## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Under the current Liquor Control Act, a person from another state can apply for a direct shippers license (S1) to ship directly to a customer. Currently, the application fee of \$500 (estimated \$132,000 fy 2012-2013) for this license will go to the Winery and Grape Producers Promotional Fund until April 30, 2012. LB 286 would eliminate the sunset date and the fee would go to the Winery and Grape Producers Promotional Fund indefinitely.
