This bill, as amended by AM1447, would authorize court-ordered conditions for dispositions under the Nebraska Juvenile Code.

In 2011, the Supreme Court stated that this bill could have a cash fund impact, but the amount of any impact is not known at this time. In a phone conversation regarding AM1447, the Supreme Court stated that the amendment did not change the potential cash fund impact. Their 2011 response follows:

The Office of Probation Administration states that section 1 and 2 of the bill could have a cash fund impact. Section 1 allows the courts to order a juvenile to participate in non-probation based programs or services and to pay certain fees. Section 2 allows the courts to have juveniles pay for the cost of electronic monitoring. As a result, cash fund revenues and expenditures could increase but the amount of any increase is not known at this time.

IMPACT ON POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS: During Floor Debate in the 2011 Session, it was noted that this bill may impact counties. Therefore, the Legislative Fiscal Office sent this amended bill to Lancaster and Douglas Counties. As of January 4, 2012, no response has been received from either county.
