act contains a provision that would be ineffective under
12 subsection (b) of section 10 of this act if contained in the
13 operating agreement, the provision is likewise ineffective in the
14 record.

15 (d) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, if a
16 record that has been delivered by a limited liability company to
17 the Secretary of State for filing and has become effective under
18 the act conflicts with a provision of the operating agreement:

19 (1) the operating agreement prevails as to members,
20 dissociated members, transferees, and managers; and

21 (2) the record prevails as to other persons to the extent
22 they reasonably rely on the record.

23 Sec. 13. (ULLCA 113) (a) A limited liability company
24 shall designate and continuously maintain in this state:

25 (1) an office, which need not be a place of its activity

1 in this state; and

2 (2) an agent for service of process.

3 (b) A foreign limited liability company that has a
4 certificate of authority under section 56 of this act shall
5 designate and continuously maintain in this state an agent for
6 service of process.

7 (c) An agent for service of process of a limited
8 liability company or foreign limited liability company must be
9 an individual who is a resident of this state or other person with
10 authority to transact business in this state.

11 Sec. 14. (ULLCA 114) (a) A limited liability company or
12 foreign limited liability company may change its designated office,
13 its agent for service of process, or the address of its agent for
14 service of process by delivering to the Secretary of State for
15 filing a statement of change containing:

16 (1) the name of the company;

17 (2) the street and mailing addresses of its current
18 designated office;

19 (3) if the current designated office is to be changed,
20 the street and mailing addresses of the new designated office;

21 (4) the name and street and mailing addresses and post
22 office box number, if any, of its current agent for service of
23 process; and

24 (5) if the current agent for service of process or an
25 address of the agent is to be changed, the new information.

1 (b) Subject to subsection (c) of section 21 of this act,
2 a statement of change is effective when filed by the Secretary of
3 State.

4 Sec. 15. (ULLCA 115) (a) To resign as an agent for
5 service of process of a limited liability company or foreign
6 limited liability company, the agent must deliver to the Secretary
7 of State for filing a statement of resignation containing the
8 company name and stating that the agent is resigning.

9 (b) The Secretary of State shall file a statement of
10 resignation delivered under subsection (a) of this section and mail
11 or otherwise provide or deliver a copy to the designated office of
12 the limited liability company or foreign limited liability company
13 and another copy to the principal office of the company if the
14 mailing addresses of the principal office appears in the records of
15 the Secretary of State and is different from the mailing address of
16 the designated office.

17 (c) An agency for service of process terminates on the
18 earlier of:

19 (1) the thirty-first day after the Secretary of State
20 files the statement of resignation; or

21 (2) when a record designating a new agent for service of
22 process is delivered to the Secretary of State for filing on behalf
23 of the limited liability company and becomes effective.

24 Sec. 16. (ULLCA 116) (a) An agent for service of process
25 appointed by a limited liability company or foreign limited

1 liability company is an agent of the company for service of
2 any process, notice, or demand required or permitted by law to be
3 served on the company.

4 (b) If a limited liability company or foreign limited
5 liability company does not appoint or maintain an agent for service
6 of process in this state or the agent for service of process
7 cannot with reasonable diligence be found at the agent's street
8 address, service of any process, notice, or demand on the limited
9 liability company or foreign limited liability company may be made
10 by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, to the
11 company at its designated office.

12 (c) Service is effected under subsection (b) of this
13 section at the earliest of:

14 (1) the date the limited liability company or foreign
15 limited liability company receives the process, notice, or demand;

16 (2) the date shown on the return receipt, if signed on
17 behalf of the company; or

18 (3) five days after the process, notice, or demand is
19 deposited with the United States Postal Service, if correctly
20 addressed and with sufficient postage.

21 (d) This section does not affect the right to serve
22 process, notice, or demand in any other manner provided by law.

23 Sec. 17. (ULLCA 201) (a) One or more persons may act
24 as organizers to form a limited liability company by signing and
25 delivering to the Secretary of State for filing a certificate

1 of organization and, if applicable, a current certificate of
2 registration as provided in sections 85 to 89 of this act.

3 (b) A certificate of organization must state:

4 (1) the name of the limited liability company, which must
5 comply with section 8 of this act;

6 (2) the street and mailing addresses of the initial
7 designated office and the name and street and mailing addresses and
8 post office box number, if any, of the initial agent for service of
9 process of the company; and

10 (3) if the company is organized to render a professional
11 service, the professional service its members, managers,
12 professional employees, and agents are licensed or otherwise
13 legally authorized to render in this state.

14 (c) Subject to subsection (c) of section 12 of this
15 act, a certificate of organization may also contain statements as
16 to matters other than those required by subsection (b) of this
17 section. However, a statement in a certificate of organization is
18 not effective as a statement of authority.

19 (d) The following rules apply to the filing of a
20 certificate of organization:

21 (1) A limited liability company is formed when the
22 Secretary of State has filed the certificate of organization and a
23 certificate of registration, if applicable, and the company has at
24 least one member, unless the certificate states a delayed effective
25 date pursuant to subsection (c) of section 21 of this act.

1 (2) If the certificate states a delayed effective date, a
2 limited liability company is not formed if, before the certificate
3 takes effect, a statement of cancellation is signed and delivered
4 to the Secretary of State for filing and the Secretary of State
5 files the certificate.

6 (3) Subject to any delayed effective date and except in a
7 proceeding by this state to dissolve a limited liability company,
8 the filing of the certificate of organization by the Secretary
9 of State is conclusive proof that the organizer satisfied all
10 conditions to the formation of a limited liability company.

11 Sec. 18. (ULLCA 202) (a) A certificate of organization
12 may be amended or restated at any time.

13 (b) To amend its certificate of organization, a limited
14 liability company must deliver to the Secretary of State for filing
15 an amendment stating:

16 (1) the name of the company;

17 (2) the date of filing of its certificate of
18 organization; and

19 (3) the changes the amendment makes to the certificate as
20 most recently amended or restated.

21 (c) To restate its certificate of organization, a limited
22 liability company must deliver to the Secretary of State for filing
23 a restatement, designated as such in its heading, stating:

24 (1) in the heading or an introductory paragraph, the
25 company's present name and the date of the filing of the company's

1 initial certificate of organization;

2 (2) if the company's name has been changed at any time
3 since the company's formation, each of the company's former names;
4 and

5 (3) the changes the restatement makes to the certificate
6 as most recently amended or restated.

7 (d) Subject to subsection (c) of section 12 of this act
8 and subsection (c) of section 21 of this act, an amendment to
9 or restatement of a certificate of organization is effective when
10 filed by the Secretary of State.

11 (e) If a member of a member-managed limited liability
12 company, or a manager of a manager-managed limited liability
13 company, knows that any information in a filed certificate of
14 organization was inaccurate when the certificate was filed or has
15 become inaccurate owing to changed circumstances, the member or
16 manager shall promptly:

17 (1) cause the certificate to be amended; or

18 (2) if appropriate, deliver to the Secretary of State for
19 filing a statement of change under section 14 of this act or a
20 statement of correction under section 22 of this act.

21 Sec. 19. (ULLCA 203) (a) A record delivered to the
22 Secretary of State for filing pursuant to the Nebraska Uniform
23 Limited Liability Company Act must be signed as follows:

24 (1) Except as otherwise provided in subdivisions (2) and
25 (3) of this subsection, a record signed on behalf of a limited

1 liability company must be signed by a person authorized by the
2 company.

3 (2) A limited liability company's initial certificate of
4 organization must be signed by at least one person acting as an
5 organizer.

6 (3) A record filed on behalf of a dissolved limited
7 liability company that has no members must be signed by the person
8 winding up the company's activities under subsection (c) of section
9 48 of this act or a person appointed under subsection (d) of such
10 section to wind up those activities.

11 (4) A statement of cancellation under subdivision (d) (2)
12 of section 17 of this act must be signed by each organizer that
13 signed the initial certificate of organization, but a personal
14 representative of a deceased or incompetent organizer may sign in
15 the place of the decedent or incompetent.

16 (5) A statement of denial by a person under section 28 of
17 this act must be signed by that person.

18 (6) Any other record must be signed by the person on
19 whose behalf the record is delivered to the Secretary of State.

20 (b) Any record filed under the act may be signed by an
21 agent.

22 Sec. 20. (ULLCA 204) (a) If a person required by the
23 Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability Company Act to sign a record or
24 deliver a record to the Secretary of State for filing under the act
25 does not do so, any other person that is aggrieved may petition the

1 district court to order:

2 (1) the person to sign the record;

3 (2) the person to deliver the record to the Secretary of
4 State for filing; or

5 (3) the Secretary of State to file the record unsigned.

6 (b) If a petitioner under subsection (a) of this section
7 is not the limited liability company or foreign limited liability

10 Sec. 21. (ULLCA 205) (a) A record authorized or required
11 to be delivered to the Secretary of State for filing under the
12 Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability Company Act must be captioned
13 to describe the record's purpose, be in a medium permitted by
14 the Secretary of State, and be delivered to the Secretary of
15 State. If the filing fees have been paid, unless the Secretary
16 of State determines that a record does not comply with the filing
17 requirements of the act, the Secretary of State shall file the
18 record and:

4 (c) Except as otherwise provided in sections 15 and 22 of
5 this act, a record delivered to the Secretary of State for filing
6 under the act may specify an effective time and a delayed effective
7 date. Subject to section 15 of this act, subdivision (d)(1) of
8 section 17 of this act, and section 22 of this act, a record filed
9 by the Secretary of State is effective:

10 (1) if the record does not specify either an effective
11 time or a delayed effective date, on the date and at the time
12 the record is filed as evidenced by the Secretary of State's
13 endorsement of the date and time on the record;

14 (2) if the record specifies an effective time but not a
15 delayed effective date, on the date the record is filed at the time
16 specified in the record;

17 (3) if the record specifies a delayed effective date but
18 not an effective time, at 12:01 a.m. on the earlier of:

19 (A) the specified date; or

20 (B) the ninetieth day after the record is filed; or

21 (4) if the record specifies an effective time and a
22 delayed effective date, at the specified time on the earlier of:

23 (A) the specified date; or

24 (B) the ninetieth day after the record is filed.

25 Sec. 22. (ULLCA 206) (a) A limited liability company or

1 foreign limited liability company may deliver to the Secretary of
 2 State for filing a statement of correction to correct a record
 3 previously delivered by the company to the Secretary of State and
 4 filed by the Secretary of State, if at the time of filing the
 5 record contained inaccurate information or was defectively signed.

6 (b) A statement of correction under subsection (a) of
 7 this section may not state a delayed effective date and must:

8 (1) describe the record to be corrected, including its
 9 filing date, or attach a copy of the record as filed;

10 (2) specify the inaccurate information and the reason it
 11 is inaccurate or the manner in which the signing was defective; and

12 (3) correct the defective signature or inaccurate
 13 information.

14 (c) When filed by the Secretary of State, a statement
 15 of correction under subsection (a) of this section is effective
 16 retroactively as of the effective date of the record the statement
 17 corrects, but the statement is effective when filed:

18 (1) for the purposes of subsection (d) of section 3 of
 19 this act; and

20 (2) as to persons that previously relied on the
 21 uncorrected record and would be adversely affected by the
 22 retroactive effect.

23 Sec. 23. (ULLCA 207) (a) If a record delivered to the
 24 Secretary of State for filing under the Nebraska Uniform Limited
 25 Liability Company Act and filed by the Secretary of State contains

1 inaccurate information, a person that suffers a loss by reliance on
2 the information may recover damages for the loss from:

3 (1) a person that signed the record, or caused another
4 to sign it on the person's behalf, and knew the information to be
5 inaccurate at the time the record was signed; and

6 (2) subject to subsection (b) of this section, a member
7 of a member-managed limited liability company or the manager of a
8 manager-managed limited liability company, if:

9 (A) the record was delivered for filing on behalf of the
10 company; and

11 (B) the member or manager had notice of the inaccuracy
12 for a reasonably sufficient time before the information was relied
13 upon so that, before the reliance, the member or manager reasonably
14 could have:

15 (i) effected an amendment under section 18 of this act;

17 (iii) delivered to the Secretary of State for filing a

19 correction under section 22 of this act.

20 (b) To the extent that the operating agreement of
21 a member-managed limited liability company expressly relieves
22 a member of responsibility for maintaining the accuracy of
23 information contained in records delivered on behalf of the company
24 to the Secretary of State for filing under the act and imposes
25 that responsibility on one or more other members, the liability

1 stated in subdivision (a) (2) of this section applies to those other
2 members and not to the member that the operating agreement relieves
3 of the responsibility.

4 (c) An individual who signs a record authorized or
5 required to be filed under the act affirms under penalty of perjury
6 that the information stated in the record is accurate.

7 Sec. 24. (ULLCA 208) (a) The Secretary of State, upon
8 request and payment of the requisite fee, shall furnish to any
9 person a certificate of existence for a limited liability company
10 if the records filed in the office of the Secretary of State show
11 that the company has been formed under section 17 of this act and
12 the Secretary of State has not filed a statement of termination
13 pertaining to the company. A certificate of existence must state:

14 (1) the company's name;

15 (2) that the company was duly formed under the laws of
16 this state and the date of formation;

17 (3) whether all fees, taxes, and penalties due under the
18 Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability Company Act or other law to the
19 Secretary of State have been paid;

20 (4) whether the company's most recent biennial report
21 required by section 25 of this act has been filed by the Secretary
22 of State;

23 (5) whether the Secretary of State has administratively
24 dissolved the company;

25 (6) whether the company has delivered to the Secretary of

1 State for filing a statement of dissolution;

2 (7) that a statement of termination has not been filed by
3 the Secretary of State; and

5 of State which are specified by the person requesting the
6 certificate.

7 (b) The Secretary of State, upon request and payment
8 of the requisite fee, shall furnish to any person a certificate
9 of authorization for a foreign limited liability company if the
10 records filed in the office of the Secretary of State show that the
11 Secretary of State has filed a certificate of authority, has not
12 revoked the certificate of authority, and has not filed a notice of
13 cancellation. A certificate of authorization must state:

14 (1) the company's name and any alternate name adopted
15 under subsection (a) of section 59 of this act for use in this
16 state;

17 (2) that the company is authorized to transact business
18 in this state;

19 (3) whether all fees, taxes, and penalties due under the
20 act or other law to the Secretary of State have been paid;

21 (4) whether the company's most recent biennial report
22 required by section 25 of this act has been filed by the Secretary
23 of State;

24 (5) that the Secretary of State has not revoked the
25 company's certificate of authority and has not filed a notice of

2 (6) other facts of record in the office of the Secretary

5 (c) Subject to any qualification stated in the
6 certificate, a certificate of existence or certificate of
7 authorization issued by the Secretary of State is conclusive
8 evidence that the limited liability company is in existence or
9 the foreign limited liability company is authorized to transact
10 business in this state.

11 Sec. 25. (ULLCA 209) (a) Each odd-numbered year, a
12 limited liability company or a foreign limited liability company
13 authorized to transact business in this state shall deliver to the
14 Secretary of State for filing a biennial report that states:

15 (1) the name of the company;

16 (2) the street and mailing addresses of the company's
17 designated office and the name and street and mailing addresses and
18 post office box number, if any, of its agent for service of process
19 in this state;

20 (3) the street and mailing addresses of its principal
21 office; and

22 (4) in the case of a foreign limited liability company,
23 the state or other jurisdiction under whose law the company is

19 Sec. 26. (ULLCA 301) (a) A member is not an agent of a
20 limited liability company solely by reason of being a member.

21 (b) A person's status as a member does not prevent or
22 restrict law other than the Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability
23 Company Act from imposing liability on a limited liability company
24 because of the person's conduct.

25 Sec. 27. (ULLCA 302) (a) A limited liability company

1 may deliver to the Secretary of State for filing a statement of
2 authority. The statement:

3 (1) must include the name of the company and the street
4 and mailing addresses of its designated office;

5 (2) with respect to any position that exists in or with
6 respect to the company, may state the authority, or limitations on
7 the authority, of all persons holding the position to:

8 (A) execute an instrument transferring real property held
9 in the name of the company; or

10 (B) enter into other transactions on behalf of, or
11 otherwise act for or bind, the company; and

12 (3) may state the authority, or limitations on the
13 authority, of a specific person to:

14 (A) execute an instrument transferring real property held
15 in the name of the company; or

16 (B) enter into other transactions on behalf of, or
17 otherwise act for or bind, the company.

18 (b) To amend or cancel a statement of authority filed by
19 the Secretary of State under subsection (a) of section 21 of this
20 act, a limited liability company must deliver to the Secretary of
21 State for filing an amendment or cancellation stating:

22 (1) the name of the company;

23 (2) the street and mailing addresses of the company's
24 designated office;

25 (3) the caption of the statement being amended or

1 canceled and the date the statement being affected became
2 effective; and

3 (4) the contents of the amendment or a declaration that
4 the statement being affected is canceled.

5 (c) A statement of authority affects only the power of a
6 person to bind a limited liability company to persons that are not
7 members.

8 (d) Subject to subsection (c) of this section and
9 subsection (d) of section 3 of this act and except as otherwise
10 provided in subsections (f), (g), and (h) of this section, a
11 limitation on the authority of a person or a position contained in
12 an effective statement of authority is not by itself evidence of
13 knowledge or notice of the limitation by any person.

14 (e) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, a grant
15 of authority not pertaining to transfers of real property and
16 contained in an effective statement of authority is conclusive in
17 favor of a person that gives value in reliance on the grant, except
18 to the extent that when the person gives value:

19 (1) the person has knowledge to the contrary;

20 (2) the statement has been canceled or restrictively
21 amended under subsection (b) of this section; or

22 (3) a limitation on the grant is contained in another
23 statement of authority that became effective after the statement
24 containing the grant became effective.

25 (f) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, an

1 effective statement of authority that grants authority to transfer
2 real property held in the name of the limited liability company
3 and that is recorded by certified copy in the office for recording
4 transfers of the real property is conclusive in favor of a person
5 that gives value in reliance on the grant without knowledge to the
6 contrary, except to the extent that when the person gives value:

7 (1) the statement has been canceled or restrictively
8 amended under subsection (b) of this section and a certified copy
9 of the cancellation or restrictive amendment has been recorded in
10 the office for recording transfers of the real property; or

11 (2) a limitation on the grant is contained in another
12 statement of authority that became effective after the statement
13 containing the grant became effective and a certified copy of the
14 later-effective statement is recorded in the office for recording
15 transfers of the real property.

16 (g) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, if a
17 certified copy of an effective statement containing a limitation
18 on the authority to transfer real property held in the name of a
19 limited liability company is recorded in the office for recording
20 transfers of that real property, all persons are deemed to know of
21 the limitation.

22 (h) Subject to subsection (i) of this section, an
23 effective statement of dissolution or termination is a cancellation
24 of any filed statement of authority for the purposes of subsection
25 (f) of this section and is a limitation on authority for the

1 purposes of subsection (g) of this section.

2 (i) After a statement of dissolution becomes effective,
3 a limited liability company may deliver to the Secretary of State
4 for filing and, if appropriate, may record a statement of authority
5 that is designated as a post-dissolution statement of authority.
6 The statement operates as provided in subsections (f) and (g) of
7 this section.

8 (j) Unless earlier canceled, an effective statement of
9 authority is canceled by operation of law five years after the
10 date on which the statement, or its most recent amendment,
11 becomes effective. This cancellation operates without need for
12 any recording under subsection (f) or (g) of this section.

13 (k) An effective statement of denial operates as a
14 restrictive amendment under this section and may be recorded by
15 certified copy for the purposes of subdivision (f)(1) of this
16 section.

17 Sec. 28. (ULLCA 303) A person named in a filed statement
18 of authority granting that person authority may deliver to the
19 Secretary of State for filing a statement of denial that:

20 (1) provides the name of the limited liability company
21 and the caption of the statement of authority to which the
22 statement of denial pertains; and

23 (2) denies the grant of authority.

24 Sec. 29. (ULLCA 304) (a) The debts, obligations, or other
25 liabilities of a limited liability company, whether arising in

1 contract, tort, or otherwise:

2 (1) are solely the debts, obligations, or other
3 liabilities of the company; and

4 (2) do not become the debts, obligations, or other
5 liabilities of a member or manager solely by reason of the member
6 acting as a member or manager acting as a manager.

7 (b) The mere failure of a limited liability company to
8 observe any particular formalities relating to the exercise of its
9 powers or management of its activities is not a ground for imposing
10 liability on the members or managers for the debts, obligations, or
11 other liabilities of the company.

12 (c) Any member, manager, or employee of a limited
13 liability company with the duty to collect, account for, or
14 pay over any taxes imposed upon a limited liability company or
15 with the authority to decide whether the limited liability company
16 will pay taxes imposed upon a limited liability company shall be
17 personally liable for the payment of such taxes in the event of
18 willful failure on his or her part to have a limited liability
19 company perform such act. Such taxes shall be collected in the same
20 manner as provided under section 77-1783.01.

21 Sec. 30. (ULLCA 401) (a) If a limited liability company
22 is to have only one member upon formation, the person becomes a
23 member as agreed by that person and the organizer of the company.
24 That person and the organizer may be, but need not be, different
25 persons. If different, the organizer acts on behalf of the initial

1 member.

2 (b) If a limited liability company is to have more than
3 one member upon formation, those persons become members as agreed
4 by the persons before the formation of the company. The organizer
5 acts on behalf of the persons in forming the company and may be,
6 but need not be, one of the persons.

7 (c) After formation of a limited liability company, a
8 person becomes a member:

9 (1) as provided in the operating agreement;

10 (2) as the result of a transaction effective under
11 sections 70 to 84 of this act;

12 (3) with the consent of all the members; or

13 (4) if, within ninety consecutive days after the company
14 ceases to have any members:

15 (A) the last person to have been a member, or the legal
16 representative of that person, designates a person to become a
17 member; and

18 (B) the designated person consents to become a member.

19 (d) A person may become a member without acquiring a
20 transferable interest and without making or being obligated to make
21 a contribution to the limited liability company.

22 Sec. 31. (ULLCA 402) A contribution may consist of
23 tangible or intangible property or other benefit to a limited
24 liability company, including money, services performed, promissory
25 notes, other agreements to contribute money or property, and

1 contracts for services to be performed.

2 Sec. 32. (ULLCA 403) (a) A person's obligation to make
3 a contribution to a limited liability company is not excused by
4 the person's death, disability, or other inability to perform
5 personally. If a person does not make a required contribution,
6 the person or the person's estate is obligated to contribute money
7 equal to the value of the part of the contribution which has not
8 been made, at the option of the company.

9 (b) A creditor of a limited liability company which
10 extends credit or otherwise acts in actual reliance on an
11 obligation described in subsection (a) of this section may enforce
12 the obligation.

13 Sec. 33. (ULLCA 404) (a) Any distributions made by a
14 limited liability company before its dissolution and winding up
15 must be in equal shares among members and dissociated members,
16 except to the extent necessary to comply with any transfer
17 effective under section 41 of this act and any charging order
18 in effect under section 42 of this act.

19 (b) A person has a right to a distribution before the
20 dissolution and winding up of a limited liability company only if
21 the company decides to make an interim distribution. A person's
22 dissociation does not entitle the person to a distribution.

23 (c) A person does not have a right to demand or receive
24 a distribution from a limited liability company in any form other
25 than money. Except as otherwise provided in subsection (c) of

1 section 54 of this act, a limited liability company may distribute
2 an asset in kind if each part of the asset is fungible with each

5 (d) If a member or transferee becomes entitled to receive
6 a distribution, the member or transferee has the status of, and is
7 entitled to all remedies available to, a creditor of the limited
8 liability company with respect to the distribution.

9 Sec. 34. (ULLCA 405) (a) A limited liability company may
10 not make a distribution if after the distribution:

11 (1) the company would not be able to pay its debts as
12 they become due in the ordinary course of the company's activities;
13 or

14 (2) the company's total assets would be less than the
15 sum of its total liabilities plus the amount that would be needed,
16 if the company were to be dissolved, wound up, and terminated at
17 the time of the distribution, to satisfy the preferential rights
18 upon dissolution, winding up, and termination of members whose
19 preferential rights are superior to those of persons receiving the
20 distribution.

21 (b) A limited liability company may base a determination
22 that a distribution is not prohibited under subsection (a) of this
23 section on financial statements prepared on the basis of accounting

2 (c) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (f) of
3 this section, the effect of a distribution under subsection (a) of
4 this section is measured:

5 (1) in the case of a distribution by purchase,
6 redemption, or other acquisition of a transferable interest in the
7 company, as of the date money or other property is transferred or
8 debt incurred by the company; and

9 (2) in all other cases, as of the date:

10 (A) the distribution is authorized, if the payment occurs
11 within one hundred twenty days after that date; or

12 (B) the payment is made, if the payment occurs more than
13 one hundred twenty days after the distribution is authorized.

14 (d) A limited liability company's indebtedness to a
15 member incurred by reason of a distribution made in accordance with
16 this section is at parity with the company's indebtedness to its
17 general, unsecured creditors.

18 (e) A limited liability company's indebtedness, including
19 indebtedness issued in connection with or as part of a
20 distribution, is not a liability for purposes of subsection (a) of
21 this section if the terms of the indebtedness provide that payment
22 of principal and interest are made only to the extent that a
23 distribution could be made to members under this section.

24 (f) If indebtedness is issued as a distribution, each
25 payment of principal or interest on the indebtedness is treated as

1 a distribution, the effect of which is measured on the date the
2 payment is made.

3 (g) In subsection (a) of this section, distribution
4 does not include amounts constituting reasonable compensation for
5 present or past services or reasonable payments made in the
6 ordinary course of business under a bona fide retirement plan or
7 other benefits program.

8 Sec. 35. (ULLCA 406) (a) Except as otherwise provided in
9 subsection (b) of this section, if a member of a member-managed
10 limited liability company or manager of a manager-managed limited
11 liability company consents to a distribution made in violation of
12 section 34 of this act and in consenting to the distribution fails
13 to comply with section 38 of this act, the member or manager is
14 personally liable to the company for the amount of the distribution
15 that exceeds the amount that could have been distributed without
16 the violation of section 34 of this act.

17 (b) To the extent the operating agreement of a
18 member-managed limited liability company expressly relieves
19 a member of the authority and responsibility to consent to
20 distributions and imposes that authority and responsibility on one
21 or more other members, the liability stated in subsection (a) of
22 this section applies to the other members and not the member that
23 the operating agreement relieves of authority and responsibility.

24 (c) A person that receives a distribution knowing that
25 the distribution to that person was made in violation of section 34

1 of this act is personally liable to the limited liability company
2 but only to the extent that the distribution received by the
3 person exceeded the amount that could have been properly paid under
4 section 34 of this act.

5 (d) A person against which an action is commenced because
6 the person is liable under subsection (a) of this section may:

7 (1) implead any other person that is subject to
8 liability under subsection (a) of this section and seek to compel
9 contribution from the person; and

10 (2) implead any person that received a distribution in
11 violation of subsection (c) of this section and seek to compel
12 contribution from the person in the amount the person received in
13 violation of subsection (c) of this section.

14 (e) An action under this section is barred if not
15 commenced within two years after the distribution.

16 Sec. 36. (ULLCA 407) (a) A limited liability company is
17 a member-managed limited liability company unless the operating
18 agreement:

19 (1) expressly provides that:

20 (A) the company is or will be manager-managed;

21 (B) the company is or will be managed by managers; or

22 (C) management of the company is or will be vested in
23 managers; or

24 (2) includes words of similar import.

25 (b) In a member-managed limited liability company, the

1 following rules apply:

2 (1) The management and conduct of the company are vested
3 in the members.

4 (2) Each member has equal rights in the management and
5 conduct of the company's activities.

6 (3) A difference arising among members as to a matter in
7 the ordinary course of the activities of the company may be decided
8 by a majority of the members.

9 (4) An act outside the ordinary course of the activities
10 of the company may be undertaken only with the consent of all
11 members.

12 (5) The operating agreement may be amended only with the
13 consent of all members.

14 (c) In a manager-managed limited liability company, the
15 following rules apply:

16 (1) Except as otherwise expressly provided in the
17 Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability Company Act, any matter relating
18 to the activities of the company is decided exclusively by the
19 managers.

20 (2) Each manager has equal rights in the management and
21 conduct of the activities of the company.

22 (3) A difference arising among managers as to a matter in
23 the ordinary course of the activities of the company may be decided
24 by a majority of the managers.

25 (4) The consent of all members is required to:

1 (A) sell, lease, exchange, or otherwise dispose of
2 all, or substantially all, of the company's property, with or
3 without the goodwill, outside the ordinary course of the company's
4 activities;

5 (B) approve a merger, conversion, or domestication under
6 sections 70 to 84 of this act;

7 (C) undertake any other act outside the ordinary course
8 of the company's activities; and

9 (D) amend the operating agreement.

10 (5) A manager may be chosen at any time by the consent of
11 a majority of the members and remains a manager until a successor
12 has been chosen, unless the manager at an earlier time resigns,
13 is removed, or dies, or, in the case of a manager that is not an
14 individual, terminates. A manager may be removed at any time by the
15 consent of a majority of the members without notice or cause.

16 (6) A person need not be a member to be a manager, but
17 the dissociation of a member that is also a manager removes the
18 person as a manager. If a person that is both a manager and a
19 member ceases to be a manager, that cessation does not by itself
20 dissociate the person as a member.

21 (7) A person's ceasing to be a manager does not discharge
22 any debt, obligation, or other liability to the limited liability
23 company or members which the person incurred while a manager.

24 (d) An action requiring the consent of members under the
25 Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability Company Act may be taken without

1 a meeting, and a member may appoint a proxy or other agent to
2 consent or otherwise act for the member by signing an appointing
3 record, personally or by the member's agent.

4 (e) The dissolution of a limited liability company does
5 not affect the applicability of this section. However, a person
6 that wrongfully causes dissolution of the company loses the right
7 to participate in management as a member and a manager.

8 (f) The Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability Company
9 Act does not entitle a member to remuneration for services
10 performed for a member-managed limited liability company, except
11 for reasonable compensation for services rendered in winding up the
12 activities of the company.

13 Sec. 37. (ULLCA 408) (a) A limited liability company
14 shall reimburse for any payment made and indemnify for any
15 debt, obligation, or other liability incurred by a member of a
16 member-managed company or the manager of a manager-managed company
17 in the course of the member's or manager's activities on behalf
18 of the company, if, in making the payment or incurring the debt,
19 obligation, or other liability, the member or manager complied with
20 the duties stated in sections 34 and 38 of this act.

21 (b) A limited liability company may purchase and maintain
22 insurance on behalf of a member or manager of the company against
23 liability asserted against or incurred by the member or manager in
24 that capacity or arising from that status even if, under subsection
25 (f) of section 10 of this act, the operating agreement could not

1 eliminate or limit the person's liability to the company for the
2 conduct giving rise to the liability.

3 Sec. 38. (ULLCA 409) (a) A member of a member-managed
4 limited liability company owes to the company and, subject to
5 subsection (b) of section 64 of this act, the other members the
6 fiduciary duties of loyalty and care stated in subsections (b) and
7 (c) of this section.

8 (b) The duty of loyalty of a member in a member-managed
9 limited liability company includes the duties:

10 (1) to account to the company and to hold as trustee for
11 it any property, profit, or benefit derived by the member:

12 (A) in the conduct or winding up of the company's
13 activities;

14 (B) from a use by the member of the company's property;
15 or

16 (C) from the appropriation of a limited liability company
17 opportunity;

18 (2) to refrain from dealing with the company in the
19 conduct or winding up of the company's activities as or on behalf
20 of a person having an interest adverse to the company; and

21 (3) to refrain from competing with the company in the
22 conduct of the company's activities before the dissolution of the
23 company.

24 (c) Subject to the business judgment rule, the duty of
25 care of a member of a member-managed limited liability company in

1 the conduct and winding up of the company's activities is to act
2 with the care that a person in a like position would reasonably
3 exercise under similar circumstances and in a manner the member
4 reasonably believes to be in the best interests of the company.
5 In discharging this duty, a member may rely in good faith upon
6 opinions, reports, statements, or other information provided by
7 another person that the member reasonably believes is a competent
8 and reliable source for the information.

9 (d) A member in a member-managed limited liability
10 company or a manager-managed limited liability company shall
11 discharge the duties under the Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability
12 Company Act or under the operating agreement and exercise any
13 rights consistently with the contractual obligation of good faith
14 and fair dealing.

15 (e) It is a defense to a claim under subdivision (b) (2)
16 of this section and any comparable claim in equity or at common law
17 that the transaction was fair to the limited liability company.

18 (f) All of the members of a member-managed limited
19 liability company or a manager-managed limited liability company
20 may authorize or ratify, after full disclosure of all material
21 facts, a specific act or transaction that otherwise would violate
22 the duty of loyalty.

23 (g) In a manager-managed limited liability company, the
24 following rules apply:

25 (1) Subsections (a), (b), (c), and (e) of this section

1 apply to the manager or managers and not the members.

2 (2) The duty stated under subdivision (b) (3) of this
3 section continues until winding up is completed.

4 (3) Subsection (d) of this section applies to the members
5 and managers.

6 (4) Subsection (f) of this section applies only to the
7 members.

8 (5) A member does not have any fiduciary duty to the
9 company or to any other member solely by reason of being a member.

10 Sec. 39. (ULLCA 410) (a) In a member-managed limited
11 liability company, the following rules apply:

12 (1) On reasonable notice, a member may inspect and copy
13 during regular business hours, at a reasonable location specified
14 by the company, any record maintained by the company regarding the
15 company's activities, financial condition, and other circumstances,
16 to the extent the information is material to the member's rights
17 and duties under the operating agreement or the Nebraska Uniform
18 Limited Liability Company Act.

19 (2) The company shall furnish to each member:

20 (A) without demand, any information concerning the
21 company's activities, financial condition, and other circumstances
22 which the company knows and is material to the proper exercise of
23 the member's rights and duties under the operating agreement or
24 the act, except to the extent the company can establish that it
25 reasonably believes the member already knows the information; and

1 (B) on demand, any other information concerning the
2 company's activities, financial condition, and other circumstances,
3 except to the extent the demand or information demanded is
4 unreasonable or otherwise improper under the circumstances.

5 (3) The duty to furnish information under subdivision
6 (a)(2) of this section also applies to each member to the
7 extent the member knows any of the information described in
8 such subdivision.

9 (b) In a manager-managed limited liability company, the
10 following rules apply:

11 (1) The informational rights stated in subsection (a) of
12 this section and the duty stated in subdivision (a)(3) of this
13 section apply to the managers and not the members.

14 (2) During regular business hours and at a reasonable
15 location specified by the company, a member may obtain from
16 the company and inspect and copy full information regarding the
17 activities, financial condition, and other circumstances of the
18 company as is just and reasonable if:

19 (A) the member seeks the information for a purpose
20 material to the member's interest as a member;

21 (B) the member makes a demand in a record received by the
22 company, describing with reasonable particularity the information
23 sought and the purpose for seeking the information; and

24 (C) the information sought is directly connected to the
25 member's purpose.

1 (3) Within ten days after receiving a demand pursuant
2 to subdivision (b) (2) (B) of this section, the company shall in a
3 record inform the member that made the demand:

4 (A) of the information that the company will provide in
5 response to the demand and when and where the company will provide
6 the information; and

7 (B) if the company declines to provide any demanded
8 information, the company's reasons for declining.

9 (c) On ten days' demand made in a record received by
10 a limited liability company, a dissociated member may have access
11 to information to which the person was entitled while a member
12 if the information pertains to the period during which the person
13 was a member, the person seeks the information in good faith,
14 and the person satisfies the requirements imposed on a member by
15 subdivision (b) (2) of this section. The company shall respond to a
16 demand made pursuant to this subsection in the manner provided in
17 subdivision (b) (3) of this section.

18 (d) A limited liability company may charge a person that
19 makes a demand under this section the reasonable costs of copying,
20 limited to the costs of labor and material.

21 (e) A member or dissociated member may exercise rights
22 under this section through an agent or, in the case of an
23 individual under legal disability, a legal representative. Any
24 restriction or condition imposed by the operating agreement or
25 under subsection (g) of this section applies both to the agent or

1 legal representative and the member or dissociated member.

2 (f) The rights under this section do not extend to a
3 person as transferee.

4 (g) In addition to any restriction or condition stated
5 in its operating agreement, a limited liability company, as a
6 matter within the ordinary course of its activities, may impose
7 reasonable restrictions and conditions on access to and use
8 of information to be furnished under this section, including
9 designating information confidential and imposing nondisclosure and
10 safeguarding obligations on the recipient. In a dispute concerning
11 the reasonableness of a restriction under this subsection, the
12 company has the burden of proving reasonableness.

13 Sec. 40. (ULLCA 501) A transferable interest is personal
14 property.

15 Sec. 41. (ULLCA 502) (a) A transfer, in whole or in part,
16 of a transferable interest:

17 (1) is permissible;

18 (2) does not by itself cause a member's dissociation or
19 a dissolution and winding up of the limited liability company's
20 activities; and

21 (3) subject to section 43 of this act, does not entitle
22 the transferee to:

23 (A) participate in the management or conduct of the
24 company's activities; or

25 (B) except as otherwise provided in subsection (c)

1 of this section, have access to records or other information
2 concerning the company's activities.

3 (b) A transferee has the right to receive, in accordance
4 with the transfer, distributions to which the transferor would
5 otherwise be entitled.

6 (c) In a dissolution and winding up of a limited
7 liability company, a transferee is entitled to an account of
8 the company's transactions only from the date of dissolution.

9 (d) A transferable interest may be evidenced by a
10 certificate of the interest issued by the limited liability company
11 in a record, and, subject to this section, the interest represented
12 by the certificate may be transferred by a transfer of the
13 certificate.

14 (e) A limited liability company need not give effect to a
15 transferee's rights under this section until the company has notice
16 of the transfer.

17 (f) A transfer of a transferable interest in violation of
18 a restriction on transfer contained in the operating agreement is
19 ineffective as to a person having notice of the restriction at the
20 time of transfer.

21 (g) Except as otherwise provided in subdivision (4)(B)
22 of section 45 of this act, when a member transfers a transferable
23 interest, the transferor retains the rights of a member other than
24 the interest in distributions transferred and retains all duties
25 and obligations of a member.

1 (h) When a member transfers a transferable interest to
2 a person that becomes a member with respect to the transferred
3 interest, the transferee is liable for the member's obligations
4 under section 32 of this act and subsection (c) of section 35 of
5 this act known to the transferee when the transferee becomes a
6 member.

7 Sec. 42. (ULLCA 503) (a) On application by a judgment
8 creditor of a member or transferee, a court may enter a charging
9 order against the transferable interest of the judgment debtor
10 for the unsatisfied amount of the judgment. A charging order
11 constitutes a lien on a judgment debtor's transferable interest and
12 requires the limited liability company to pay over to the person
13 to which the charging order was issued any distribution that would
14 otherwise be paid to the judgment debtor.

15 (b) To the extent necessary to effectuate the collection
16 of distributions pursuant to a charging order in effect under

25 court may foreclose the lien and order the sale of the transferable

1 interest. The purchaser at the foreclosure sale only obtains the
2 transferable interest, does not thereby become a member, and is
3 subject to section 41 of this act.

4 (d) At any time before completion of the foreclosure sale
5 under subsection (c) of this section, the member or transferee
6 whose transferable interest is subject to a charging order under
7 subsection (a) of this section may extinguish the charging order
8 by satisfying the judgment and filing a certified copy of the
9 satisfaction with the court that issued the charging order.

10 (e) At any time before completion of the foreclosure sale
11 under subsection (c) of this section, a limited liability company
12 or one or more members whose transferable interests are not subject
13 to the charging order may pay to the judgment creditor the full
14 amount due under the judgment and thereby succeed to the rights of
15 the judgment creditor, including the charging order.

16 (f) The Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability Company Act
17 does not deprive any member or transferee of the benefit of
18 any exemption laws applicable to the member's or transferee's
19 transferable interest.

20 (g) This section provides the exclusive remedy by which a
21 person seeking to enforce a judgment against a member or transferee
22 may, in the capacity of judgment creditor, satisfy the judgment
23 from the judgment debtor's transferable interest.

24 Sec. 43. (ULLCA 504) If a member dies, the deceased
25 member's personal representative or other legal representative may

1 exercise the rights of a transferee provided in subsection (c)
2 of section 41 of this act and, for the purposes of settling the
3 estate, the rights of a current member under section 39 of this
4 act.

5 Sec. 44. (ULLCA 601) (a) A person has the power to
6 dissociate as a member at any time, rightfully or wrongfully, by
7 withdrawing as a member by express will under subdivision (1) of
8 section 45 of this act.

9 (b) A person's dissociation from a limited liability
10 company is wrongful only if the dissociation:

11 (1) is in breach of an express provision of the operating
12 agreement; or

13 (2) occurs before the termination of the company and:

14 (A) the person withdraws as a member by express will;

15 (B) the person is expelled as a member by judicial order
16 under subdivision (5) of section 45 of this act;

17 (C) the person is dissociated under subdivision (7) (A) of
18 section 45 of this act by becoming a debtor in bankruptcy; or

19 (D) in the case of a person that is not a trust other
20 than a business trust, an estate, or an individual, the person is

22 dissolved or terminated.

23 (c) A person that wrongfully dissociates as a member is
24 liable to the limited liability company and, subject to section
25 64 of this act, to the other members for damages caused by the

1 dissociation. The liability is in addition to any other debt,
2 obligation, or other liability of the member to the company or the
3 other members.

4 Sec. 45. (ULLCA 602) A person is dissociated as a member
5 from a limited liability company when:

6 (1) the company has notice of the person's express will
7 to withdraw as a member, but, if the person specified a withdrawal
8 date later than the date the company had notice, on that later
9 date;

10 (2) an event stated in the operating agreement as causing
11 the person's dissociation occurs;

12 (3) the person is expelled as a member pursuant to the
13 operating agreement;

14 (4) the person is expelled as a member by the unanimous
15 consent of the other members if:

16 (A) it is unlawful to carry on the company's activities
17 with the person as a member;

18 (B) there has been a transfer of all of the person's
19 transferable interest in the company, other than:

20 (i) a transfer for security purposes; or

21 (ii) a charging order in effect under section 42 of this
22 act which has not been foreclosed;

23 (C) the person is a corporation and, within ninety days
24 after the company notifies the person that it will be expelled as
25 a member because the person has filed a certificate of dissolution

1 or the equivalent, its charter has been revoked, or its right
2 to conduct business has been suspended by the jurisdiction of
3 its incorporation, the certificate of dissolution has not been
4 revoked or its charter or right to conduct business has not been
5 reinstated; or

6 (D) the person is a limited liability company or
7 partnership that has been dissolved and whose business is being
8 wound up;

9 (5) on application by the company, the person is expelled
10 as a member by judicial order because the person:

11 (A) has engaged, or is engaging, in wrongful conduct
12 that has adversely and materially affected, or will adversely and
13 materially affect, the company's activities;

14 (B) has willfully or persistently committed, or is
15 willfully and persistently committing, a material breach of the
16 operating agreement or the person's duties or obligations under
17 section 38 of this act; or

18 (C) has engaged in, or is engaging in, conduct relating
19 to the company's activities which makes it not reasonably
20 practicable to carry on the activities with the person as a member;

21 (6) in the case of a person who is an individual:

22 (A) the person dies; or

23 (B) in a member-managed limited liability company:

24 (i) a guardian or general conservator for the person is
25 appointed; or

1 (ii) there is a judicial order that the person has
2 otherwise become incapable of performing the person's duties as a
3 member under the Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability Company Act or
4 the operating agreement;

5 (7) in a member-managed limited liability company, the
6 person:

7 (A) becomes a debtor in bankruptcy;

8 (B) executes an assignment for the benefit of creditors;

9 or

10 (C) seeks, consents to, or acquiesces in the appointment
11 of a trustee, receiver, or liquidator of the person or of all or
12 substantially all of the person's property;

13 (8) in the case of a person that is a trust or is acting
14 as a member by virtue of being a trustee of a trust, the trust's
15 entire transferable interest in the company is distributed;

16 (9) in the case of a person that is an estate or is
17 acting as a member by virtue of being a personal representative of
18 an estate, the estate's entire transferable interest in the company
19 is distributed;

20 (10) in the case of a member that is not an individual,
21 partnership, limited liability company, corporation, trust, or
22 estate, the termination of the member;

23 (11) the company participates in a merger under sections
24 70 to 84 of this act, if:

25 (A) the company is not the surviving entity; or

1 (B) otherwise as a result of the merger, the person
2 ceases to be a member;

3 (12) the company participates in a conversion under
4 sections 70 to 84 of this act;

5 (13) the company participates in a domestication
6 under sections 70 to 84 of this act, if, as a result of the
7 domestication, the person ceases to be a member; or

8 (14) the company terminates.

9 Sec. 46. (ULLCA 603) (a) When a person is dissociated as
10 a member of a limited liability company:

11 (1) the person's right to participate as a member in the
12 management and conduct of the company's activities terminates;

13 (2) if the company is member-managed, the person's
14 fiduciary duties as a member end with regard to matters arising and
15 events occurring after the person's dissociation; and

16 (3) subject to section 43 of this act and sections 70
17 to 84 of this act, any transferable interest owned by the person
18 immediately before dissociation in the person's capacity as a
19 member is owned by the person solely as a transferee.

20 (b) A person's dissociation as a member of a limited
21 liability company does not of itself discharge the person from any
22 debt, obligation, or other liability to the company or the other
23 members which the person incurred while a member.

24 Sec. 47. (ULLCA 701) (a) A limited liability company is
25 dissolved, and its activities must be wound up, upon the occurrence

1 of any of the following:

2 (1) an event or circumstance that the operating agreement
3 states causes dissolution;

4 (2) the consent of all the members;

5 (3) the passage of ninety consecutive days during which
6 the company has no members;

7 (4) on application by a member, the entry by the district
8 court of an order dissolving the company on the grounds that:

9 (A) the conduct of all or substantially all of the
10 company's activities is unlawful; or

11 (B) it is not reasonably practicable to carry on
12 the company's activities in conformity with the certificate of
13 organization and the operating agreement; or

14 (5) on application by a member, the entry by the district
15 court of an order dissolving the company on the grounds that the
16 managers or those members in control of the company:

17 (A) have acted, are acting, or will act in a manner that
18 is illegal or fraudulent; or

19 (B) have acted or are acting in a manner that is
20 oppressive and was, is, or will be directly harmful to the
21 applicant.

22 (b) In a proceeding brought under subdivision (a)(5) of
23 this section, the court may order a remedy other than dissolution.

24 Sec. 48. (ULLCA 702) (a) A dissolved limited liability
25 company shall wind up its activities, and the company continues

1 after dissolution only for the purpose of winding up.

2 (b) In winding up its activities, a limited liability
3 company:

4 (1) shall:

5 (A) discharge the company's debts, obligations, or other
6 liabilities, settle and close the company's activities, and marshal
7 and distribute the assets of the company; and

8 (B) deliver to the Secretary of State for filing a
9 statement of dissolution stating the name of the company and that
10 the company is dissolved; and

11 (2) may:

12 (A) preserve the company activities and property as a
13 going concern for a reasonable time;

14 (B) prosecute and defend actions and proceedings, whether
15 civil, criminal, or administrative;

16 (C) transfer the company's property;

25 been a member may wind up the activities of the company. If the

1 person does so, the person has the powers of a sole manager under
2 subsection (c) of section 36 of this act and is deemed to be a
3 manager for the purposes of subdivision (a)(2) of section 29 of
4 this act.

5 (d) If the legal representative under subsection (c) of
6 this section declines or fails to wind up the company's activities,
7 a person may be appointed to do so by the consent of transferees
8 owning a majority of the rights to receive distributions as
9 transferees at the time the consent is to be effective. A person
10 appointed under this subsection:

11 (1) has the powers of a sole manager under subsection (c)
12 of section 36 of this act and is deemed to be a manager for the
13 purposes of subdivision (a)(2) of section 29 of this act; and

14 (2) shall promptly deliver to the Secretary of State for
15 filing an amendment to the company's certificate of organization
16 to:

17 (A) state that the company has no members;

18 (B) state that the person has been appointed pursuant to
19 this subsection to wind up the company; and

20 (C) provide the street and mailing addresses of the
21 person.

22 (e) The district court may order judicial supervision of
23 the winding up of a dissolved limited liability company, including
24 the appointment of a person to wind up the company's activities:

25 (1) on application of a member, if the applicant

1 establishes good cause;

2 (2) on the application of a transferee, if:

3 (A) the company does not have any members;

4 (B) the legal representative of the last person to
5 have been a member declines or fails to wind up the company's
6 activities; and

7 (C) within a reasonable time following the dissolution a
8 person has not been appointed pursuant to subsection (d) of this
9 section; or

10 (3) in connection with a proceeding under subdivision
11 (a) (4) or (5) of section 47 of this act.

12 Sec. 49. (ULLCA 703) (a) Except as otherwise provided
13 in subsection (d) of this section, a dissolved limited liability
14 company may give notice of a known claim under subsection (b) of
15 this section, which has the effect as provided in subsection (c) of
16 this section.

17 (b) A dissolved limited liability company may in a record
18 notify its known claimants of the dissolution. The notice must:

19 (1) specify the information required to be included in a
20 claim;

21 (2) provide a mailing address to which the claim is to be
22 sent;

23 (3) state the deadline for receipt of the claim, which
24 may not be less than one hundred twenty days after the date the
25 notice is received by the claimant; and

1 (4) state that the claim will be barred if not received
2 by the deadline.

3 (c) A claim against a dissolved limited liability company
4 is barred if the requirements of subsection (b) of this section are
5 met and:

6 (1) the claim is not received by the specified deadline;
7 or

8 (2) if the claim is timely received but rejected by the
9 company:

10 (A) the company causes the claimant to receive a notice
11 in a record stating that the claim is rejected and will be barred
12 unless the claimant commences an action against the company to
13 enforce the claim within ninety days after the claimant receives
14 the notice; and

15 (B) the claimant does not commence the required action
16 within the ninety days.

17 (d) This section does not apply to a claim based on
18 an event occurring after the effective date of dissolution or a
19 liability that on that date is contingent.

20 Sec. 50. (ULLCA 704) (a) A dissolved limited liability
21 company shall publish notice of its dissolution and request persons
22 having claims against the company to present them in accordance
23 with the notice.

24 (b) The notice required by subsection (a) of this section
25 must:

1 (1) be published three successive weeks in some legal
2 newspaper of general circulation in the county in this state in
3 which the dissolved limited liability company's principal office is
4 located or, if it has none in this state, in the county in which
5 the company's designated office is or was last located;

6 (2) describe the information required to be contained in
7 a claim and provide a mailing address to which the claim is to be
8 sent; and

9 (3) state that a claim against the company is barred
10 unless an action to enforce the claim is commenced within five

22 (3) a claimant whose claim is contingent at, or based on
23 an event occurring after, the effective date of dissolution.

24 (d) A claim not barred under this section may be
25 enforced:

1 (1) against a dissolved limited liability company, to the
2 extent of its undistributed assets; and

3 (2) if assets of the company have been distributed
4 after dissolution, against a member or transferee to the extent
5 of that person's proportionate share of the claim or of the
6 assets distributed to the member or transferee after dissolution,
7 whichever is less, but a person's total liability for all claims
8 under this subdivision does not exceed the total amount of assets
9 distributed to the person after dissolution.

10 Sec. 51. (ULLCA 705) (a) The Secretary of State may
11 dissolve a limited liability company administratively if the
12 company does not:

13 (1) pay, within sixty days after the due date, any fee,
14 tax, or penalty due to the Secretary of State under the Nebraska
15 Uniform Limited Liability Company Act or law other than the act; or

16 (2) deliver, within sixty days after the due date, its
17 biennial report to the Secretary of State.

18 (b) If the Secretary of State determines that a ground
19 exists for administratively dissolving a limited liability company,
20 the Secretary of State shall file a record of the determination and
21 serve the company with a copy of the filed record.

22 (c) If within sixty days after service of the copy
23 pursuant to subsection (b) of this section a limited liability
24 company does not correct each ground for dissolution or demonstrate
25 to the reasonable satisfaction of the Secretary of State that each

1 ground determined by the Secretary of State does not exist, the
2 Secretary of State shall dissolve the company administratively by
3 preparing, signing, and filing a declaration of dissolution that
4 states the grounds for dissolution. The Secretary of State shall

6 (d) A limited liability company that has been
7 administratively dissolved continues in existence but, subject to
8 section 52 of this act, may carry on only activities necessary to
9 wind up its activities and liquidate its assets under sections 48
10 and 54 of this act and to notify claimants under sections 49 and
11 50 of this act.

12 (e) The administrative dissolution of a limited liability
13 company does not terminate the authority of its agent for service
14 of process.

15 Sec. 52. (ULLCA 706) (a) A limited liability company that
16 has been administratively dissolved may apply to the Secretary of
17 State for reinstatement at any time after the effective date of
18 dissolution. The application must be delivered to the Secretary of
19 State for filing and state:

20 (1) the name of the company and the effective date of its
21 dissolution;

22 (2) that the grounds for dissolution did not exist or
23 have been eliminated; and

24 (3) that the company's name satisfies the requirements of
25 section 8 of this act.

1 (b) If the Secretary of State determines that an

12 Sec. 53. (ULLCA 707) (a) If the Secretary of State
13 rejects a limited liability company's application for reinstatement
14 following administrative dissolution, the Secretary of State shall
15 prepare, sign, and file a notice that explains the reason for
16 rejection and serve the company with a copy of the notice.

17 (b) Within thirty days after service of a notice of
18 rejection of reinstatement under subsection (a) of this section,
19 a limited liability company may appeal from the rejection by
20 petitioning the district court of Lancaster County to set aside
21 the dissolution. The petition must be served on the Secretary of

4 limited liability company must apply its assets to discharge its
5 obligations to creditors, including members that are creditors.

6 (b) After a limited liability company complies with
7 subsection (a) of this section, any surplus must be distributed
8 in the manner set forth in the operating agreement or, if not so
9 set forth, in the following order, subject, in any case, to any
10 charging order in effect under section 42 of this act:

11 (1) to each person owning a transferable interest
12 that reflects contributions made by a member and not previously
13 returned, an amount equal to the value of the unreturned
14 contributions; and

15 (2) in equal shares among members and dissociated
16 members, except to the extent necessary to comply with any transfer
17 effective under section 41 of this act.

18 (c) If a limited liability company does not have
19 sufficient surplus to comply with subdivision (b)(1) of this
20 section, any surplus must be distributed among the owners of
21 transferable interests in proportion to the value of their
22 respective unreturned contributions.

23 (d) All distributions made under subsections (b) and (c)
24 of this section must be paid in money.

25 Sec. 55. (ULLCA 801) (a) The law of the state or other

1 jurisdiction under which a foreign limited liability company is
2 formed governs:

3 (1) the internal affairs of the company; and
4 (2) the liability of a member as member and a manager
5 as manager for the debts, obligations, or other liabilities of the
6 company.

7 (b) A foreign limited liability company may not transact
8 business in this state until it qualifies with the Secretary of
9 State as provided in sections 56 and 58 of this act. A foreign
10 limited liability company may not be denied a certificate of
11 authority by reason of any difference between the law of the

14 (c) A certificate of authority does not authorize a

24 (1) the name of the company and, if the name does not
25 comply with section 8 of this act, an alternate name adopted

1 pursuant to subsection (a) of section 59 of this act;

2 (2) the name of the state or other jurisdiction under
3 whose law the company is formed;

4 (3) the street and mailing addresses of the company's
5 principal office and, if the law of the jurisdiction under which
6 the company is formed requires the company to maintain an office in
7 that jurisdiction, the street and mailing addresses of the required
8 office; and

9 (4) the name and street and mailing addresses and post
10 office box number, if any, of the company's initial agent for
11 service of process in this state.

12 (b) A foreign limited liability company shall deliver
13 with a completed application under subsection (a) of this section
14 a certificate of existence or a record of similar import signed
15 by the Secretary of State or other official having custody of the
16 company's publicly filed records in the state or other jurisdiction
17 under whose law the company is formed.

18 Sec. 57. (ULLCA 803) (a) Activities of a foreign limited
19 liability company which do not constitute transacting business in
20 this state within the meaning of sections 55 to 63 of this act
21 include:

22 (1) maintaining, defending, or settling an action or
23 proceeding;

24 (2) carrying on any activity concerning its internal
25 affairs, including holding meetings of its members or managers;

1 (3) maintaining accounts in financial institutions;

2 (4) maintaining offices or agencies for the transfer,
3 exchange, and registration of the company's own securities
4 or maintaining trustees or depositories with respect to those
5 securities;

6 (5) selling through independent contractors;

7 (6) soliciting or obtaining orders, whether by mail or
8 electronic means or through employees or agents or otherwise, if
9 the orders require acceptance outside this state before they become
10 contracts;

11 (7) creating or acquiring indebtedness, mortgages, or
12 security interests in real or personal property;

13 (8) securing or collecting debts or enforcing mortgages
14 or other security interests in property securing the debts and
15 holding, protecting, or maintaining property so acquired;

16 (9) conducting an isolated transaction that is completed
17 within thirty days and is not in the course of similar
18 transactions; and

19 (10) transacting business in interstate commerce.

20 (b) For purposes of sections 55 to 63 of this act,
21 the ownership in this state of income-producing real property or
22 tangible personal property, other than property excluded under
23 subsection (a) of this section, constitutes transacting business in
24 this state.

25 (c) This section does not apply in determining the

1 contacts or activities that may subject a foreign limited liability
2 company to service of process, taxation, or regulation under law
3 of this state other than the Nebraska Uniform Limited Liability
4 Company Act.

5 Sec. 58. (ULLCA 804) Unless the Secretary of State
6 determines that an application for a certificate of authority does
7 not comply with the filing requirements of the Nebraska Uniform
8 Limited Liability Company Act, the Secretary of State, upon payment
9 of all filing fees, shall file the application of a foreign
10 limited liability company, prepare, sign, and file a certificate of
11 authority to transact business in this state, and send a copy of
12 the filed certificate, together with a receipt for the fees, to the
13 company or its representative.

14 Sec. 59. (ULLCA 805) (a) A foreign limited liability

9 to this state. The amount remitted shall be allowed as a credit
10 against the Nebraska income tax liability of the shareholder or
11 member.

12 (6) The Tax Commissioner may allow a nonresident
13 individual shareholder or member to not file a Nebraska income
14 tax return if the nonresident individual shareholder's or member's
15 only source of Nebraska income was his or her share of the small
16 business corporation's or limited liability company's income which
17 was derived from or attributable to sources within this state, the
18 nonresident did not file an agreement to file a Nebraska income
19 tax return, and the small business corporation or limited liability
20 company has remitted the amount required by subsection (5) of this
21 section on behalf of such nonresident individual shareholder or
22 member. The amount remitted shall be retained in satisfaction of
23 the Nebraska income tax liability of the nonresident individual
24 shareholder or member.

25 (7) A small business corporation or limited liability

1 company return shall be filed only if one or more of the
2 shareholders of the corporation or members of the limited liability
3 company are not residents of the State of Nebraska or if such
4 corporation or limited liability company has income derived from
5 sources outside this state.

6 (8) For purposes of this section, any shareholder or
7 member of the corporation or limited liability company that is
8 a grantor trust of a nonresident shall be disregarded and this
9 section shall apply as though the nonresident grantor was the
10 shareholder or member.
