1	FOR AN	ACT relating to veterinary medicine and surgery; to
2		amend sections 38-1,140 and 38-3321, Reissue Revised
3		Statutes of Nebraska; to authorize health care profession
4		or occupation credential holders to consult with
5		veterinarians under certain conditions; and to repeal the
6		original sections.

7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 38-1,140, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 38-1,140 Any person who holds a valid credential in the State of Nebraska in a health care profession or occupation 4 5 regulated under the Uniform Credentialing Act may consult with a licensed veterinarian who has contracted with or is employed by an 6 7 accredited zoological park or garden regarding an animal on behalf 8 of such zoological park or garden or perform collaborative animal 9 health care tasks on an animal under the care of such veterinarian 10 for such zoological park or garden if all such tasks are performed 11 under the immediate supervision of such veterinarian. Engaging in 12 such conduct is hereby authorized and shall not be considered a 13 part of the credential holder's scope of practice or a violation of 14 the credential holder's scope of practice.

Sec. 2. Section 38-3321, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

17 38-3321 No person may practice veterinary medicine and
18 surgery in the state who is not a licensed veterinarian. The
19 Veterinary Medicine and Surgery Practice Act shall not be construed
20 to prohibit:

21 (1) An employee of the federal, state, or local
22 government from performing his or her official duties;

(2) A person who is a student in a veterinary school from
performing duties or actions assigned by his or her instructors
or from working under the direct supervision of a licensed

2 (3) A person who is a student in an approved veterinary 3 technician program from performing duties or actions assigned by his or her instructors or from working under the direct supervision 4 5 of a licensed veterinarian or a licensed veterinary technician; 6 (4) Any merchant or manufacturer from selling feed or 7 feeds whether medicated or nonmedicated; 8 (5) A veterinarian regularly licensed in another state 9 from consulting with a licensed veterinarian in this state; 10 (6) Any merchant or manufacturer from selling from his or 11 her established place of business medicines, appliances, or other 12 products used in the prevention or treatment of animal diseases 13 or any merchant or manufacturer's representative from conducting 14 educational meetings to explain the use of his or her products or 15 from investigating and advising on problems developing from the use 16 of his or her products;

17 (7) An owner of livestock or a bona fide farm or ranch 18 employee from performing any act of vaccination, surgery, pregnancy 19 testing, or the administration of drugs in the treatment of 20 domestic animals under his or her custody or ownership nor the 21 exchange of services between persons or bona fide employees who are 22 principally farm or ranch operators or employees in the performance 23 of these acts;

24 (8) A member of the faculty of a veterinary school
25 or veterinary science department from performing his or her

1 regular functions, or a person lecturing or giving instructions 2 or demonstrations at a veterinary school or veterinary science 3 department or in connection with a continuing competency activity; (9) Any person from selling or applying any pesticide, 4 5 insecticide, or herbicide; 6 (10) Any person from engaging in bona fide scientific 7 research which reasonably requires experimentation involving 8 animals; 9 (11) Any person from treating or in any manner caring for 10 domestic chickens, turkeys, or waterfowl, which are specifically 11 exempted from the Veterinary Medicine and Surgery Practice Act; 12 (12) Any person from performing dehorning or castrating 13 livestock, not to include equidae. For purposes of the Veterinary Medicine and Surgery 14 15 Practice Act, castration shall be limited to the removal or 16 destruction of male testes; or 17 (13) Any person who holds a valid credential in the 18 State of Nebraska in a health care profession or occupation 19 regulated under the Uniform Credentialing Act from consulting 20 with a licensed veterinarian who has contracted with or is 21 employed by an accredited zoological park or garden regarding 22 an animal on behalf of such zoological park or garden or performing 23 collaborative animal health care tasks on an animal under the care 24 of such veterinarian for such zoological park or garden if all 25 such tasks are performed under the immediate supervision of such
