# LEGISLATIVE BILL 219

### A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT relating to highways; to amend section 60-2132, Reissue
2	Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 60-6,267,
3	Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2008; to
4	transfer responsibility for the highway safety program,
5	including the child passenger restraint and occupation
6	protection systems information and education program,
7	to the Department of Roads as prescribed; to change
8	administration of the Motorcycle Safety Education Fund as
9	prescribed; to provide an operative date; to repeal the
10	original sections; and to declare an emergency.
11	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 60-6,267, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:
- 3 60-6,267 (1) Any person in Nebraska who drives any motor
- 4 vehicle which has or is required to have an occupant protection
- 5 system shall ensure that:
- 6 (a) All children up to six years of age being transported
- 7 by such vehicle use a child passenger restraint system of a type
- 8 which meets Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 213 as developed
- 9 by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, as such
- 10 standard existed on January 1, 2008, 2009, and which is correctly
- 11 installed in such vehicle; and
- 12 (b) All children six years of age and less than eighteen
- 13 years of age being transported by such vehicle use an occupant
- 14 protection system.
- 15 This subsection shall apply to every motor vehicle which
- 16 is equipped with an occupant protection system or is required to be
- 17 equipped with restraint systems pursuant to Federal Motor Vehicle
- 18 Safety Standard 208, as such standard existed on January 1, 2008,
- 19 2009, except taxicabs, mopeds, motorcycles, and any motor vehicle
- 20 designated by the manufacturer as a 1963 year model or earlier
- 21 which is not equipped with an occupant protection system.
- 22 (2) Whenever any licensed physician determines, through
- 23 accepted medical procedures, that use of a child passenger
- 24 restraint system by a particular child would be harmful by reason
- 25 of the child's weight, physical condition, or other medical reason,

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1 the provisions of subsection (1) of this section shall be waived.

- 2 The driver of any vehicle transporting such a child shall carry
- 3 on his or her person or in the vehicle a signed written statement
- 4 of the physician identifying the child and stating the grounds for
- 5 such waiver.
- 6 (3) The drivers of authorized emergency vehicles shall
- 7 not be subject to the requirements of subsection (1) of this
- 8 section when operating such authorized emergency vehicles pursuant
- 9 to their employment.
- 10 (4) A driver of a motor vehicle shall not be subject to
- 11 the requirements of subsection (1) of this section if the motor
- 12 vehicle is being operated in a parade or exhibition and the parade
- 13 or exhibition is being conducted in accordance with applicable
- 14 state law and local ordinances and resolutions.
- 15 (5) The Department of Motor Vehicles Roads shall develop
- 16 and implement an ongoing statewide public information and education
- 17 program regarding the use of child passenger restraint systems and
- 18 occupant protection systems and the availability of distribution
- 19 and discount programs for child passenger restraint systems.
- 20 (6) All persons being transported by a motor vehicle
- 21 operated by a holder of a provisional operator's permit or a school
- 22 permit shall use such motor vehicle's occupant protection system.
- Sec. 2. <u>Beginning on July 1, 2009</u>, the Department of
- 24 Roads shall assume responsibility for the powers and duties of the
- 25 highway safety program of the Department of Motor Vehicles, except

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1 that the Department of Motor Vehicles shall retain jurisdiction

- 2 over the Motorcycle Safety Education Act.
- 3 Sec. 3. Section 60-2132, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 4 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 5 60-2132 There is hereby created a Motorcycle Safety
- 6 Education Fund in the state treasury which shall consist of
- 7 money transferred pursuant to sections 39-2215 and 60-4,115 and
- 8 such money as may be appropriated by the Legislature. The fund
- 9 shall be administered under the highway safety program of by
- 10 the department. The fund shall be used for the administration
- 11 of the Motorcycle Safety Education Act, to reimburse approved
- 12 schools, businesses, or organizations for conducting approved basic
- 13 motorcycle safety courses, to provide educational assistance, to
- 14 prepare sites for offering the basic motorcycle safety course,
- 15 to reimburse approved schools, businesses, or organizations for
- 16 conducting approved advanced motorcycle safety courses, and to
- 17 promote motorcycle safety. Any money in the fund available for
- 18 investment shall be invested by the state investment officer
- 19 pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska
- 20 State Funds Investment Act.
- 21 Sec. 4. This act becomes operative on July 1, 2009.
- 22 Sec. 5. Original section 60-2132, Reissue Revised
- 23 Statutes of Nebraska, and section 60-6,267, Revised Statutes
- 24 Cumulative Supplement, 2008, are repealed.
- 25 Sec. 6. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect

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1 when passed and approved according to law.
