1	Section 1. DEFINITION OF APPROPRIATION PERIOD.
2	For purposes of this act and any other legislative bill
3	passed by the One Hundred Second Legislature, First or Second
4	Session, which appropriates funds, FY2010-11 means the period July 1,
5	2010, through July 1, 2011; FY2011-12 means the period July 1, 2011,
6	through June 30, 2012; FY2012-13 means the period July 1, 2012,
7	through June 30, 2013; FY2013-14 means the period July 1, 2013,
8	through June 30, 2014; and FY2014-15 means the period July 1, 2014,
9	through June 30, 2015.
10	Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION LANGUAGE.
11	There are hereby appropriated, for FY2011-12 and
12	FY2012-13, the sums set forth in this act to each agency for each
13	program from the respective funds for the general operations of state
14	government, postsecondary education, and state aid, except as
15	otherwise appropriated.
16	Sec. 3. REAPPROPRIATION OF BALANCE, FY2011-12 to
17	FY2012-13.
18	In addition to the appropriations set forth in this act,
19	there are hereby reappropriated all unexpended appropriation balances
20	existing on June 30, 2012, for FY2012-13 to the respective agencies,
21	programs, and funds listed in this act, except as otherwise provided
22	in this act.
23	Sec. 4. CERTIFIED ENCUMBRANCES.
24	All certified encumbrance amounts on June 30, 2011, and
25	June 30, 2012, not otherwise reappropriated pursuant to section 3 of

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this act, are hereby reappropriated for FY2011-12 and FY2012-13, 2 respectively, which amounts shall be in addition to the amounts shown 3 in this act. Sec. 5. NEBRASKA ACCOUNTING SYSTEM MANUAL DEFINITIONS. 4 5 The definitions contained in the Nebraska Accounting 6 System Manual, and any amendments thereto, on file with the Clerk of 7 the Legislature are hereby adopted by the Legislature as the 8 definitions for this act, except as provided in sections 6, 118, and 9 259 of this act. Sec. 6. ARRA DEFINITION. 10 11 As used in this act, ARRA means the American Recovery and 12 Reinvestment Act of 2009, Public Law 111-5. 13 Sec. 7. DRAWING AND PAYING WARRANTS. 14 The Director of Administrative Services shall draw 15 warrants upon the proper fund in the state treasury for an amount not to exceed the appropriations set forth in this act upon presentation 16 17 of proper documentation. The State Treasurer shall pay the warrants out of the appropriate funds. 18 19 Sec. 8. Transfers shall be made in twelve equal monthly amounts; and 15 (q) From the Corporation Cash Fund to the Election 16 17 Administration Fund: \$34,954 on or before July 5, 2012. 18 Sec. 257. REAPPROPRIATION OF STATE AGENCY BYRNE GRANTS. 19 The unexpended General Fund, Cash Fund, and Federal Fund 20 appropriation balances existing on both June 30, 2011, and June 30, 2012, are hereby reappropriated for the following agencies and 21 22 programs: 23 (1) Agency 11 - Program No. 575; (2) Agency 64 - Program No. 575; and 24 25 (3) Agency 78 - Program No. 575.

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1	Sec. 258. GIFTS, BEQUESTS, AND DEVISES.
2	Any gift, bequest, or devise made available to the State
3	of Nebraska for any purpose or purposes, together with the income
4	thereof, shall be allocated to the expending agency designated by the
5	donor or, if none is designated by the donor, by the Governor.
б	Acceptance of a gift, bequest, or devise shall be subject to approval
7	by the expending agency and the following restrictions:
8	(1) No matching of state funds shall be required as a
9	condition of acceptance;
10	(2) Any gift or bequest of personal property in excess of
11	\$10,000 shall be approved by the Governor before acceptance; and
12	(3) Any gift or devise of real property in excess of
13	\$10,000 shall be approved by the Governor and the Legislature before
14	acceptance.
15	For purposes of this section, gifts, bequests, and
16	devises shall include, but not be limited to, donations, gifts,
17	bequests, devises, and grants from individuals, organizations,

20	At the discretion of the budget administrator of the
21	budget division of the Department of Administrative Services and the
22	Accounting Administrator of the Department of Administrative
23	Services, expenditures of funds from any gift, bequest, or devise may

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case the actual amount of the gift, bequest, or devise is hereby 1 2 appropriated to the expending agency, for the purpose or purposes 3 designated by the donor, in addition to the amounts appropriated in this act. If no such Cash Fund account, Revolving Fund account, or 4 5 Trust Fund account exists, the Accounting Administrator may create 6 such fund account as is necessary to properly and separately account 7 for the gift, bequest, or devise, in which case the actual amount of 8 the gift, bequest, or devise is hereby appropriated to the expending 9 agency, for the purpose or purposes designated by the donor, in addition to the amounts appropriated in this act. 10

11 This section shall not apply to the University of 12 Nebraska.

13 Sec. 259. LIMITATION ON SALARIES, WAGES, AND PER DIEMS.

14 (1) For purposes of this act, (a) SALARY LIMIT shall mean 15 total expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems 16 and (b) total expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and 17 per diems shall mean all remuneration paid to employees treated as taxable compensation by the Internal Revenue Service or subject to 18 social security coverage, specifically including payments accounted 19 20 for as vacation, holidays, sick leave, military leave, funeral leave, maternity leave, administrative leave, compensatory time, deferred 21 compensation, or any other similar form, and amounts withheld 22 23 pursuant to law, but excluding state contributions for social security, retirement, and employee insurance plans. 24

25 (2) Total expenditures for permanent and temporary

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salaries and per diems shall be limited to the amount shown except 1 2 when federal funds in excess of the amount shown are available and 3 approved by the Governor. Expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems from such grants shall be in addition to the 4 5 limitation on permanent and temporary salaries and per diems otherwise shown in this act. No agency shall request any state funds 6 7 for continuation or replacement of any such personnel or activities 8 in future budget requests. To the extent feasible, requests for 9 increases in the limitation on permanent and temporary salaries and per diems shall be addressed to the Appropriations Committee when the 10 11 Legislature is in session.

12 (3) Expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries 13 resulting from awards made to employees under sections 81-1346 to 14 81-1354 shall be in addition to the limitations on permanent and 15 temporary salaries and per diems otherwise shown in this act.

16 (4) The limitation on expenditures for permanent and 17 temporary salaries and per diems for FY2012-13 as enumerated in this 18 act shall be the basis for continuation funding for each fiscal year 19 of the succeeding biennium.

(5) The limitation on expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems for FY2011-12 shall be increased by certified encumbrance amounts from FY2010-11 for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems. The limitation on expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems for FY2012-13 shall be increased by certified encumbrance amounts from FY2011-12 for

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permanent and temporary salaries and per diems. Encumbered amounts
 shall be calculated in accordance with section 81-138.01.

3 (6) The limitation on expenditures for permanent and 4 temporary salaries and per diems shall only apply to remuneration 5 paid to state employees or per diem payments made to members of state 6 boards or commissions.

7 Sec. 260. The One Hundred Second Legislature acknowledges 8 that Article III, section 22, of the Constitution of Nebraska 9 provides that each Legislature shall make appropriations for the 10 expenses of the government. Consistent with this provision, any 11 appropriations enacted by prior Legislatures for fiscal years 12 beginning after June 30, 2011, are null and void unless specifically 13 reaffirmed by this Legislature.

14Sec. 261. This act becomes operative on July 1, 2011.15Sec. 262. Since an emergency exists, this act takes16effect when passed and approved according to law.

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
