- 8 There are hereby appropriated, for FY2011-12 and
- 9 FY2012-13, the sums set forth in this act to each agency for each
- 10 program from the respective funds for the general operations of state
- 11 government, postsecondary education, capital construction, and state
- 12 <u>aid</u>, except as otherwise appropriated.
