This bill moves back to December 1, 2011 an existing requirement that the Department of Health and Human Services provide notice to the Legislature prior to adoption and promulgation of proposed rules and regulations under the Medicaid Program regarding the following: 1) premiums, co-payments and deductibles, and 2) limits on amount, scope and duration of goods and services.

The intent of this bill is to allow the department to implement increased co-payments as it is thought that notice per the existing statute was not provided. Increased co-payments were identified in the budget request to the Legislature and notice to the Legislature is not prescriptive in the statute. The budget request could be considered notice. The projected savings in the budget request are $\$ 449,703$ ( $\$ 179,881$ GF and $\$ 269,822$ FF) in FY 12 and FY 13. The Governor in his budget recommendations to the Legislature showed a higher amount of savings for increased co-payments at $\$ 652,316$ ( $\$ 262,927 \mathrm{GF}$ and $\$ 391,389 \mathrm{FF}$ ) in FY 12 and $\$ 869,754$ ( $\$ 347,902 \mathrm{GF}$ and $\$ 521,852 \mathrm{FF}$ ) in FY 13 .

The scope of this bill is much broader than co-payments and would allow reductions or restriction to be placed on amount, scope and duration of goods and services without notice to the Legislature during 2011. It could result in further savings that have not been identified.


Explanation of Estimate:
Technically, there is no fiscal impact to the Department of Health and Human Services for changing the report due date. However, this bill would enable DHHS to implement the following copals during FY2011-2012, as shown in the Governor's Budget. (The Governor's Budget shows the entire savings under Program 348, but some savings would actually accrue to Program 038.) Due to implementation and payment lag, the FY12 estimate is for $75 \%$ of the year, and the FY13 estimate is for the full year.
