A child victim of sexual assault would have 12 years after the cause of action accrues to file the lawsuit. Under current law, the victim would have four years from the time he or she reaches the age of 21 to file the lawsuit. **Explanation of amendments:** Committee Amendment AM 789 would clarify the intent of the bill by providing that the victim would have 12 years after their 21st birthday to file the lawsuit.
