A BILL

1 FOR AN ACT relating to elections; to amend sections 32-101, 32-312,  
2 32-312.05, 32-318.01, 32-321, 32-323, 32-325, 32-902,  
3 32-914, and 32-915, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,  
4 and section 60-484.02, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2009;  
5 to provide for voter registration on the Secretary of  
6 State's web site; to harmonize provisions; to provide an  
7 operative date; and to repeal the original sections.  
8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1           Section 1. Section 32-101, Reissue Revised Statutes of  
2 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3           32-101 Sections 32-101 to 32-1551 and section 2 of this  
4 act shall be known and may be cited as the Election Act.

5           Sec. 2. (1) The Secretary of State shall prescribe a  
6 registration application which may be used statewide to register  
7 to vote and update voter registration records electronically using  
8 the Secretary of State's web site. An applicant who has a valid  
9 Nebraska motor vehicle operator's license or state identification  
10 card may use the application to register to vote or to update  
11 his or her voter registration record with changes in his or  
12 her personal information or other information related to his or  
13 her eligibility to vote. For each electronic application, the  
14 Secretary of State shall obtain a copy of the applicant's digital  
15 signature from the Department of Motor Vehicle's records of his or  
16 her motor vehicle operator's license or state identification card  
17 for purposes of voter registration and forward the signature  
18 to the election commissioner or county clerk. The Secretary  
19 of State may employ additional security measures to ensure the  
20 accuracy and integrity of voter registration applications submitted  
21 electronically. Every election commissioner or county clerk shall  
22 accept such an application for registration.

23           (2) The application shall contain substantially all  
24 the information provided in section 32-312 and the following  
25 informational statements:

1           (a) An applicant who submits this application  
2 electronically is affirming that the information in the application  
3 is true. Any applicant who submits this application electronically  
4 knowing that any of the information in the application is false  
5 shall be guilty of a Class IV felony under section 32-1502 of the  
6 statutes of Nebraska. The penalty for a Class IV felony is up to  
7 five years imprisonment, a fine of up to ten thousand dollars, or  
8 both;

9           (b) An applicant who submits this application  
10 electronically is agreeing to the use of his or her digital  
11 signature from the Department of Motor Vehicle's records of his or  
12 her motor vehicle operator's license or state identification card  
13 for purposes of voter registration;

14           (c) If the application is submitted electronically and  
15 the applicant is registering in the state for the first time and  
16 has not previously voted within the state, the applicant must  
17 submit a copy of a photo identification which is current and valid  
18 or a copy of a utility bill, bank statement, government check,  
19 paycheck, or other government document that is current and that  
20 shows the name and address of the applicant as they appear on the  
21 application when voting for the first time;

22           (d) To vote at the polling place on election day, the  
23 completed application must be submitted electronically on or before  
24 the third Friday before the election; and

25           (e) The election commissioner or county clerk will, upon

1 receipt of the application for registration, send an acknowledgment  
2 of registration to the applicant indicating whether the application  
3 is proper or not.

4           Sec. 3. Section 32-312, Reissue Revised Statutes of  
5 Nebraska, is amended to read:

6           32-312 The registration application prescribed by the  
7 Secretary of State pursuant to section 32-311.01 or section 2 of  
8 this act shall provide the instructional statements and request the  
9 information from the applicant as provided in this section.

10           CITIZENSHIP—"Are you a citizen of the United States of  
11 America?" with boxes to check to indicate whether the applicant is  
12 or is not a citizen of the United States.

13           AGE—"Are you at least eighteen years of age or will you  
14 be eighteen years of age on or before the first Tuesday following  
15 the first Monday of November of this year?" with boxes to check to  
16 indicate whether or not the applicant will be eighteen years of age  
17 or older on election day.

18           WARNING—"If you checked 'no' in response to either of  
19 these questions, do not complete this application.".

20           NAME—the name of the applicant giving the first and last  
21 name in full, the middle name in full or the middle initial, and  
22 the maiden name of the applicant, if applicable.

23           RESIDENCE—the name and number of the street, avenue, or  
24 other location of the dwelling where the applicant resides if there  
25 is a number. If the registrant resides in a hotel, apartment,

1 tenement house, or institution, such additional information shall  
2 be included as will give the exact location of such registrant's  
3 place of residence. If the registrant lives in an incorporated or  
4 unincorporated area not identified by the use of roads, road names,  
5 or house numbers, the registrant shall state the section, township,  
6 and range of his or her residence and the corporate name of the  
7 school district as described in section 79-405 in which he or she  
8 is located.

9           POSTAL ADDRESS—the address at which the applicant  
10 receives mail if different from the residence address.

11           ADDRESS OF LAST REGISTRATION—the name and number of the  
12 street, avenue, or other location of the dwelling from which the  
13 applicant last registered.

14           TELEPHONE NUMBERS—the telephone number of the applicant  
15 at work and at home. At the request of the applicant, a designation  
16 shall be made that the telephone number is an unlisted number,  
17 and such designation shall preclude the listing of the applicant's  
18 telephone number on any list of voter registrations.

19           DRIVER'S LICENSE NUMBER OR LAST FOUR DIGITS OF SOCIAL  
20 SECURITY NUMBER—if the applicant has a Nebraska driver's license,  
21 the license number, and if the applicant does not have a Nebraska  
22 driver's license, the last four digits of the applicant's social  
23 security number.

24           DATE OF APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION—the month, day,  
25 and year when the applicant presented himself or herself for

1 registration, ~~or~~ when the applicant completed and signed the  
 2 registration application if the application was submitted by mail  
 3 or delivered to the election official by the applicant's personal  
 4 messenger or personal agent, or when the application was submitted  
 5 if the registration application was completed electronically.

6 PLACE OF BIRTH—show the state, country, kingdom, empire,  
 7 or dominion where the applicant was born.

8 DATE OF BIRTH—show the date of the applicant's birth.  
 9 The applicant shall be at least eighteen years of age or attain  
 10 eighteen years of age on or before the first Tuesday after the  
 11 first Monday in November to have the right to register and vote in  
 12 any election in the present calendar year.

13 REGISTRATION TAKEN BY—show the signature of the  
 14 authorized official or staff member accepting the application  
 15 pursuant to section 32-309 or 32-310 or at least one of the deputy  
 16 registrars taking the application pursuant to section 32-306, if  
 17 applicable.

18 PARTY AFFILIATION—show the party affiliation of the  
 19 applicant as Democrat, Republican, or Other ..... or show  
 20 no party affiliation as Nonpartisan. (Note: If you wish to vote in  
 21 both partisan and nonpartisan primary elections for state and local  
 22 offices, you must indicate a political party affiliation on the  
 23 registration application. If you register without a political party  
 24 affiliation (nonpartisan), you will receive only the nonpartisan  
 25 ballots for state and local offices at primary elections. If you

1 register without a political party affiliation, you may vote in  
2 partisan primary elections for congressional offices.)

3 OTHER-information the Secretary of State determines will  
4 assist in the proper and accurate registration of the voter.

5 Immediately following the spaces for inserting  
6 information as provided in this section, the following statement  
7 shall be printed:

8 To the best of my knowledge and belief, I declare under  
9 penalty of election falsification that:

10 (1) I live in the State of Nebraska at the address  
11 provided in this application;

12 (2) I have not been convicted of a felony or, if  
13 convicted, it has been at least two years since I completed my  
14 sentence for the felony, including any parole term;

15 (3) I have not been officially found to be non compos  
16 mentis (mentally incompetent); and

17 (4) I am a citizen of the United States.

18 Any registrant who signs this application knowing that  
19 any of the information in the application is false shall be guilty  
20 of a Class IV felony under section 32-1502 of the statutes of  
21 Nebraska. The penalty for a Class IV felony is up to five years  
22 imprisonment, a fine of up to ten thousand dollars, or both.

23 APPLICANT'S SIGNATURE-require the applicant to affix his  
24 or her signature to the application.

25 Sec. 4. Section 32-312.05, Reissue Revised Statutes of

1 Nebraska, is amended to read:

2           32-312.05 The date that a person's voter registration  
3 record or an update of his or her voter registration record becomes  
4 effective is the date the person presented himself or herself  
5 in person to register, the date the registration application  
6 was delivered to the election commissioner or county clerk,  
7 or the date the registration application was received by the  
8 election commissioner or county clerk if the person submitted the  
9 registration application by mail or electronically.

10           Sec. 5. Section 32-318.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of  
11 Nebraska, is amended to read:

12           32-318.01 (1)(a) Except as provided by subsection (2)  
13 of this section, a person who registers to vote electronically  
14 or by mail after January 1, 2003, and has not previously voted  
15 in an election within the state shall present a photographic  
16 identification which is current and valid or a copy of a  
17 utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or  
18 other government document which is dated within the sixty days  
19 immediately prior to the date of presentation and which shows  
20 the same name and residence address of the person provided on  
21 the registration application in order to avoid identification  
22 requirements at the time of voting pursuant to section 32-914 or  
23 32-947.

24           (b) Such documentation may be presented at the time of  
25 application for registration, after submission of the application



1 for registration, or at the time of voting. The documentation must  
2 be received by the election commissioner or county clerk not later  
3 than 6 p.m. on the second Friday preceding the election to avoid  
4 additional identification requirements at the time of voting at  
5 the polling place if the voter votes in person. If the voter is  
6 voting using a ballot for early voting, the documentation must be  
7 received by the election commissioner or county clerk prior to the  
8 date on which the ballot is mailed to the voter to avoid additional  
9 identification requirements at the time of voting. Documentation  
10 received after the ballot has been mailed to the voter but not  
11 later than 8 p.m. on election day will be considered timely for  
12 purposes of determining the applicant's eligibility to vote in the  
13 election.

14 (c) Such documentation may be presented in person, by  
15 mail, or by facsimile transmission.

16 (d) Failure to present such documentation may result in  
17 the ballot not being counted pursuant to verification procedures  
18 prescribed in sections 32-1002 and 32-1027.

19 (2) A person who registers to vote electronically or  
20 by mail after January 1, 2003, and has not previously voted in  
21 an election within the state shall not be required to present  
22 identification if he or she:

23 (a) Has provided his or her Nebraska driver's license  
24 number or the last four digits of his or her social security number  
25 and the election commissioner or county clerk verifies the number

1 provided pursuant to subsection (2) of section 32-312.03;

2 (b) Is a member of the armed forces of the United States  
3 who by reason of active duty is absent from his or her place of  
4 residence where the member is otherwise eligible to vote;

5 (c) Is a member of the United States Merchant Marine who  
6 by reason of service is away from his or her place of residence  
7 where the member is otherwise eligible to vote;

8 (d) Is a spouse or dependent of a member of the armed  
9 forces of the United States or United States Merchant Marine who  
10 is absent from his or her place of residence due to the service of  
11 that member;

12 (e) Resides outside the United States and but for such  
13 residence would be qualified to vote in the state if the state was  
14 the last place in which the person was domiciled before leaving the  
15 United States; or

16 (f) Is elderly or handicapped and has requested to vote  
17 by alternative means other than by casting a ballot at his or her  
18 polling place on election day.

19 Sec. 6. Section 32-321, Reissue Revised Statutes of  
20 Nebraska, is amended to read:

21 32-321 (1) Any elector may request a voter registration  
22 application from the office of the Secretary of State or the  
23 election commissioner or county clerk. The Secretary of State and  
24 the election commissioner or county clerk shall make registration  
25 applications prescribed by the Secretary of State available and may

1 place the applications in public places. The Secretary of State  
2 and the election commissioner or county clerk may require that all  
3 unused applications be returned to his or her office and may place  
4 reasonable limits on the amount of applications requested.

5 (2) If an elector returns the completed application to  
6 the office of the Secretary of State or submits an application to  
7 the Secretary of State electronically, the office shall deliver the  
8 application to the election commissioner or county clerk of the  
9 county in which the elector resides not later than ten days after  
10 receipt by the office, except that if the application is returned  
11 to the office or submitted electronically within five days prior  
12 to the third Friday preceding any election, it shall be delivered  
13 not later than five days after the date it is returned. The  
14 deadline for returning a completed application to the office of the  
15 Secretary of State or submitting an application electronically is  
16 the close of business on the third Friday preceding an election to  
17 be registered to vote at such election. A registration application  
18 received after the deadline shall not be processed by the election  
19 commissioner or county clerk until after the election. The office  
20 of the Secretary of State shall be a designated voter registration  
21 agency for purposes of section 7 of the National Voter Registration  
22 Act of 1993, 42 U.S.C. 1973gg-5, as such section existed on March  
23 11, 2008.

24 (3) If an elector mails the registration application to  
25 the election commissioner or county clerk:

1           (a) (i) The application shall be postmarked on or before  
2 the third Friday before the next election; or

3           (ii) The application shall be received not later than  
4 the second Tuesday before the next election if the postmark is  
5 unreadable; and

6           (b) The application shall be processed by the election  
7 office as a proper registration for the voter to be entitled to  
8 vote on the day of the next election.

9           (4) If the registration application arrives after the  
10 registration deadline, the application shall not be processed  
11 until after the election. Written notice shall be given to  
12 any applicant whose registration application failed to meet the  
13 registration deadline or was found to be incorrect or incomplete  
14 and shall state the specific reason for rejection. If the  
15 application is incomplete, the election commissioner or county  
16 clerk shall notify the applicant of the failure to provide the  
17 required information, including failure to provide identification  
18 if required, and provide the applicant with the opportunity to  
19 submit an identification document as described in section 32-318.01  
20 prior to the deadline for voter registration or to complete and  
21 submit a corrected registration application in a timely manner to  
22 allow for the proper registration of the applicant prior to the  
23 next election. All postage costs related to returning registration  
24 applications to the election commissioner or county clerk shall be  
25 paid by the registrant.

1           Sec. 7. Section 32-323, Reissue Revised Statutes of  
2 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3           32-323 (1) Registration by mail shall not constitute a  
4 valid registration for purposes of signing any type of petition  
5 requiring the validation of the signatures of registered voters  
6 until a complete and correct registration application has been  
7 received by the election commissioner or county clerk. A signature  
8 on a petition shall be considered a valid signature as of the  
9 date that the election commissioner or county clerk receives the  
10 registration application of the registrant.

11           (2) Submitting a registration application electronically  
12 shall not constitute a valid registration for purposes of signing  
13 any type of petition requiring the validation of the signatures  
14 of registered voters until a complete and correct registration  
15 application has been received by the election commissioner or  
16 county clerk. A signature on a petition shall be considered a valid  
17 signature as of the date that the election commissioner or county  
18 clerk receives the registration application and digital signature  
19 of the registrant.

20           Sec. 8. Section 32-325, Reissue Revised Statutes of  
21 Nebraska, is amended to read:

22           32-325 (1) A registration application completed and  
23 signed by a registered voter seeking to update his or her voter  
24 registration record shall be completed in person at or delivered or  
25 mailed to the office of the election commissioner or county clerk

1 or submitted electronically to the Secretary of State. To avoid  
2 additional requirements at the polling place pursuant to section  
3 32-914.01, 32-914.02, or 32-915, an application to update a voter  
4 registration record must be:

5 (a) Completed or delivered by the applicant in person  
6 at the office of the election commissioner or county clerk on or  
7 before the deadline prescribed in section 32-302; or

8 (b) Delivered by a personal messenger or personal agent  
9 or submitted electronically or mailed so that it is received by  
10 the election commissioner or county clerk on or before the deadline  
11 prescribed in section 32-321.

12 (2) After verifying the signature on the previous  
13 registration of the registered voter, the election commissioner or  
14 county clerk shall make the change of name, party affiliation,  
15 or address on all pertinent election records. The election  
16 commissioner or county clerk shall send an acknowledgment card to  
17 the registered voter indicating that the change of registration  
18 has been completed and shall include the address of the registered  
19 voter's new polling place.

20 Sec. 9. Section 32-902, Reissue Revised Statutes of  
21 Nebraska, is amended to read:

22 32-902 (1) The election commissioner or county clerk  
23 shall cause instructions for the guidance of registered voters in  
24 preparing their ballots to be printed in large, clear type on  
25 cards in English. He or she shall furnish at least five such cards

1 to each polling place in each precinct at the same time and in  
2 the same manner as the printed ballots. The judges or clerks of  
3 election shall post such cards in each voting booth on the day of  
4 election. The card shall contain full instructions on preparing and  
5 casting ballots, including how to cast a write-in vote. The form  
6 and contents of the cards shall be approved by the Secretary of  
7 State.

8 (2) The election commissioner or county clerk shall cause  
9 voting information to be posted in each polling place on the day  
10 of election. The voting information shall include the following  
11 information as approved by the Secretary of State:

12 (a) Information regarding the date of the election and  
13 the hours during which polling places will be open;

14 (b) Instructions for voters who registered to vote  
15 electronically or by mail and first-time voters;

16 (c) General information on voting rights under applicable  
17 federal and state laws, including information on the right of an  
18 individual to cast a provisional ballot and instructions on how to  
19 contact the appropriate officials if these rights are alleged to  
20 have been violated; and

21 (d) General information on federal and state laws  
22 regarding prohibitions on acts of fraud and misrepresentation.

23 Sec. 10. Section 32-914, Reissue Revised Statutes of  
24 Nebraska, is amended to read:

25 32-914 (1) Official ballots shall be used at all

1 elections. No person shall receive a ballot or be entitled to  
2 vote unless and until he or she is registered as a voter except  
3 as provided in section 32-914.01, 32-914.02, 32-915, 32-915.01, or  
4 32-936.

5 (2) Except as otherwise specifically provided, no ballot  
6 shall be handed to any voter at any election until:

7 (a) He or she announces his or her name and address to  
8 the clerk of election;

9 (b) The clerk has found that he or she is a registered  
10 voter at the address as shown by the precinct list of registered  
11 voters unless otherwise entitled to vote in the precinct under  
12 section 32-328, 32-914.01, 32-914.02, 32-915, or 32-915.01;

13 (c) The voter has presented a photographic identification  
14 which is current and valid at the time of the election, or a  
15 copy of a utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check,  
16 or other government document which is current at the time of the  
17 election and which shows the same name and residence address of the  
18 voter that is on the precinct list of registered voters, if the  
19 voter registered electronically or if the voter registered by mail  
20 after January 1, 2003, and has not previously voted in an election  
21 for a federal office within the county and if a notation appears  
22 on the precinct list of registered voters that the voter has not  
23 previously presented identification to the election commissioner or  
24 county clerk;

25 (d) As instructed by the clerk of election, the



1 registered voter has personally written his or her name (i) in the  
2 precinct sign-in register on the appropriate line which follows  
3 the last signature of any previous voter or (ii) in the combined  
4 document containing the precinct list of registered voters and the  
5 sign-in register; and

6 (e) The clerk has listed on the precinct list of  
7 registered voters the corresponding line number and name of the  
8 registered voter or has listed the name of the voter in a separate  
9 book as provided in section 32-913.

10 Sec. 11. Section 32-915, Reissue Revised Statutes of  
11 Nebraska, is amended to read:

12 32-915 (1) A person whose name does not appear on the  
13 precinct list of registered voters at the polling place for the  
14 precinct in which he or she resides or whose name appears with a  
15 notation that he or she received a ballot for early voting may vote  
16 a provisional ballot if he or she:

17 (a) Claims that he or she is a registered voter who has  
18 continuously resided in the county in which the precinct is located  
19 since registering to vote;

20 (b) Is not entitled to vote under section 32-914.01 or  
21 32-914.02;

22 (c) Has not registered to vote or voted in any other  
23 county since registering to vote in the county in which the  
24 precinct is located;

25 (d) Has appeared to vote at the polling place for the

1 precinct to which the person would be assigned based on his or her  
2 residence address; and

3 (e) Completes and signs a registration application before  
4 voting.

5 (2) A voter whose name appears on the precinct list  
6 of registered voters for the polling place with a notation  
7 that the voter is required to present identification pursuant  
8 to section 32-318.01 but fails to present identification may vote a  
9 provisional ballot if he or she completes and signs a registration  
10 application before voting.

11 (3) Each person voting by provisional ballot shall  
12 enclose his or her ballot in an envelope marked Provisional  
13 Ballot and shall, by signing the certification on the front of the  
14 envelope or a separate form attached to the envelope, certify to  
15 the following facts:

16 (a) I am a registered voter in ..... County;

17 (b) My name did not appear on the precinct list of  
18 registered voters;

19 (c) I registered to vote on or about this date  
20 .....

21 (d) I registered to vote  
22 .... in person at the election office or a voter  
23 registration site,  
24 .... by mail,  
25 .... electronically,

1           .... on a form through the Department of Motor Vehicles,  
 2           .... on a form through another state agency,  
 3           .... in some other way;

4           (e) I have not resided outside of this county or voted  
 5 outside of this county since registering to vote in this county;

6           (f) My current address is shown on the registration  
 7 application completed as a requirement for voting by provisional  
 8 ballot; and

9           (g) I am eligible to vote in this election and I have not  
 10 voted and will not vote in this election except by this ballot.

11           (4) The voter shall sign the certification under penalty  
 12 of election falsification. The following statements shall be on  
 13 the front of the envelope or on the attached form: By signing the  
 14 front of this envelope or the attached form you are certifying to  
 15 the information contained on this envelope or the attached form  
 16 under penalty of election falsification. Election falsification  
 17 is a Class IV felony and may be punished by up to five years  
 18 imprisonment, a fine of up to ten thousand dollars, or both.

19           (5) If the person's name does not appear on the precinct  
 20 list of registered voters for the polling place and the judge or  
 21 clerk of election determines that the person's residence address is  
 22 located in another precinct within the same county, the judge or  
 23 clerk of election shall direct the person to his or her correct  
 24 polling place to vote.

25           Sec. 12. Section 60-484.02, Revised Statutes Supplement,

1 2009, is amended to read:

2           60-484.02 (1) Each applicant for an operator's license  
3 or state identification card shall have his or her digital image  
4 taken. Digital images shall be preserved for use as prescribed in  
5 sections 60-4,119, 60-4,151, and 60-4,180. The images shall be used  
6 for issuing operators' licenses and state identification cards. The  
7 images may be retrieved only by the Department of Motor Vehicles  
8 for issuing renewal, duplicate, and replacement operators' licenses  
9 and state identification cards and may not be otherwise released  
10 except in accordance with subsection (3) of this section.

11           (2) Upon application for an operator's license or  
12 state identification card, each applicant shall provide his  
13 or her signature in a form prescribed by the department.  
14 Digital signatures shall be preserved for use on original,  
15 renewal, duplicate, and replacement operators' licenses and state  
16 identification cards and may not be otherwise released except in  
17 accordance with subsection ~~(3)~~ (4) of this section.

18           (3) No officer, employee, agent, or contractor of the  
19 department or a law enforcement officer shall release a digital  
20 image ~~or a digital signature~~ except to a federal, state, or  
21 local law enforcement agency, a certified law enforcement officer  
22 employed in an investigative position by a state or federal agency,  
23 or a driver licensing agency of another state for the purpose  
24 of carrying out the functions of the agency or assisting another  
25 agency in carrying out its functions upon the verification of the

1 identity of the person requesting the release of the information  
2 and the verification of the purpose of the requester in requesting  
3 the release. Any officer, employee, agent, or contractor of the  
4 department or law enforcement officer that knowingly discloses  
5 or knowingly permits disclosure of a digital image ~~or digital~~  
6 ~~signature~~ in violation of this section shall be guilty of a Class  
7 I misdemeanor.

8 (4) No officer, employee, agent, or contractor of the  
9 department, law enforcement officer, or employee or official in the  
10 office of the Secretary of State shall release a digital signature  
11 except to a federal, state, or local law enforcement agency, a  
12 certified law enforcement officer employed in an investigative  
13 position by a state or federal agency, a driver licensing agency  
14 of another state, the office of the Secretary of State, or the  
15 office of an election commissioner or county clerk for the purpose  
16 of carrying out the functions of the agency or assisting another  
17 agency in carrying out its functions upon the verification of the  
18 identity of the person requesting the release of the information  
19 and the verification of the purpose of the requester in requesting  
20 the release. Any officer, employee, agent, or contractor of the  
21 department, law enforcement officer, or employee or official in  
22 the office of the Secretary of State that knowingly discloses or  
23 knowingly permits disclosure of a digital signature in violation of  
24 this section shall be guilty of a Class I misdemeanor.
