A BILL

1 FOR AN ACT relating to crimes and offenses; to amend section  
2 28-101, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2009; to provide  
3 restrictions for sexual predators; to define terms;  
4 to provide penalties; and harmonize provisions; and to  
5 repeal the original section.

6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1           Section 1. Section 28-101, Revised Statutes Supplement,  
2 2009, is amended to read:

3           28-101 Sections 28-101 to 28-1356 and section 2 of this  
4 act shall be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Criminal Code.

5           Sec. 2. (1) A sexual predator shall not:

6           (a) Be present in a school, on school grounds, or at  
7 a school-sponsored activity or school-sponsored athletic event  
8 without the written permission of the principal of the school or  
9 his or her designee or, if more than one school is involved, the  
10 written permission of the principal of each school involved or his  
11 or her designee; or

12           (b) Be present on or in any vehicle or other conveyance  
13 owned, leased, or contracted by a school without the written  
14 permission of the principal of the school or his or her designee  
15 when the vehicle is in use to transport students to or from a  
16 school or school-sponsored activity or school-sponsored athletic  
17 event, unless the vehicle is simultaneously made available to the  
18 public as a form of public transportation.

19           (2) For purposes of this section:

20           (a) School means a public, private, denominational, or  
21 parochial school; and

22           (b) Sexual predator means an individual who is required  
23 to register under the Sex Offender Registration Act, who has  
24 committed an aggravated offense as defined in section 29-4001.01,  
25 and who has victimized a person eighteen years of age or younger.

1                   (3) A sexual predator violating this section is guilty of  
2 a Class I misdemeanor.

3                   Sec. 3. Original section 28-101, Revised Statutes  
4 Supplement, 2009, is repealed.
