A BILL

1 FOR AN ACT relating to the Motorcycle Safety Education Act; to amend
 2 sections 39-2215, 60-4,115, 60-4,127, 60-2120, 60-2121,
 3 60-2125, 60-2126, 60-2127, 60-2128, 60-2129, 60-2130,
 4 60-2131, and 60-2139, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 5 Nebraska; to eliminate a fund; to eliminate funding and
 6 grants to motorcycle instructors and motorcycle courses;
 7 to change provisions relating to regulation of motorcycle
 8 safety instructors, motorcycle trainers, and motorcycle
 9 safety courses; to change and provide powers and duties
 10 for the Department of Motor Vehicles and the Director of
 11 Motor Vehicles; to harmonize provisions; to provide an
 12 operative date; to repeal the original sections; and to
 13 outright repeal sections 60-2132, 60-2133, 60-2134,
 14 60-2135, 60-2136, 60-2137, and 60-2138, Reissue Revised
 15 Statutes of Nebraska.

16 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 39-2215, Reissue Revised Statutes of
2 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 39-2215 (1) There is hereby created in the state treasury
4 a special fund to be known as the Highway Trust Fund.

5 (2) All funds credited to the Highway Trust Fund pursuant
6 to sections 66-489.02, 66-499, 66-4,140, 66-4,147, 66-6,108, and
7 66-6,109.02, and related penalties and interest, shall be allocated
8 as provided in such sections.

9 (3) All other motor vehicle fuel taxes, diesel fuel
10 taxes, compressed fuel taxes, and alternative fuel taxes related to
11 highway use retained by the state, all motor vehicle registration
12 fees retained by the state other than those fees credited to the
13 State Recreation Road Fund pursuant to subdivision (3) of section
14 60-3,156, and other highway-user taxes imposed by state law and
15 allocated to the Highway Trust Fund, except for the proceeds of the
16 sales and use taxes derived from motor vehicles, trailers, and
17 semitrailers credited to the fund pursuant to section 77-27,132, are
18 hereby irrevocably pledged for the terms of the bonds issued prior to
19 January 1, 1988, to the payment of the principal, interest, and
20 redemption premium, if any, of such bonds as they mature and become
21 due at maturity or prior redemption and for any reserves therefor and
22 shall, as received by the State Treasurer, be deposited in the fund
23 for such purpose.

24 (4) Of the money in the fund specified in subsection (3)
25 of this section which is not required for the use specified in such

1 subsection, (a) ~~an amount equal to three dollars times the number of~~
2 ~~motorcycles registered during the previous month shall be placed in~~
3 ~~the Motorcycle Safety Education Fund, (b)~~ an amount to be determined
4 annually by the Legislature through the appropriations process may be
5 transferred to the Motor Fuel Tax Enforcement and Collection Cash
6 Fund for use as provided in section 66-738 on a monthly or other less
7 frequent basis as determined by the appropriation language, ~~(e)~~ (b)
8 an amount to be determined annually by the Legislature through the
9 appropriations process shall be transferred to the License Plate Cash
10 Fund as certified by the Director of Motor Vehicles, and ~~(d)~~ (c) the
11 remaining money may be used for the purchase for retirement of the
12 bonds issued prior to January 1, 1988, in the open market.

13 (5) The State Treasurer shall monthly transfer, from the
14 proceeds of the sales and use taxes credited to the Highway Trust
15 Fund and any money remaining in the fund after the requirements of
16 subsections (2) through (4) of this section are satisfied, thirty
17 thousand dollars to the Grade Crossing Protection Fund.

18 (6) Except as provided in subsection (7) of this section,
19 the balance of the Highway Trust Fund shall be allocated fifty-three
20 and one-third percent, less the amount provided for in section
21 39-847.01, to the Department of Roads, twenty-three and one-third
22 percent, less the amount provided for in section 39-847.01, to the
23 various counties for road purposes, and twenty-three and one-third
24 percent to the various municipalities for street purposes. If bonds
25 are issued pursuant to subsection (2) of section 39-2223, the portion

1 allocated to the Department of Roads shall be credited monthly to the
2 Highway Restoration and Improvement Bond Fund, and if no bonds are
3 issued pursuant to such subsection, the portion allocated to the
4 department shall be credited monthly to the Highway Cash Fund. The
5 portions allocated to the counties and municipalities shall be
6 credited monthly to the Highway Allocation Fund and distributed
7 monthly as provided by law. Vehicles accorded prorated registration
8 pursuant to section 60-3,198 shall not be included in any formula
9 involving motor vehicle registrations used to determine the
10 allocation and distribution of state funds for highway purposes to
11 political subdivisions.

12 (7) If it is determined by December 20 of any year that a
13 county will receive from its allocation of state-collected highway
14 revenue and from any funds relinquished to it by municipalities
15 within its boundaries an amount in such year which is less than such
16 county received in state-collected highway revenue in calendar year
17 1969, based upon the 1976 tax rates for highway-user fuels and
18 registration fees, the Department of Roads shall notify the State
19 Treasurer that an amount equal to the sum necessary to provide such
20 county with funds equal to such county's 1969 highway allocation for
21 such year shall be transferred to such county from the Highway Trust
22 Fund. Such makeup funds shall be matched by the county as provided in
23 sections 39-2501 to 39-2510. The balance remaining in the fund after
24 such transfer shall then be reallocated as provided in subsection (6)
25 of this section.

1 (8) The State Treasurer shall disburse the money in the
2 Highway Trust Fund as directed by resolution of the commission. All
3 disbursements from the fund shall be made upon warrants drawn by the
4 Director of Administrative Services. Any money in the fund available
5 for investment shall be invested by the state investment officer
6 pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State
7 Funds Investment Act and the earnings, if any, credited to the fund.

8 Sec. 2. Section 60-4,115, Reissue Revised Statutes of
9 Nebraska, is amended to read:

10 60-4,115 (1) Fees for operators' licenses and state
11 identification cards shall be collected and distributed according to
12 the table in subsection (2) of this section, except for the ignition
13 interlock permit and associated fees as outlined in subsection (4) of
14 this section. County officials shall remit the county portion of the
15 fees collected to the county treasurer for placement in the county
16 general fund. All other fees collected shall be remitted to the State
17 Treasurer for credit to the appropriate fund. ~~The State Treasurer~~
18 ~~shall transfer an amount equal to three dollars and fifty cents times~~
19 ~~the number of original or renewal Class M licenses issued pursuant to~~
20 ~~section 60-4,127 during the previous year from the Department of~~
21 ~~Motor Vehicles Cash Fund to the Motorcycle Safety Education Fund.~~

22 (2) The fees provided in this subsection in the following
23 dollar amounts apply for operators' licenses and state identification

 16 state identification card, the department shall remit the county
 17 portion of the fees to the State Treasurer for credit to the
 18 Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund.

19 (4)(a) The fee for an ignition interlock permit shall be
 20 forty-five dollars. Five dollars of the fee shall be remitted to the
 21 State Treasurer for credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash
 22 Fund. Forty dollars of the fee shall be remitted to the State
 23 Treasurer for credit to the Probation Cash Fund.

1 (b) The fee for a duplicate or replacement ignition
2 interlock permit shall be ten dollars. Twenty-five cents of the fee
3 shall be remitted to the county treasurer for credit to the county
4 general fund. Five dollars of the fee shall be remitted to the State
5 Treasurer for credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund.
6 Four dollars and seventy-five cents of the fee shall be remitted to
7 the State Treasurer for credit to the Probation Cash Fund.

8 (c) The fee for adding, changing, or removing a class,
9 endorsement, or restriction on an ignition interlock permit shall be
10 five dollars. The fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for
11 credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund.

12 (5) This subsection applies beginning on the
13 implementation date designated by the director pursuant to section
14 60-462.02. The department and its agents may collect an identity
15 security surcharge to cover the cost of security and technology
16 practices used to protect the identity of applicants for and holders
17 of operators' licenses and state identification cards and to reduce
18 identity theft, fraud, and forgery and counterfeiting of such
19 licenses and cards to the maximum extent possible. The surcharge
20 shall be in addition to all other required fees for operators'
21 licenses and state identification cards. The amount of the surcharge
22 shall be determined by the department. The surcharge shall not exceed
23 eight dollars. The surcharge shall be remitted to the State Treasurer
24 for credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund.

25 Sec. 3. Section 60-4,127, Reissue Revised Statutes of

1 Nebraska, is amended to read:

2 60-4,127 (1) No person shall operate a motorcycle on the
3 alleys or highways of the State of Nebraska until such person has
4 obtained a Class M license. No such license shall be issued until the
5 applicant has (a) met the vision and physical requirements
6 established under section 60-4,118 for operation of a motor vehicle
7 and (b) successfully completed an examination, including the actual
8 operation of a motorcycle, prescribed by the director, except that
9 the required examination may be waived, including the actual
10 operation of a motorcycle, if the applicant presents proof of
11 successful completion of a motorcycle safety course under the
12 Motorcycle Safety Education Act within the immediately preceding
13 ~~forty-eight~~ twenty-four months.

14 ~~(2)(a) This subdivision applies until the implementation~~
15 ~~date designated by the director pursuant to section 60-462.02. Any~~
16 ~~applicant who qualifies for a Class M license shall be issued a~~
17 ~~license for such operation by the county treasurer as provided for~~
18 ~~the issuance of an operator's license. If the applicant is the holder~~
19 ~~of an operator's license, the county treasurer shall, upon receipt of~~
20 ~~the examiner's certificate, have endorsed on the license the~~

13 the highways of this state. Every motorcycle safety course shall be
14 conducted at a site with room for a driving course designed to allow
15 motorcycle riders to practice the knowledge and skills necessary for
16 safe motorcycle operation.

18 Nebraska, is amended to read:

19 60-2126 (1) A school, business, or organization
20 conducting a basic or advanced may apply to the department to provide
21 a motorcycle safety course for which reimbursement will be requested
22 or courses in this state. Prospective providers of such course or
23 courses shall submit an application for approval of such course or
24 courses to the director. a request for approval of such course along
25 with the names of all certified instructors who will be teaching such

1 ~~course.~~ The application shall include a list of instructors of the
2 course or courses. Such instructors shall be or shall become
3 motorcycle safety instructors certified by the department prior to

2 (3) A person who holds a valid, unexpired permit issued
3 by the department to be a motorcycle safety instructor before the

6 expiration date of such permit, whichever is earlier. At that time
7 the permit holder may apply for and become a certified motorcycle
8 safety instructor to teach a motorcycle safety class in this state as
