## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 740 authorizes a special permit for livestock forage vehicles to exceed length restrictions and includes drop deck trailers within the definition of such a vehicle.

The bill amends sec. 60-3,111 to create a special permit for a truck-tractor and semitrailer combination, owned by a farmer or rancher, that is used to carry a load of hay no longer than 59 feet. The permit shall be carried on the vehicle, and shall be \$50.

The bill amends sec. 60-6,290 to change the exemption for a livestock forage vehicle from the standard length restrictions. The exemption no longer would be limited to unbaled loads.

The bill amends sec. 60-6,305 to include a drop deck trailer attached to a livestock forage vehicle within the definition of such a vehicle.

## **Explanation of amendments:**

The committee amendment, AM 2212, strikes the original sections and becomes the bill. The amendment inserts a new provision into sec. 60-6,290 so that a truck-tractor with a semitrailer carrying livestock forage can attain a maximum

length of 59 feet and 6 inches (including load).
