Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Legislative Bill 996 would amend section 79-201 by deleting the provision allowing a parent or guardian to sign a notarized release discontinuing the enrollment of a child who has reached the age of 16, but not 18. With that change, compulsory education would end when a child reaches 18, graduates from high school, or completes a program of instruction offered by a school which elects not to meet accreditation or approval requirements. The measure contains an emergency clause.
