A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT relating to cities of the first class; to amend section
2	17-301, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change
3	and eliminate procedures and population requirements for
4	reorganization of cities of the first class as cities of
5	the second class; to require a plan to increase a city's
6	population; to repeal the original section; to outright
7	repeal section 17-305.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of
8	Nebraska; and to declare an emergency.
9	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 17-301, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 17-301 (1) Whenever any city of the first class decreases
- 4 in population until it has a population of less than five
- 5 thousand inhabitants but not less than four thousand five hundred
- 6 inhabitants, as ascertained and officially promulgated by the
- 7 federal decennial census, the mayor of any such city shall certify
- 8 such fact to the Secretary of State.
- 9 (2) Whenever any city of the first class decreases in
- 10 population until it has a population of less than four thousand
- 11 five hundred inhabitants but more than eight hundred inhabitants
- 12 as ascertained and officially promulgated by the federal decennial
- 13 census, the mayor of any such city shall certify such fact to the
- 14 Secretary of State.
- 15 (3) Whenever the Secretary of State receives a
- 16 certification pursuant to subsection (1) of this section from the
- 17 same city after two consecutive federal decennial censuses, he or
- 18 she shall declare such city to have become a city of the second
- 19 class as provided in section 17-305.
- 20 (4) Whenever the Secretary of State receives a
- 21 certification pursuant to subsection (2) of this section, he or she
- 22 shall declare such city to have become a city of the second class
- 23 as provided in section 17-305.
- 24 <u>(1) This section applies to cities of the first class</u>
- 25 whose population is less than five thousand inhabitants but more

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1 than eight hundred inhabitants according to the federal decennial

- 2 census conducted in the year 2010 or any subsequent federal
- 3 decennial census.
- 4 (2)(a) If a city of the first class has a population
- 5 of less than five thousand inhabitants but not less than four
- 6 thousand inhabitants, as ascertained and officially promulgated by
- 7 the most recent federal decennial census, the mayor of the city
- 8 shall certify such fact to the Secretary of State. If the mayor
- 9 and city council of the city determine that it is in the best
- 10 interests of such city to become a city of the second class, the
- 11 mayor and city council shall adopt an ordinance to that effect and
- 12 shall notify the Secretary of State and notice and a copy of such
- 13 ordinance shall accompany the certification. If the Secretary of
- 14 State receives such notification, he or she shall declare such city
- 15 to be a city of the second class. If the mayor and city council
- 16 <u>determine that it is in the best interests of such city to remain</u>
- 17 a city of the first class, they shall submit to the Secretary of
- 18 State, within nine years after the certification is required to
- 19 be submitted pursuant to this subdivision, an explanation of the
- 20 city's plan to increase the city's population.
- 21 (b) If a city of the first class has a population of
- 22 less than five thousand inhabitants but not less than four thousand
- 23 inhabitants, as ascertained and officially promulgated by the most
- 24 recent federal decennial census immediately following the census
- 25 referred to in subdivision (a) of this subsection, the mayor of

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1 the city shall certify such fact to the Secretary of State. If the

- 2 mayor and city council of the city determine that it is in the best
- 3 interests of such city to become a city of the second class, the
- 4 mayor and city council shall adopt an ordinance to that effect and
- 5 shall notify the Secretary of State and notice and a copy of such
- 6 ordinance shall accompany the certification. If the Secretary of
- 7 State receives such notification, he or she shall declare such city
- 8 to be a city of the second class.
- 9 (c) If a city of the first class has a population of
- 10 less than five thousand inhabitants but not less than four thousand
- 11 inhabitants, as ascertained and officially promulgated by the most
- 12 recent federal decennial census immediately following the census
- 13 referred to in subdivision (b) of this subsection, the mayor of
- 14 the city shall certify such fact to the Secretary of State. After
- 15 receipt of such certification, the Secretary of State shall declare
- such city to be a city of the second class.
- 17 (3) If a city of the first class has a population of
- 18 less than four thousand inhabitants but more than eight hundred
- 19 inhabitants, as ascertained and officially promulgated by the most
- 20 recent federal decennial census, the mayor of the city shall
- 21 certify such fact to the Secretary of State. After receipt of such
- 22 <u>certification</u>, the Secretary of State shall declare such city to be
- 23 a city of the second class.
- 24 (5) (4) Beginning on the date upon which a city becomes
- 25 a city of the second class pursuant to section 17-305, such city

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shall be governed by the provisions of the statutes of the State

- 2 of Nebraska laws of this state applicable to cities of the second
- 3 class.
- 4 Sec. 2. Original section 17-301, Reissue Revised Statutes
- 5 of Nebraska, is repealed.
- 6 Sec. 3. The following section is outright repealed:
- 7 Section 17-305.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska.
- 8 Sec. 4. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
- 9 when passed and approved according to law.
